- Committee met in May
- Alain is working with Jeff Cannon (songwriter) to record it at JSoM
- Jeff is working with musicians for choral and orchestral versions
- Will march with a group in the Fourth of July parade with a church choir
- Working with Steve Krahnke to make a documentary on making of the song
- Working with MCCSC to put on performances with high schools, contacted all 35 music teachers in town
- Alain is concerned that once Jeff finishes his work on this, enthusiasm will die down
 - Suggested hiring an intern for this project
 - Encourage more events/projects so people see it not just as a song but as a fluid piece of art
- Sean: It's complicated to pay artists in increments, it's abstract, hard to show deliverables
 - \circ $\,$ Working with a CDFI to get zero-interest loans for artists so they can get paid on time
- Payment for this project comes from the City's Bicentennial fund
