The purpose of the Executive Session, was authorized by IC § 5-14-1.5-6.1 (b)(6) (A), to receive information about an individual's alleged misconduct.




## **BLOOMINGTON BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY**

The Bloomington Board of Public Safety held a Special Meeting on **Monday, October 22, 2018, at 7:30 p.m.**, in the City of Bloomington Legal Library located at 401 N. Morton Street, Bloomington, Indiana.

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Vice Chairperson Kimberly Gray called the Special meeting to order at 7:43 PM.

### **ROLL CALL**

Gray asked for a "Roll Call" of Board Members. Martin McCrory, Maqubé Reese, and Luis Fuentes-Rohwer were present for the special meeting. Others in attendance are listed on the attached sign-in sheet.

### **RICHARD GARVIN CRIMINAL CHARGES & DISCIPLINE**

Gray explained the reason for this meeting was to deal with the Monroe County Prosecutor's recent dismissal of criminal charges against Richard Garvin. As a result the Board must decide what to do with Mr. Garvin regarding his pay status and possible discipline.

Gray asked for a motion. Reese made a motion to have a discussion about Mr. Garvin's status. The Board went over a few points. After a discussion, McCrory moved to remove Garvin from leave without pay and reinstate him with pay. Gray asked for a second. Fuentes-Rohwer seconded the motion. The Board engaged in an extensive discussion regarding Garvin's pay status and the Board's October 2017 decision to place Mr. Garvin on administrative leave without pay. Fuentes-Rohwer pointed out that it is unknown why the charges were dropped, and that this made it difficult for the Board to make a decision regarding his reinstatement. After discussion and clarification of the motion, McCrory withdrew his original motion. Following additional discussion, Reese moved to place Richard Garvin on administrative leave with pay effective October 17, 2018. Fuentes-Rohwer seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously. Gray then stated that the Board would tackle the "retroactive pay" and possible discipline issue at a future public board meeting.

### **ADJOURNMENT**




Fuentes-Rohwer made a motion to adjourn the meeting. It was approved unanimously.

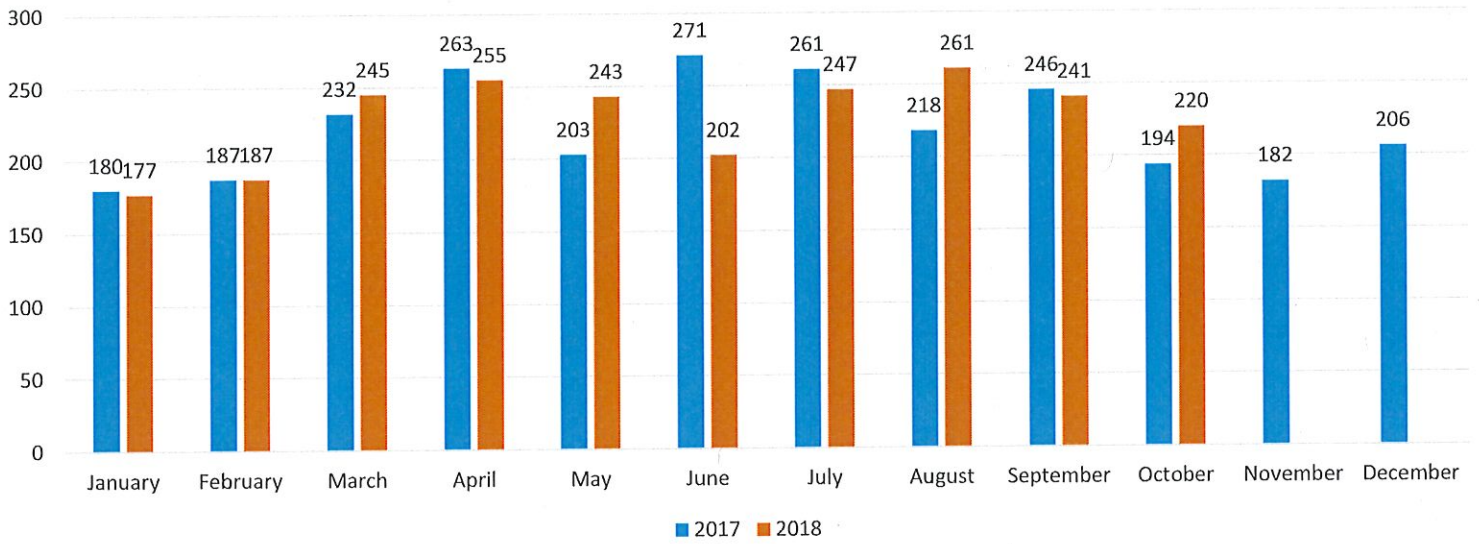

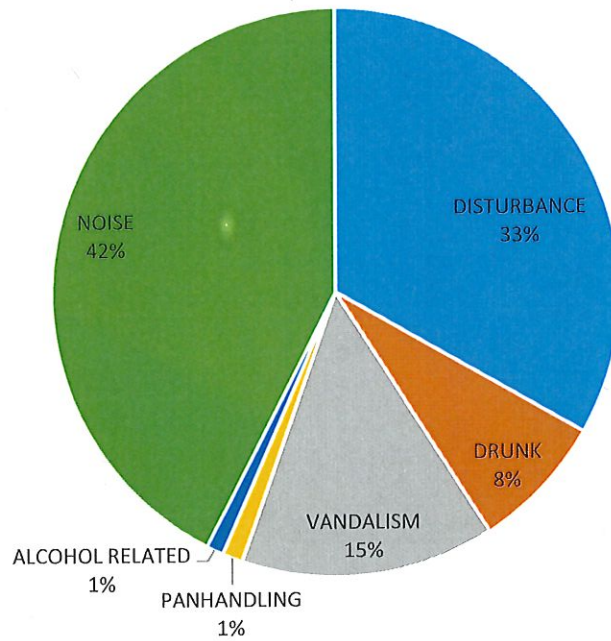

### 2017-2018 Adult Arrests

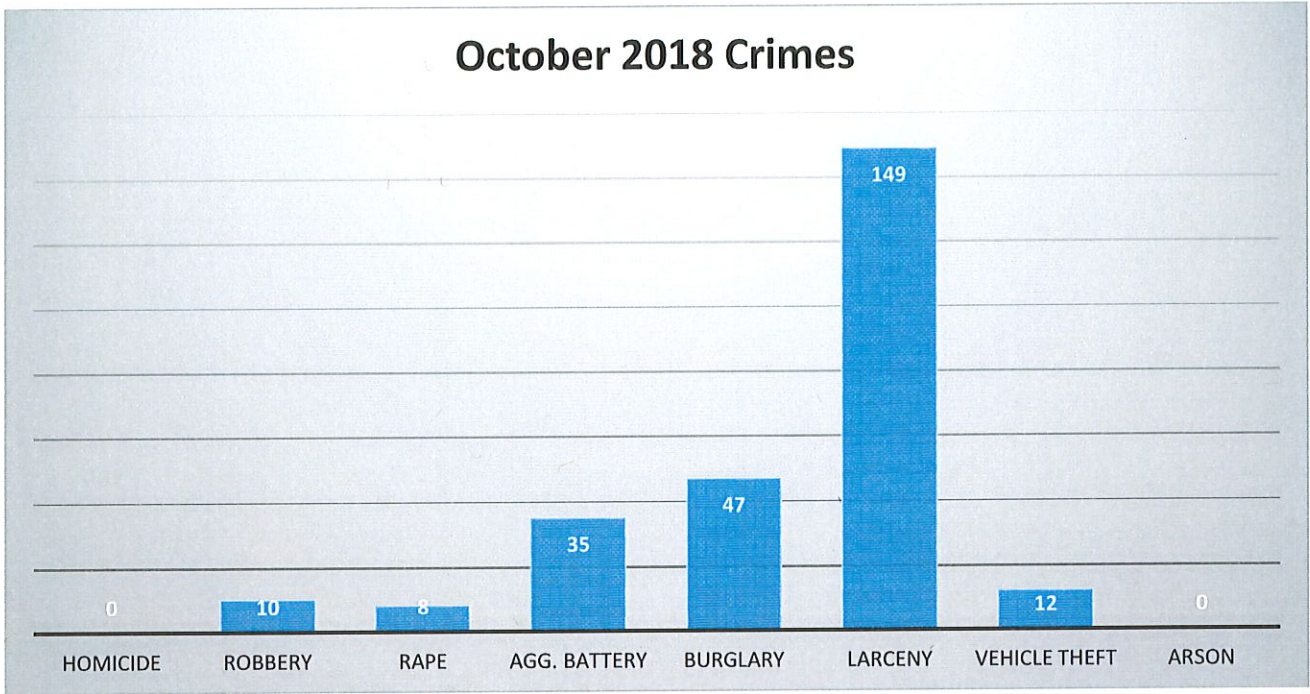


### October 2018 Nuisance Calls for Service

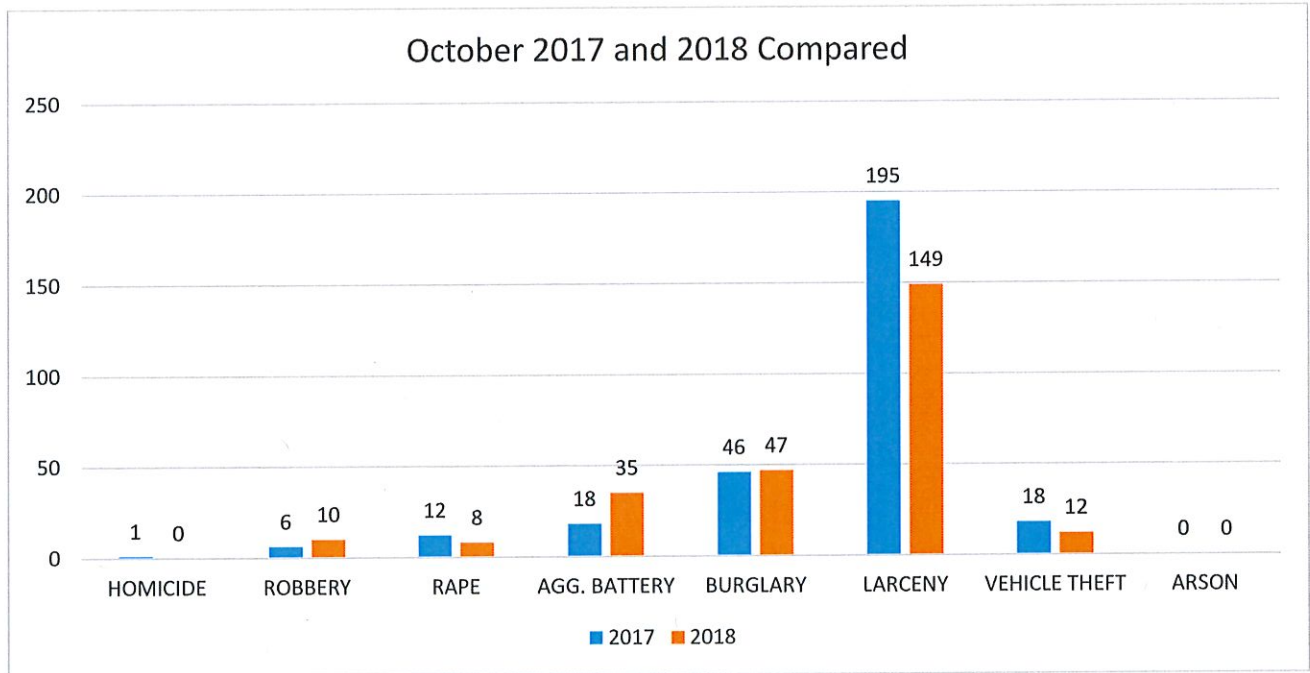




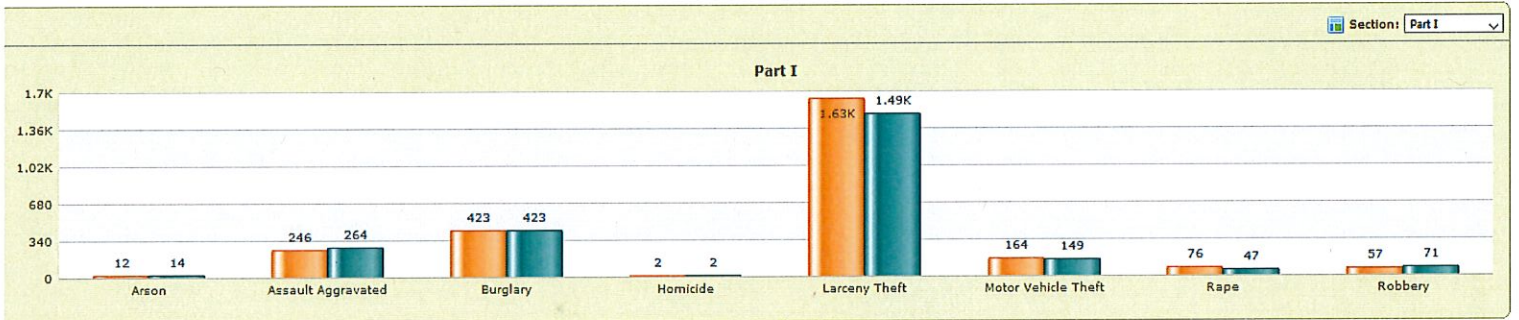

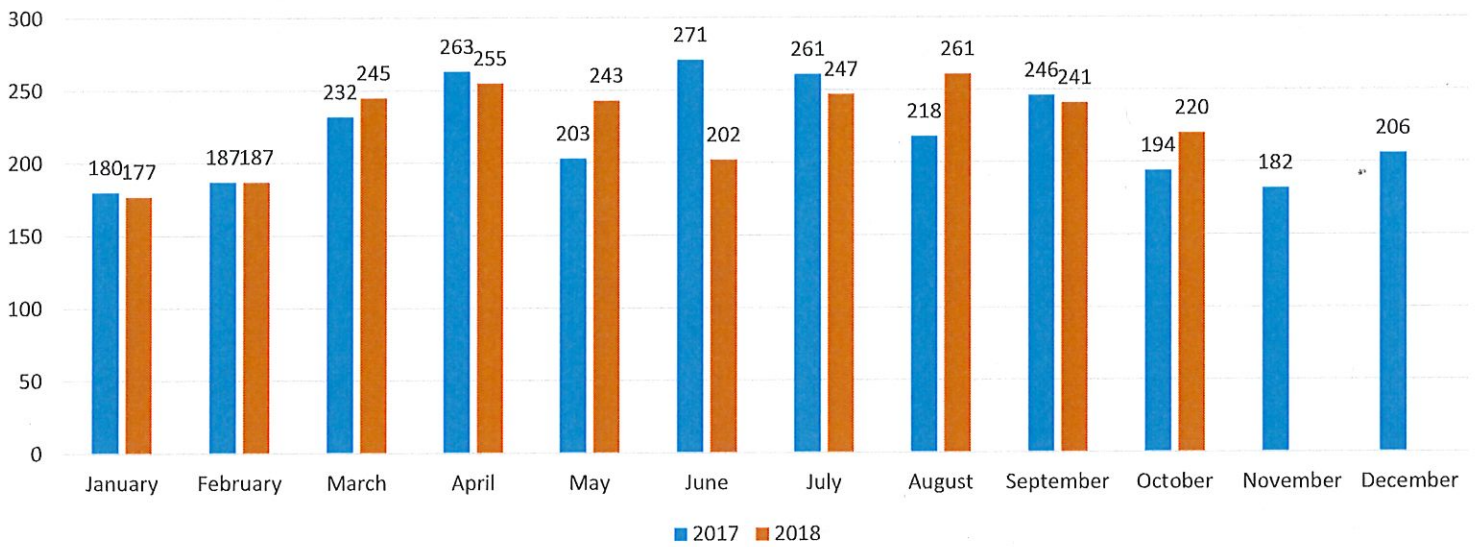
# October 2017 and 2018 Compared



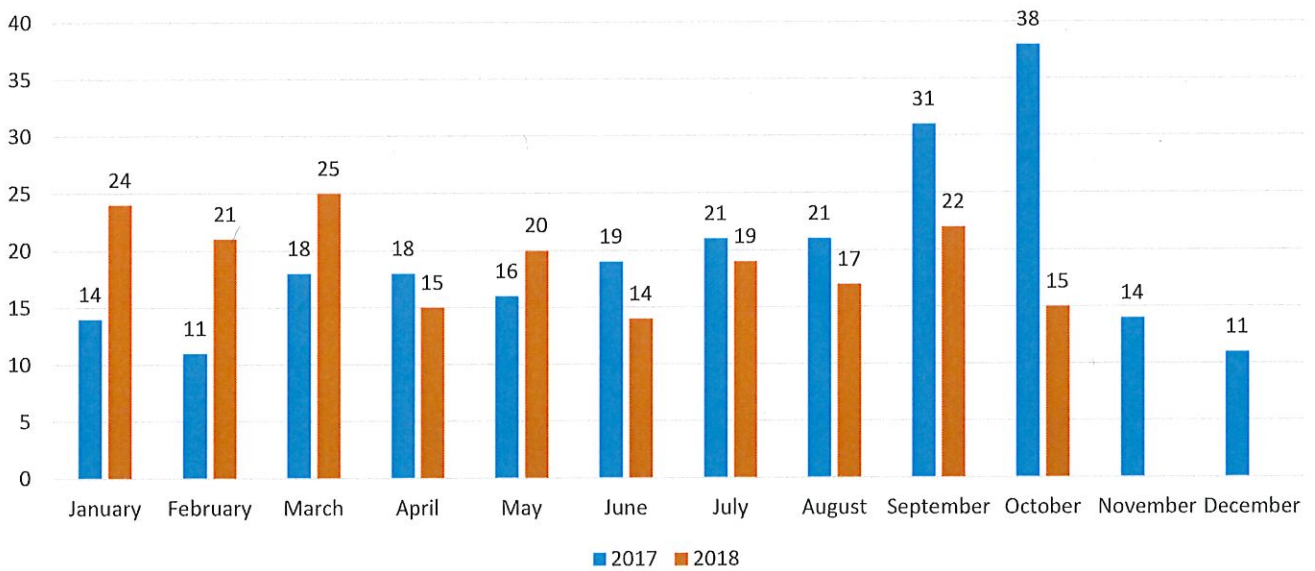
Period 1: 01-Jan-2017 - 31-Oct-2017 Period 2: 01-Jan-2018 - 31-Oct-2018



### 2017-2018 Adult Arrests

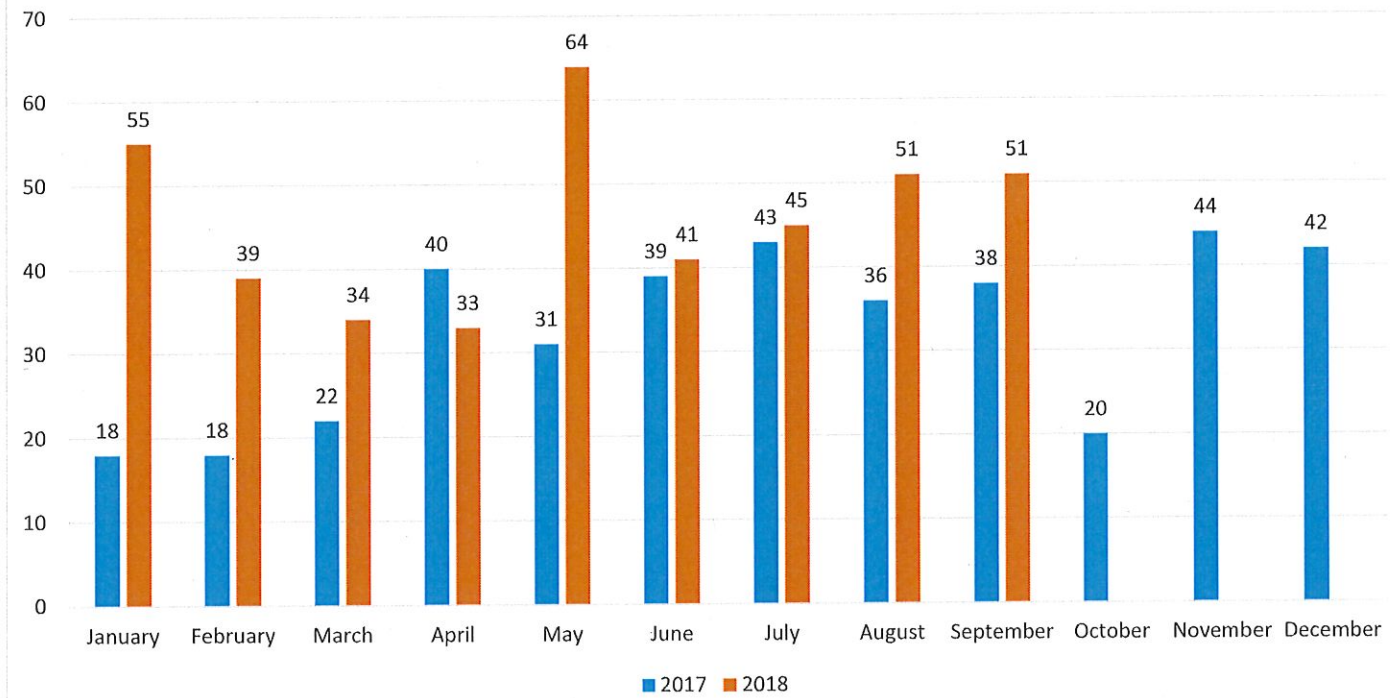


### 2017-2018 Juvenile Referrals

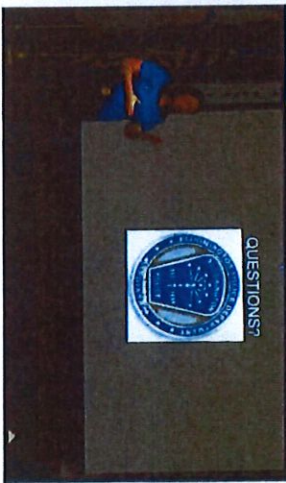

Last night my daughter left a bar in Bloomington with friends and went missing for several hours in the middle of the night. I had several calls from her crying for help, but the phone cut out. It was every parent's nightmare, and all of the worst case scenarios went through my head.

And to make matters worse, I live 1000 miles away in Florida.

I reached out to your police department for help, and that's exactly what I got.

Officer Owen and others helped track her down with very limited information to go on. Officer Owen stayed in constant contact with me over the course of two hours. I felt as if it was the most important thing in the world to him - to help find my child. He managed to enlist the help of others and they did find her. I'm so grateful.

When they located her, they called me by phone to let me know the good news. At that point, another officer yelled from the background, "You're a good mom!" Those were very comforting words to hear during a terrible time. I will never forget that, so to whomever said it, just know that you made a big difference in someone's life when they needed it most.

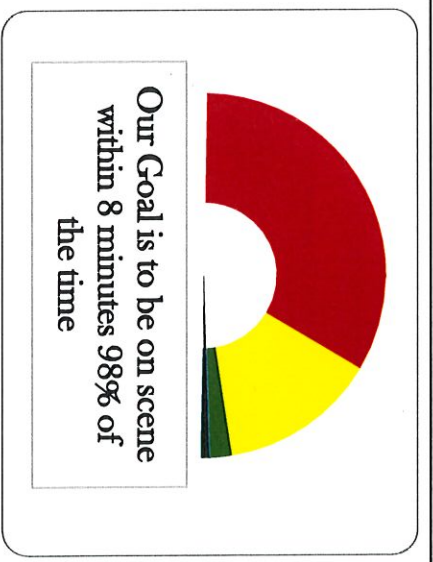


YTD Response Times Incidents within COB Limits



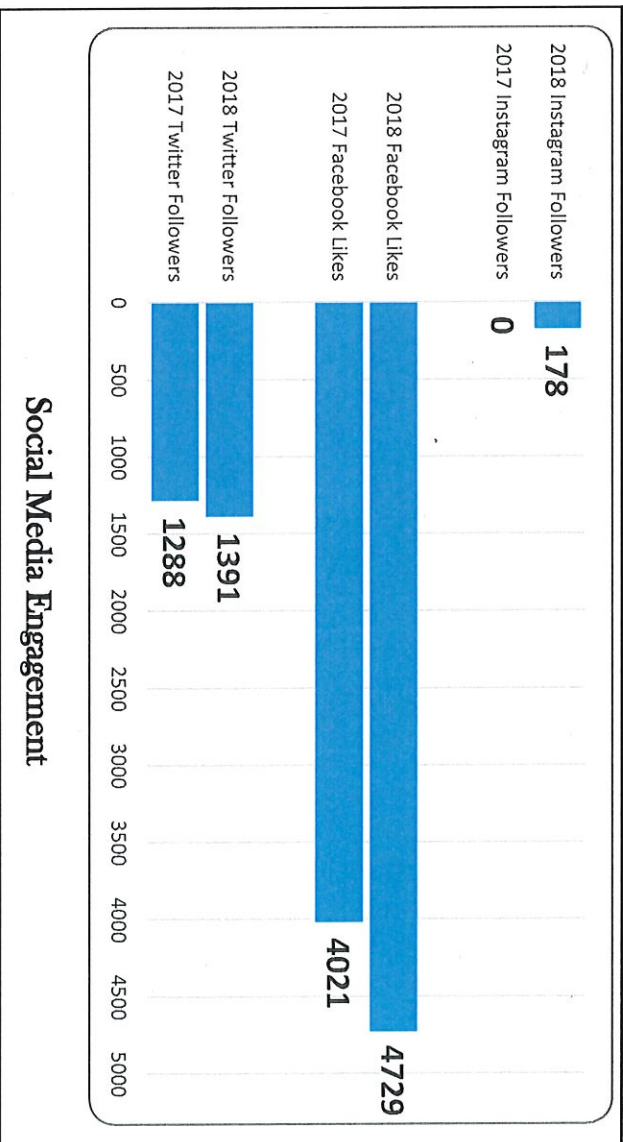
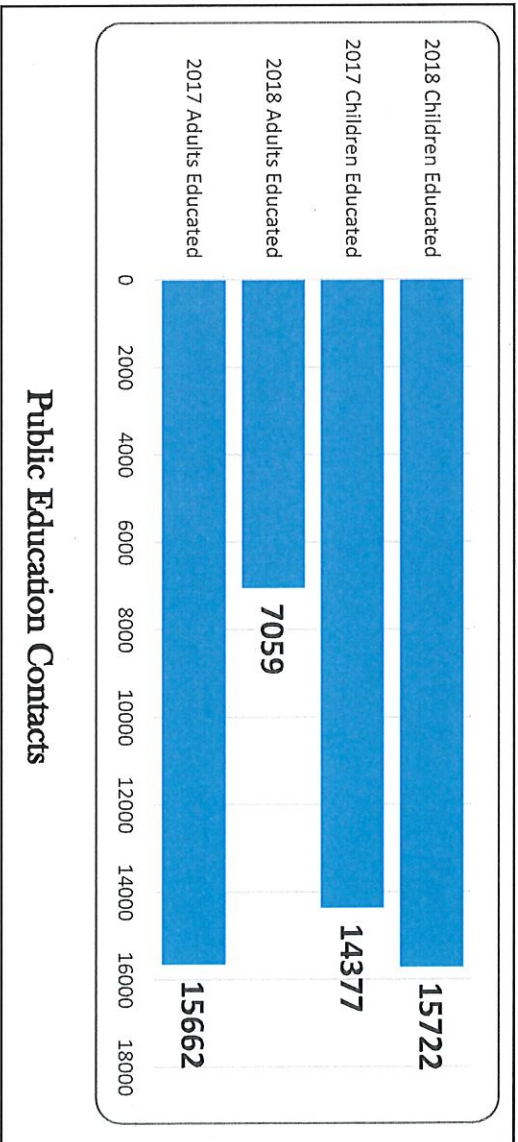
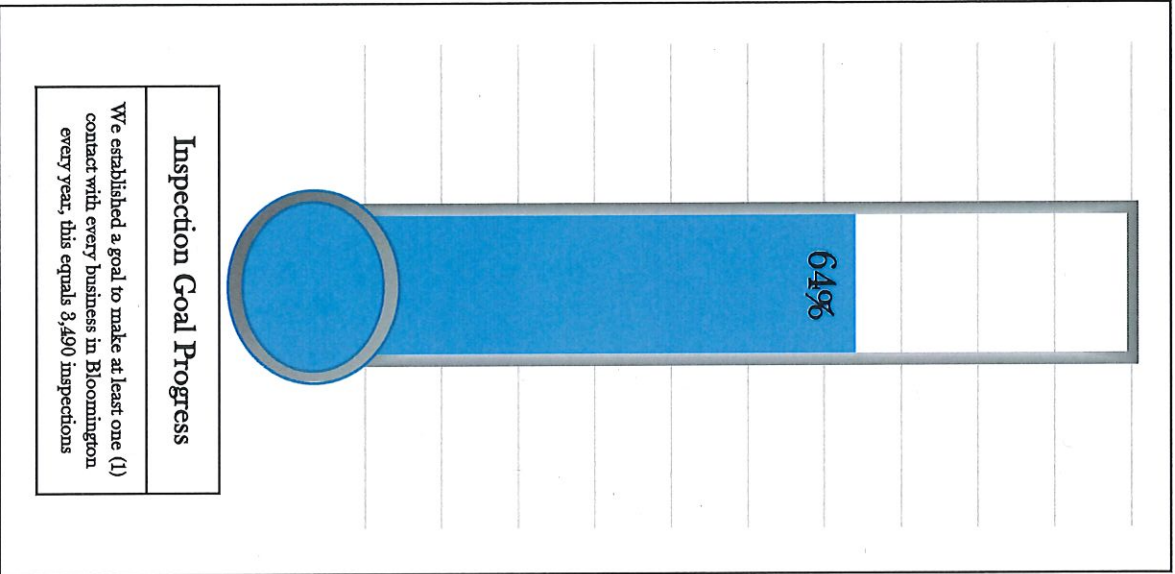
