CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Les Coyne at 4:03 p.m.

<u>Les Coyne addressed the audience</u> Today's meeting will be ran differently, as it is anticipated there are individuals who would like to make comments regarding the Farmers' Marker. Joseph Hoffmann made a motion to approve the consent calendar. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. Motion unanimously carried.

B. OTHER BUSINESS

B-1. Review/Approval of Partnership Agreement with Summer Star Foundation & Parks Partner Award

Elizabeth Tompkins, Natural Resources Coordinator approached the podium. There is an apparent need to provide wholesome and constructive educational and recreation activities to children in the Bloomington community, that will effectively contribute to the mental, physical, social and education enrichment of children. This Agreement outlines a partnership which will combine resources from each party, to provide environmental educational programming at Leonard Springs and Griffy Lake to fourth graders, in the Monroe County Public Schools. The goal of this program is to provide outdoor education experiences that connect children to nature in ways that increase their knowledge, interest and respect for the environment and natural spaces. Staff recommends the approval of this Partnership with Summer STAR Foundation.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the agreement with Summer Star Foundation. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

Parks Partner Award - Summer Star Foundation

<u>Sarah Owen Community Relations Coordinator approached the podium.</u> The Bloomington Parks and Recreation Department would like to recognize the Summer Star Foundation for Nature, Art, and Humanity, Inc. as the recipient of the Parks Partner Award. The Parks Partner Award is a component of the Department's sponsorship program and recognizes our most outstanding collaborators and supporters.

The Summer Star Foundation funds supplies cost, staff costs and transportation cost, for the Griffy Lake Nature Days, and Banneker Summer Nature Days. Over the course of 10 years in supporting our department, the Summer Star Foundation has donated more than \$80,000. This has resulting in over 13, 00 local children getting outside and connecting with and learning about our natural areas. We are so grateful to the Summer Star Foundations support and are proud to present them with the Parks Partner Award. Sarah Owen invited Shalin Liu, President of Summer Star Foundation to the podium.

<u>Shalin Liu approached the podium</u>. I graduated from Indiana University in 1978, I then moved to Boston for over forty years. Bloomington is like my second home, I am back. I feel my heart is here. I feel Bloomington is my mentor, my mother.

<u>The Board</u> thanked Shalin Liu and Summer Star Foundation for the years of support given to the Department.

B-2 Review/Approval of Contract with Bruce Wilds Security for B-Town Boom Fireworks

<u>Becky Higgins, Recreation Division Director approached the podium</u>. The Department wishes to hold a fireworks display for the 4th of July holiday. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant in order to perform security services at the B-Town Boom on July 3rd. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with Bruce Wilds Security in an amount not to exceed \$4,012. This contract will be funded by Community Events Non-Reverting budget.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with Bruce Wilds Security. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-3 Information – BUEA Funded Mural at Building Trades Park

<u>Sean Starowitz, Economic and Sustainable Development approached the podium</u>. Sam Bartlett will be extending his mural at Building and Trades Park. The expansion will be around the Basketball Court, and the knee walls facing 2nd Street. The mural will included additional hospital and healthcare service icons. This is in partnership with Bloomington Urban Enterprise Association and Bloomington Entertainment and Arts District.

The Board thanked Sean Starowitz for the information provided and his time.

B-4 Review/Approval of Funding Agreement for Buskirk Chumley Theater Carpet Replacement

Joanna Sparks, City Landscaper approached the podium. The carpet at Buskirk Chumley Theater was replaced by Moriarty Floor Covering, Inc. for a total cost of \$21,035.94. Bloomington Parks and Recreation contributed \$18,200, paid from 2019 Capital funds. The remaining amount of \$2,835.94, was contributed by Buskirk Chumley Theater Management. This agreement serves as documentation, that Moriarty Floor Covering, Inc.'s invoice has been paid in full by the respective parties.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the agreement with Buskirk Chumley Theater. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-5 Review/Approval of Contract with STR for Buskirk Chumley Theater Exterior Water Infiltration Assessment

<u>Joanna Sparks</u>, <u>City Landscaper approached the podium</u>. The Department owns the building at 114 E. Kirkwood, which has recently experienced water infiltration into the basement. The Department wishes to have an assessment of the existing building envelope completed. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant to perform

a comprehensive assessment of the building, provide a solution, along with associated budgets to address the deficiencies discovered as part of the assessment. Staff recommends approval of this contract with STR Building Resources, in the amount of \$1,000.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with STR. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried

B-6 Review/Approval of Partnership Agreement with Let's Go Sports

Erik Pearson, Program/Facility Coordinator approached the podium. The Department wishes to offer preschool sports programs and summer sports camps that are necessary for the positive development and well-being of the community. By combining resources, the Partnership will result in increasing the quality of preschool sports programs offered to the community. Allowing more Bloomington families to participate in programs that focus on introducing sports to children in an instruction based, fun environment. Staff recommends the approval of this Partnership with Let's Go Sports.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the agreement with Let's Go Sports. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-7 Review/Approval of Contract with Jackson Group

Julie Ramey, Community Relations Manager approached the podium. The Department wishes to provide to the community a program catalog three times per year. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant to print, bind, prepare for mailing, and/or deliver 38,000 seasonal program guides Fall/Winter 2019, Winter Spring 2020, Summer 2020, and Fall/Winter 2020. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with Jackson Group in the amount of \$87,000. Funds will be paid from Community Relations General Fund.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with Jackson Group. *Lisa Thatcher* seconded the motion. *Les Coyne* any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-8 Review/Approval of Contract with RLR

Julie Ramey, Community Relations Manager approached the podium. The Department wishes to re-brand its trail system and develop a trail logo. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant to create and present design concepts for selection. Refine one selected logo and prepare artwork suitable for output. Final logo artwork will be provided in four digital formats. Provide a simple Usage Guideline for logo or wordmark to illustrate recommended applications. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with RLR in the amount \$19, 4000. Funds will be paid from Community Relations General Fund.

<u>The Board inquired.</u> Does this also include weigh finding materials? At this point, this contract would not include future developments, example the 7th Street east, west bike path. Make sure what they do now for existing trails, would be in a manner that the branding would be compatible for future developments.

<u>Julie Ramey responded.</u> Correct. The possibility exists and the scope of work includes that sort of thing. The branding package they come up with will incorporate future potential uses.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with RLR. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-9 Review/Approval of Contract with Ecologic

<u>Joanna Sparks, City Landscaper approached the podium</u>. The Department would like to create more usable open space at White Oak Cemetery. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant to remove invasive plant vegetation, with the primary focus being the possible future Scatter Garden area and secondary focus being the eastern property boundary area. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with Eco Logic, LLC in the amount of \$5,000.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with Ecologic. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-10 Review/Approval of Median Partnership Agreement with Comfort Keepers

Joanna Sparks approached the podium. This agreement between the Department and Comfort Keepers, is to provide a means of improving, beautifying, and maintaining the medium located on Clarizz Boulevard. Comfort Keepers are solely responsible for all materials and labor necessary for the improvement and maintenance of this median. The City reserves the right to provide and place no more than two signs in the median, indicating that the median has been adopted by Comfort Keepers. Staff recommends the approval of this agreement with Comfort Keepers, for five year.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the agreement with Comfort Keepers. *Lisa Thatcher* seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-11 Review/Approval of Partnership Agreement with Mad for My Dog

<u>Bill Reams, Community Events Coordinator approached the podium</u>. The Department wishes to provide a summer dog event to the Bloomington community. By combining available resources from each partner, this Agreement will provide an opportunity for the community to participate in an affordable summer event that is designed to create social, safe and fun opportunities for dogs and their owners. The event is to be held at Mills Pool, on August $7^{th} - 8^{th}$, from 5:00 pm. - 8:00 pm. Staff recommends the approval of this Partnership Agreement with Mad for My Dog.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the agreement with Mad for My Dog. *Lisa Thatcher* seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-12 Review/Approval of 2019 Price Schedule.

<u>Hsiung Marler, Switchyard Park General Manager approached the podium</u>. The price schedule was based upon internal, local, and regional comparison of other facilities. The goal was to make the facilities accessible and affordable to the community. Staff recommends the following 2019 Switchyard Park Price Schedule;

 - Category II (for-profit groups) with lighting \$750 per day/\$375 deposit
- ➤ Secondary Performance Lawn Rental \$75 to \$90 per day
- Large Picnic Shelter Rental \$75.00 to \$90 per day
- ➤ Garden Rental \$37 to \$44

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the 2019 Switchyard Park Price Schedule. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-13 Review/Approval of Contract with HFI

John Turnbull, Sport Division Director approached the podium. Due to age, the Department wishes to replace the HVAC system at Twin Lakes Recreation Center. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant for demolition and replacement of the Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning. Detailed mechanical specification are provided by Schmidt Associates, dated 04.17.19:2018-092.TLR. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with Harrell-Fish Inc., in the amount of \$493,493. This project is funded from General Obligation Bond 977-18-18016E-5410.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with HFI. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-14 Review/Approval of Contract with Lentz Paving, LLC

John Turnbull, Sports Division Director approached the podium. The Winslow Batting Cages are no longer in use, and the Department wishes to have them removed. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant for demolition

of the Winslow Batting Cages, haul off all materials including any fencing, nets, wood, concrete, and deliver soil to grade. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with Lentz paving LLC in the amount of \$12,000. This project will be funded from Reversions Funds 2019: Facilities Public Work, 101-19-190000-53990.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with Lentz Paving, LLC. *Lisa Thatcher* seconded the motion. *Les Coyne* any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-15 Review/Approval of Partnership Agreement with Middle Way House

<u>Lee Huss, Urban Forester approached the podium.</u> The purpose of this agreement, is for the City to allow Middle Way House limited use of 50 city trees to cover with knitted yarn sweaters. Staff recommends approval of this partnership. Lee Huss invited Erin Hollinden of Middle Way House to the podium.

Erin Hollinden, Events Coordinator approached the podium. I wanted to point out a few of the many benefits to our community of having our wrapped in love tree sweater public art project. The only other city we are aware of that has a more extensive display then we have is Seattle, Washington. Wrapped in love helps support all sorts of programs for survivors of domestic violence, sexual abuse and human trafficking. A lot of people know about our emergency shelter, but may not realize there is an additional 95% of our clientele, thousands of people every year who are using our legal advocacy, our support groups, our childcare, and our on scene crisis intervention services. A vast array of programs, and the beauty of the wrapped in love is the originality, its creativity. It helps those knitters, crocheters, and weavers who might not have other ways to support us a way come together. It's a very distinctive way that sets our City apart. I hope that any knitters, crocheters, or weavers in our imminent audience would like to join us and speak to me about it.

<u>Lee Huss approached the podium.</u> I do know of one other community, Toronto, Ontario has done this with their Urban Forestry. I have talked to their City Forester and they found if they did knitting of the smaller trees in areas with high vandalism, the vandalism dropped down to none. If I can work with Erin to maybe wrap some of our smaller trees in our downtown area.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the agreement with Middle Way House. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

The Board thanked Erin Hollinden.

B-16 Review/Approval of Contract with Ellington Tree

<u>Lee Huss, Urban Forester approached the podium.</u> The Department wishes to remove hazardous trees. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant, to preform tree removal of seven dead Ash trees at Cascades Golf Course. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with J.R. Ellington Tree Expert, in the amount of \$1,300. Project will be funded from Urban Forestry General Fund.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with Ellington Tree. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-17 Review/Approval of Contract Designscape

<u>Lee Huss, Urban Forester approached the podium.</u> The Department wishes to fertilize, and treat trees for insects. The Department requires the services of a professional consultant to provide insecticide spraying of bag worms on columnar oaks west of the Hyatt Place of the B-Line Trail, spray additional infested trees in the Bloomington City limits, and perform tree fertilization treatment at various public locations. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with Designscape Horticultural Service, Inc., in the amount of \$2,650. This projected if funded from the Urban Forestry General Fund.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contract with Designscape. Lisa Thatcher seconded the motion. Les Coyne any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

B-18 Review/Approval of Contract with Lee Chapman for Farm Tour

<u>Marcia Veldman, Farmers' Market Coordinator approached the podium</u>. The Department wishes to provide the community with a summer Farm Tour at Living Roots Farm and Sustainable Living Center. The Department requires

the services of a professional consultant to provide a grill and grilling supplies for the Farm Tour Chefs, to be held on July 14th. Staff recommends the approval of this contract with Lee Chapman, in the amount of \$550. Funding for this project will be from Farmers' Market Non-Reverting fund.

Joseph Hoffman motioned to approve the contact with Lee Chapman. *Lisa Thatcher* seconded the motion. *Les Coyne* any public comments or questions, seeing none. The motion was unanimously carried.

C. PUBLIC HEARINGS/APPEARANCES

C-1. Bravo Award – Catherine Walsh

Sarah Owen, Community Relations Coordinator approached the podium. The Bloomington Parks and Recreation Department would like to recognize Adopt-a-Stream volunteer Catherine Walsh with the June Bravo Award. Catherine began volunteering with our Adopt-a-Stream program in September 2018 and has dedicated 53 hours of volunteer services to inspecting Griffy Creek and Latimer Woods Creek. Catherine has gone above and beyond what is expected of her and we would like to recognize her for the exceptional amount of time and effort she has dedicated to this program.

C-2. Staff Introduction/Recognition-

Ashley Spurgeon approached the podium. Ashley has recently accepted the position of Community Events Specialist. For the past two years Ashley has been employed by the Parks and Recreation Department at Richmond, Indiana. Previously Ashley held an intern position with Health and Wellness in our Recreation Division. Ashley has missed living in Bloomington, is grateful for the opportunity to continue working for the parks, and is excited for what is to come.

The Board welcomed Ashley.

<u>Steve Cotter, Natural Resource Manager approached the podium</u>. We are sad to report that Elizabeth Tompkins has submitted her letter of resignation. Elizabeth began as an intern in 2005, was hired by her predecessor as a Natural Resources education Assistant in 2006 and became the Natural Resources Coordinator in 2009. Elizabeth has been an exemplary employee, and has done a great job over the last 14 years. Elizabeth has maintained excellent relationships with co-workers, customers, program funders and park visitors. She is passionate about customer service. Elizabeth's departure will leave a big void within the Department and she will be missed. We wish her the best of luck in all her upcoming adventures.

<u>Elizabeth Tompkins approached the podium</u>. It was a dream come true when I earned this potion ten years ago. It has been an honor and pleasure to serve this award winning department for the last fourteen years. To work with the professional and experts of this department has been a joy.

The Board thanked Elizabeth for her years of service.

C-3. Public Comment Period –

<u>Les Coyne, President Board of Park Commissioners made the following statement</u>: Over the last several weeks members of this board have received and reviewed several comments and inquiries expressing deep concerns about the challenges currently facing our Farmers' Market vendors, customers, staff volunteers and leaders. Each of us on the Board has watched the Farmers' Market Advisory Committee meeting recording from Monday, June 17 and reviewed the correspondence the Department has received on the topic.

The Farmers' Market Advisory Council, Parks and Recreation Department staff and the Legal Department of the City of Bloomington are all actively working on addressing concerns in a way that is compassionate to those who feel unsafe and in compliance with all laws, the First Amendment of the United States Constitution and Market policies. The issues in play are difficult and challenge our understanding of who we are as a community. Parks Department staff is drawing on the expertise of the City Legal Department, the Community and Family Resources Department, the ACLU and Bloomington United, among other individuals, groups and organizations and will make recommendations based on their findings to this board.

At this time many individuals and groups at the City and in the community are exploring what options the Market leadership might legally pursue, looking at similar situations in other communities, how they were handled and their outcomes. That information will be closely considered as we look at the future of the Farmers' market.

However, if you came here today looking for a final determination on what actions, if any will be taken regarding the vendor in question, I'm afraid you will be disappointed. We can tell you that at this time the City of Bloomington cannot legally alter the relationship between this vendor and our Farmers' Market.

We appreciate the urgency felt by so many people touched by this conflict, and wish there were easy and quick answers and solutions. There are not. We know many people are in pain and feel uncomfortable dealing with these issues. This is a situation in which no community wishes to find itself.

We will take comment today and will continue to gather information from a variety of other sources. By our July 23 regular Board of Park Commissioners meeting we hope to have had an opportunity to review all the pertinent information and determine our path forward.

One thing is certain: so many in this community love the Bloomington Community Farmers' Market and are working to ensure that it is a safe and welcoming place for all. Thank you for being among those who care deeply enough about our community to get engaged in this challenge.

The Role of the Farmers' Market Advisory Council consists of nine volunteer members representing Market vendors and customers. The council acts in an advisor capacity to the Board of Park Commissioners and Park staff on policy matters relating to the Farmers' Market.

Recommendations from FMAC are presented to Park Staff who, after thoughtful consideration and research present this information to the Board of Park Commissioners for final approval. It is only after that approval that policy is set. One Park Commissioners acts as a liaison to the Farmers' Market Advisor Board bringing the information sharing full circle. Advice from the Council has played an instrumental role in guiding the Market for decades.

Four Market vendors and five Market customers volunteer their time to serve on the Farmers' Market Advisory Council. Members of the public are always welcome to attend Advisory Council meetings. Meetings are usually held at 5:30 p.m. on the third Monday of each month in the Parks Conference Room, Suite 250 of City Hall. It is advisable to check with market staff prior to each month's meeting in case there has been a change.

The next steps will be a Community Forum. We realize more discussion needs to happen on a broader scale. Overall, it is outside of Parks purview. The Board of Park Commissioners will be hosting a community forum at the Banneker Community Center led by Community and Family Resources Department. We are hoping that this forum in the next few weeks. Beverly Calender-Anderson is here this evening and if you have questions or are interested in having input about the forum, please see Beverly or contact her later by email.

Market staff is looking into ways to establish more diversity in Market and the FMAC.

We ask that you sign in before speaking. This is so we can contact you later if we want clarification. This meeting is conducted with official record that becomes archived. Because of the transactions we make, we have to have that formality and this will be part of that official record. Each person will have two to three minutes to speak. We will keep track of the time and announce when the time is up. We would like to remind everyone that we insist on a respectful comment period. The people who are making the comments are addressing the Board and are not addressing the audience. We do not expect comments from the audience.

<u>Lisa Thatcher, Park Board Member commented</u>. I was there on Monday and it was very satisfying to launch right into the Public Comment period. Thank you so much for waiting through this, we are a different board and had to get through these agenda items. I know that was probably frustrating to wait through, thank you for doing that.

<u>Thomas Westguard approached the podium</u>. I appreciate the opportunity to address the Board today. The comments I wanted to make today, where to note that the Market has been aware for at least two years that these complaints were going on.

As you consider your future actions. I wanted to make the point that having the knowledge two years ago, means that the clock started two years ago. I've heard some complaints that, gosh we just got slammed with this all the sudden. Well no, you knew two years ago that this was an issue. That was the time to start looking into the public relations components of it and coming up with a plan. Looking at legal components of it and figuring out what is allowed. That clock started two years ago, and the choice not to act, is in fact a choice that continues through today.

Since then, as you probably know, there is a quote from Marcia Veldman on the front page of the Herald Times saying "First amendment, nothing we can do". That was the whole statement. I don't know what due-diligence went into making that statement. That's what should have been done starting two years ago, was to know the legal landscape.

The vendors in questions posted on their website they had suffered a flood. I contacted the Health Department as well as the Market, to say the FDA has issued regulations regarding flooded fields. You have the right to make sure that this produce is healthy. There is no first amendment protection for public health and safety. There are concrete actions that you can take, that so far the Market has chosen not to do.

I'm encouraged that you have given the July date, as a time that you might take some action. I'm encouraged that you are having a listening component. In terms of management, intentions and a quarter will get you a gumball. It's not about intentions it's about taking concrete specific actions that lead to a goal. That's my only point.

<u>Nejla Routsong approached the podium</u>. I am also encouraged to hear that some action is planned to be taken. I would very much like to hear, and hope to hear very soon before July 23rd, on more specifics of what legal research is being done.

I wanted to add a local component to this, as someone who has been a local for a long time, and I all so work at IU now. I wanted to point out, that we sort of think about the people that are threatened by these kind of groups as minorities. We use that term, I've used that term. In fact, if you add up all the people that these groups would like to expel or exterminate, it's the majority of Americans. It's the majority of our community, and it's even more of a majority of the students who come to here to study at IU.

I would like whoever is making these decisions, even if you don't personal happen to be in one of those threated groups. To imagine what it would feel like if you weren't able to attend your local market without being forced by the City, the official City that is running your politics in your city, to look someone in the face who believes and has stated publicly who believes that you do not deserve to exist. Who is an official member of a group that believes you personally do not deserve to exist.

I feel like I have to comment about the free speech issue, because it has been raised by Marcia Veldman and Mayor Hamilton. Other people here today, including my friend Joe Varga who last week pointed out: that being an active member of a hate group is not a thought, it's not speech, and it's not mirrored speech. I would like to point out the qualitative difference between the ideologies these people have and any other ideological believes. The Mayor for example lumped in neo-Nazi groups with Communist and Civil Rights Protesters. I would like to point out that the ideological believes of hate groups involve violence, mass murder, and mass extermination. The beliefs of Communist, Anti-Fascist and Civil Rights Protesters they are all ideologies, but the way they want to achieve their aims of their ideologies are qualitatively different.

<u>Robert Meitus approached the podium</u>. I am a law professor, and a lawyer here in town. We may totally disagree with others views. We may even recognize that such views cause grieves pain to others. Without a broad first amendment protection, all civil rights advocacies could be shut down by a government. By those in power because of disagreements over viewpoints. That was true of the civil rights movement of the past, it was true in Skokie forty years ago, it was true in Charlottesville, and it is true in Bloomington today. Everyone, no matter what they think deserve a voice. If they don't incite violence, they can speak that voice freely. The public can decide who is right through reasonable discourse, debate, and their pocketbooks. Civility, compassion, and the first amendment should guide us here very carefully.

<u>Tim Clark approached the podium</u>. I am a resident of Brown County, and a co-administrator of Facebook group Brown County Matter. I support the position of the City of Bloomington Parks and Recreation Department, regarding the petition to remove a Farmers' Market vendor. In which they stated "To our knowledge this vendor has not shared these views with the market, has treated customers with respect. The City is constitutionally prohibited from discriminating against someone because their belief system, no matter how portent those views may be. The City may not intercede if an individual's actions violate the safety of human rights of others".

When allegations where posted about the same vendor regarding the Nashville Farmers Market. We removed the respected post from our Facebook site. Stating that Brown County Matters is not the site to go on record of disagreeing with someone in the community. That if true may have an opposing view regardless of how effective. In response to deleting these post, we were immediately accused of being Nazis. To quote "I really have to wonder if the goal was to defend their Nazi brother." The Nashville Farmers Market is not affiliated with the government, but is a non-profit 501c3.

It appears, that the recent controversy associated with the vendor in question was ignited by a conviction of Nolan Brewer. Brewer was convicted of a federal hate crime on Monday, May 20, 2019, and sentenced to three years in prison for spray painting anti-Semitic graffiti and lighting fires outside a Carmel Synagogue on Friday, July 28, 2018. Following the conviction the court records were made available. The statements and a transcript of an FBI interview with Brewer were taken out of context, which led to allegations perpetuated by the media. The FBI is responsible for accessing any threats to individuals in the community based on the key interview, and any subsequent investigations. The FBI most likely concluded, there is little to no physical threat to our communities. This assessment could be collaborated by the local police and sheriffs departments. In fact in Brown County, the concern by the sheriff's department is was on the potential threats to the safety of the vendors and of their families.

As you reinforce in the statement by the Parks Department, "Citizens have the right to hold beliefs and make statements that others may find frightening, disturbing, and objectionable". Illustration of these beliefs were on full display at the Farmers' Market Advisory Committee meeting on June 17, 2019. A video of these comments are available on Bloomintonian Website. The nature and tone of these comments, to include posts on social media, illustrate to the concern of our communities may not be so much from views expressed by individuals, but from the intolerance and bigotry that many of these views represent. To conclude, our challenge is to find better ways to address issues and concerns that will result in less divisive and more productive communities.

<u>Judy Klein approached the podium</u>. As a Jewish person, I am one of the threatened members presumably of people of this persuasion. However, I feel very strongly that constitutionally this right of free speech allows for anyone to make remarks about their beliefs, even though they may be odious to other people in the community.

Furthermore, I think that the Farmers' Market in the best of all possible worlds, can server as a place where the commune denominator of regard for local production of food, can build a bridge amongst people of very diverse opinions. I feel that as long as vendors are civil and respectful of customers, it is more dangerous to imagine a world in which we evict people whose beliefs we don't agree with, than to allow for a civil space where we can interact with each other.

Amanda McKenzie approached the podium. I am a mental health therapist, and a former farmer at the Market. I am coming to speak briefly about the effect this is having on people's mental health. I am really concerned about our marginalized citizens. I think a lot of people don't realize there are many invisible symptoms that are already happening, that are harming people. I have people coming to me from all demographics, not only in my professional world but in my personal world. Telling me how they are already being effected by nightmares, hypervigilance, feelings of paranoia, and feelings of being unsafe in their own skin. Not just community members who are going to the Market as patrons, but also the farmers themselves.

As a former farmer, I am very concerned that the community response to this. The understandable response of cliental not wanting to go to a place where they are literally feeling endangered, and for good reason. That is also going to effect the farmers who have done nothing wrong. So for everyone's protection, famers, patrons, everyone's mental and emotional health that are not necessarily visible to the naked eye. I would like the Park Board to take this very seriously, as it is already effecting hundreds if not thousands of people in our community.

<u>Juliana Crespu approached the podium.</u> I will say what I said a week ago. As a Brazilian immigrant I do feel very unsafe at Market. I do feel uncomfortable going. My concern is that our Farmers' Market will become a white persons market. I would like for you to consider that. If we don't have something in place to keep more Nazi vendors from signing up, then what's going to happen? What does that mean for those of us in our community, who are minorities, who are uncomfortable, and who do feel unsafe going to market? It will be a white persons market.

One more thing I would like to say, I think being passive in the face of possible violence at market, whether that is through language or physical violence. I think that is a very dangerous space, and I think that we are inviting that if we choose not to take action. We are inviting some sort of violence. I think that will come into play at some point, because a lot of tempers are inflamed right now.

<u>Renee Miller approached the podium</u>. I just moved to the city from the county. Racism isn't new to me. I've been in Monroe County for twenty five plus years, actually much longer than that. I've lived with racist people all around me. There is a huge difference between racism and white supremacies. We need to really take a look at our values in the city.

I was absolutely floored to find out that this happened two years ago and nothing was done. Some guidelines weren't written, about if you were affiliated with white supremacist groups or hate groups, you are not allowed at our Farmers' Market. I am not trying to change a racist mind, I'm just say politely step out. As politely as I can, step off my property please, that's not allowed here. Or I just say, I'm not engaging with you, we don't have the same values. But white supremacies groups, hate groups are dangerous.

I went up to that man at the Farmers' Market, and I asked him because this was news to me, I hear this is going on with you and all I want to know is if it is true. If it is, I am going to move along, and I am going to get my vegetables elsewhere. If you are affiliated with white supremacist and hate groups, I don't want to buy your vegetables. You know what he said to me, you should move along then, and I did. Do you know what he did right after that? He took my picture.

That was an attempt, I think, to make me scared of him. I am not scared of him. I am a lesbian that brought gay pride and lesbian pride to Indiana, in a five state radius back in the 90's. So bring it on, we all have to die from something. I would rather die for something I am standing up for, with my brothers and sisters and other people, rather than put up with that in my city.

<u>Teal Bingham approached the podium.</u> I am a lifelong Bloomington resident. I believe that Schooner Creek Farm is in direct violation of the Bloomington Community Farmers' Market vendor contract. I hear a lot of people talking about the first amendment that is a really important conversation to have. The first amendment doesn't guarantee you a contract, a job, or stall at the Farmers' Market.

In that contract it said, as a vendor at the Farmers' Market they will collaborate with the City and assist with creating a welcoming environment for all who all attend the market. Shall represent themselves in a professional manner, which reflects their commitment to the market mission. As known members of Identity Evropa, which is a hate group that advocates for the nazafication of America, and for violence against many groups. I think they are in violation of their commitment to creating a welcoming and safe environment for all at the market.

I know a lot of people have just found out about this through Facebook, or through the Nolan Brewer FBI investigations. I have known about it for over a year. I have close friends who have known about them for five plus years. In the past few years they have open up to and tried to recruit members of the Bloomington community. Including shoppers and vendors who attend the market.

There is a vendor who complained about them over a year ago, and now no longer attends the market, because of the harassment they received after speaking up about it. Yesterday, I had a conversation with a community member who had very troubling interaction with them, including some bordering on recruitment over the five plus five years. They are unwilling to speak up, because the owners of Spooner Creek Farm has threatened to ruin the reputation of their small business. They are afraid of having their name attached to this.

I did ask the Farmers' Market Advisory Board about anonymous complaints from people who feel unsafe. This is a known hate group, a name take group, not just an ideology or political affiliation. I was told, there is no way to make anonymous complaints. That means the people who are most at risk, and the people who may be already be experiencing discrimination, don't have a protected way to bring that forward to you.

I would like to point out, the City is opening itself up to liability for doing nothing. In the future, if there is a discrimination suit brought against Schooner Creek Farm, it's on public record that the City knows they are members of a hate group that calls for nazafication of America and calling for violence. The contract they signed said they create a welcoming environment, and they are in direct violation of that.

Joan White approached the podium. I am a retired nurse, and I live in Bloomington. Two and a half weeks ago I was at the market and I witnessed a man harassing not only a vendor at Schooner Creek Farm, but also a customer of theirs. They screamed at a customer, a woman, are you a Nazi too? Do you know you are buying from Nazis? If anyone should be afraid at the market, I would think it should be the Schooner Creek Farm people.

I would like to read something from Martin Luther King Jr., after the four African American girls were murdered in Alabama. "In spite of the darkness of this hour we must not despair. We must not become bitter, nor must we harbor the desire to retaliate with violence. We must not lose faith in our white brothers. Somehow, we must believe the most misguided among them, can learn to respect the dignity and worth of all human personality." I believe we should engage in dialogue.

Community member approached the podium. People keep bring up Schooner Creek's first amendment rights, and that they haven't broken any rules of the market. I know for over a year they have been harassing customers, including myself. Earlier someone mentioned they had their photo taken. I have seen that happen to friends of mine, and to myself. They took my photo just because I was wearing a black coat. Later they actually had someone who was doing security for them. Which I don't think is normal for a market vendor to have security, but they do. They followed and assaulted a man, because the mixed race child that was with him, talked back to them at their booth. I think both of those things qualify as harassment. I would assume the market is aware of that assault, because the police were involved.

Some people have said that kicking them out would anger them. I would argue that if you are afraid of doing the right thing because it will upset white supremacist, who are members of Identity Evropa, which is a domestic terrorist group. That is negotiating with terrorist, and I thought that was something we don't do.

<u>Patricia approached the podium.</u> I feel a need to make a comment and give my prospective as a black woman, a resident of Bloomington, and a frequent patron of the community farmers market. I have always been proud to support my local community. I have the privilege to be able to buy things at our local farmers market. Unfortunately, I no longer feel safe attending. Every other person of color, I talked to in the last couple of weeks has said the same after this issue was brought to light.

That being said, I have a major issue with the lack of action by the City. I understand things take time, but when marginalized communities tell you they no longer feel safe. That should take priority. If you cannot take immediate action, please do not be surprised when people of color and other marginalized groups continue to dwindle out of the farmers market and other city organized events. Everyday nothing is done, people of color are losing their faith in the City of Bloomington. Because they will not protect us if things like white supremacist can't be taken out of our farmers market in a quick and effective way.

I ask the City and Parks and Recreation to make a public statement online or in the paper about their inability to take white supremacist out of our community farmers market. So that people of color and marginalized groups know that they will no longer be ensured a safe and welcoming environment. This is especially important to me because I had faith in the farmers market, and the City. As soon as this issue came up, I trusted my City to prioritize my safety.

Unfortunately I would have never know about the white supremacist if wasn't for protesters and social media. I could have bought from this vendor without knowing. Being transparent with a statement that is online and available and not just said in meetings. Being transparent with a statement like this will allow the community to know the truth.

I hope we can come together as a community, and if nothing is going to be done by the City of Bloomington. I hope we come together and create or organize an alternative farmers market to open in the future that allows marginalized people to feel safe and welcome. Unfortunately, I feel like nothing will be done, until someone like me gets attacked. I refuse to risk my safety in an unwelcome environment like our farmers market.

<u>Lisa approached the podium</u>. I am speaking with the end goal that Bloomington, and the Farmers' Market in particular, be a safe and welcoming place for all people. As deemed by the people who are least likely to feel safe in our community.

I have five recommendations. I recommend that the Parks and the City, host a facilitated discussion, or forum on how to make Bloomington a safe and welcoming place. Moderated by people who are trauma informed, and who are not whitecentrace focused.

I recommend the needs of the victims Nazi hate, be prioritized and centralized. At the top the need to feel safe in the City and at a public event such as the Farmers' Market. Particularly by marginalized groups, which is not happening now.

I recommend the City, perhaps the Parks and Recreation, have a table at the Market each week, where they are committed in education the public and establishing and anti-racism initiative. Each week it could be on a different topic or a different component of educating. This would be run by the City but in collaboration with various groups in the city.

Mayor John Hamilton statement on the Bloomington Community Farmers' Market stated, our community teams with individuals and organizations that work every day to weave that big wide welcome mat. That we want to be as real and inclusive as it should be. In order to demonstrate this welcome mat, I recommend the Farmers' Market have 20% of the vendors spots first available to people of color, as that reflects the population of people of color in Bloomington. I also encourage a scholarship fund with people of color getting priority.

Lastly I recommend the immediate removal of Doug and Sarah Dye, as they are in clear violation of the vendor handbook. Which states the Farmers' Market is a space where all feel welcome and safe, regardless race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, veteran status, housing status, or disability status. This is not happening.

Abby Ang approached the podium. You probably know me from the letter that was circulating. What I have to say is very short. Quit a few folks in the beginning have boiled this down to an issue of disagreement. With all due respect, this is not about a disagreement when it comes down to the lives and safety of minorities, and about marginalized groups. It's not simply an issue of disagreement, when it comes to my right to exist. Especially in the Farmers' Market space and the right of other people to exist. Martin Luther King was shot by a white supremacists. As my friend said earlier, someone was murdered in Charlottesville. I urge you to take that seriously as you figure out the next steps to take.

<u>Stacy Decker approached the podium.</u> In addition to my own comments, I have a copy of a letter written by Amy Countryman to Mayor Hamilton.

I am a vendor at the Bloomington Market and a longtime member of the community. This is a sign that was created to be hung at the vendors booths at the marked, and given out to anyone who wanted them this past weekend. This is something that could be done, and expresses that we want everyone to be welcomed and truly safe at the Market. The reality is that in so many situations, even outside of this market, individuals don't feel safe, heard, or a part of our community. We are seeing this in the current situation, and we need to remember this is systemic and is not new. It has been going on a very long time. I ask, how do we work for people of color, of LBGTQ+ people, Muslin people, Jewish

people, people with disabilities and immigrants? Are we listening to, working for, and with people who are consistently not heard. Are we admitting when we aren't doing this?

I continue to hear a lot about what we need to do, should do, and have to do. I would like to know what we are going to do. How are we going to get there, what is our consisted committed path in this work? I would like to hear from our City, as our community leaders, what action are they going to take in the short term and long term. What are the goals, what are the policies of Bloomington going to be? I feel the momentum of the energy in the community right now. People are willing to show up and do this work. My hope is that we use that energy to move in a different direction, create different patterns and use resources in learning structures that work.

Along with several other community members groups, I have been asking for transparency in this situation. Are the letters and action requests from our community getting proper attention and energy? As a city, are we making this a priority? Are we taking responsibility for our communication? Are we actively looking for resources and structures to implement? Are we asking the hard questions, and creating the coalitions and policies that move us toward restored justice.

How can Bloomington individuals, advocacy groups, the Bloomington Farmers' Market, and the City of Bloomington work together?

Our community needs a plan, concrete steps to move us towards who we want to be. The targets of white supremacy has needed the community's support for years now; here is Bloomington's opportunity to work on that. People who spread hate, must be held accountable and responsible for their actions. White supremacy must be recognized, named, and dismantled. New paths have to be created, I continue to ask how we do that.

<u>Community member approached the podium.</u> This is a very different talk than I had originally prepared. I realized at some point today, you already know what is happening, how we feel, and what it is we want done. What we need now is the confidence to know that something is being done, that action is being taken, and not just a verbal condemnation.

With the communication we have been given and the information we are privy to. It is impossible for us to know what is being done. So if we are asked to understand that you can't tell us specifics. We ask that you understand our frustration and our sense of urgency, whether it is productive or not.

I am a Scorpio, it's not in my nature to do this, but I really want to put faith in you. I really want to trust that you are working as hard as we are. That you care as much as we do, and that you are doing as much as possible. This doesn't mean I am done with this. It just means I am hoping that maybe, we can all be allies to solve this problem together.

<u>Cassandra Caswell approached the podium</u>. I am here because I have three things to ask of the Board of Park Commissioners for the City of Bloomington, regarding the presents of members of Identity Evropa at the Community Farmers' Market.

The first thing I would like to ask, is that the City acknowledges the presence of members of a known Neo-Nazi and white supremacist hate groups at the Community Farmers' Market is harmful to people of color, to Jewish people, to LBGTQ+ people, to other market vendors, and to the community collectively. By belonging to such a group, mainly Identity Evropa, Schooner Creek Farms is in violation of the terms of their contract with the City of Bloomington, to facilitate a welcoming and safe market. The City should remove Schooner Creek Farms from the market for the remainder of the 2019 market year, for the contract violation.

Number two, that the City rewrite the contracts for the 2020 market year, which explicitly prohibits vendors with ties from known hate groups from participating as vendors at the market.

Three, the City sit aside a percentage of vendor space at the Market for people of color, and establish a scholarship fund to facilitate inclusion of people of color as vendors at the Market.

<u>Daniel Bingham approached the podium.</u> You have heard there are good reasons to remove Schooner Creek Farms that don't have anything to do with free speech. There is a contract, they signed it, and they violated it. They have harassed

other market vendors, they have harassed customers. They have potentially denied customers on the basis of race. They have potentially assaulted some body.

Those are things that have nothing to do with free speech, and give you a leaver in which to remove them, if you don't want to have the free speech discussion. But in the case that you do, I am going to go ahead and read Eli Mosely's statement in a minute. I want to give a content warning as it contains deeply racist and disturbing language. If you don't want to hear it, here is your warning. If you refuse to use those levers, or if you are still hung up on the free speech issue. Let's go ahead and have that discussion. These are Nazis, neo-Nazis we are not talking about just a disagreement between right and left. We are not talking about, I want stronger property rights, or I want fewer property rights. These are people who are part of an organization Identity Evropa that is dedicated to the creation of a white ethno state through genocide in America.

This has really disbursing langue in it, and I don't really want to read it. But it's really important to know who these people are. The former leader Eli Mosley said," Identify Evropa is dedicated to the Nazifacation of America. I work in HR firing niggers and spicks all day. Before that I was in the Army and go to kill Muslins for fun. I'm not sure which one was better watching niggers and spicks cry because the cant feed their little mud children, or watching Muslins brains spray on the wall. Honestly both probably suck, compared to listening to a kike scream in the oven."

That was Eli Mosely, the former leader of Identity Evropa. Sarah and Doug by their own admission are proud members of Identity Evropa. This isn't about free speech, the minute you start planning a murder with someone. That is no longer free speech. You are in a conspiracy to commit murder once you take concrete action to commit that murder. You have committed a crime.

This organization is organizing to take power in this country. They are recruiting and trying to get people to take power so they can commit mass murder and genocide. The greatest mistake the ACLU ever made was defending Nazis right to organize. It is not a legitimate political ideology, it is a criminal conspiracy and should be treated as such.

<u>Reverend Forrest Gilmore approached the podium</u>. I come here to support the removal of Schooner Creek Farm from tour market. There are some that have talked about extending compassion, extending kindness, extending care, dialogue to these farmers, in the hope that they can convert them and treat them differently. I hundred percent support people who try to do that. I encourage them to do that, please anyone who feels they can do that go for it.

In the meantime, I feel that it is extremely important that we protect people of color, and other marginalized population from a group that would seek to destroy them. They are whom, I wish our community would extend our love, our compassion, our care, and our kindness. Subjecting marginalized people to the threat of white supremacist is not a loving or kind act.

I believe as many people do here, we need to see the City as an active partner in the removal of this farm from the market. I also want to bring to the City, the concept that they got Al Capone on tax evasion. They didn't get him on the murders, they didn't get him on the other things. We just had recent admission from the farm that they were flooded out. We know from the FDA, that sharing food from a field that has been flooded is not right for human consumption. I want the City to be creative and think outside of the box, on how to deal with this situation. If you don't feel like you can deal with it through first amendment issues, look to other issues to solve this problem.

<u>Les Coyne, Board President commented</u>. This has been very useful to me personally. I am very pleased to have sat here and listened to your comments. I assure you I take them quite seriously. We are in the process of trying to find ways to deal with this creative and otherwise.

<u>Lisa Thatcher</u>, <u>Board member commented</u>. I just want to say thank you again. This is very hard and uncomfortable. Being uncomfortable is a very necessary part of growth. It takes a lot to come up here and speak to us, to be filmed, and to put everything out there. Thank you for doing that it is deeply appreciated.

<u>Joe Hoffman, Board member commented</u>. I heard and learned something today from some of the thoughts and ideas that people have communicated. I assure you, I will be perusing some of those ideas.

Staff recommends approval of the contract with Rundell Ernstberger (REA) Associates, Inc. in the amount not to exceed \$45, 800. The funding is through the 2019 Bicentennial Bond funds (180-18-18018C)

Background

This is a new contract with REA to complete conceptual design work on the Bicentennial Gateways projects. The City has identified four possible locations for the gateways:

- Traffic island north of Miller Showers Park between College Ave. and Walnut St.

The contract work is expected to take four months beginning in August through November. A final presentation will be made at a public board meeting in December 2019.

BLOOMINGTON GATEWAYS CONCEPTUAL DESIGN STUDY

This Agreement, entered into on this _____day of ______, 2019, by and between the City of Bloomington Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department"), and Rundell Ernstberger Associates, Inc. ("Contractor"),

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Department wishes to develop gateways at four locations identified as major entrances into the City as part of the 2018 Bicentennial Bond Projects; and

WHEREAS, the Department requires the services of a professional Contractor in order to perform Bloomington Gateways Conceptual Design Study (the "Services" as further defined below); and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that such Services be undertaken and performed; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is willing and able to provide such Services to the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Article 1. Scope of Services

Contractor shall provide the Services as specified in Exhibit A, "Scope of Work", attached hereto and incorporated into this Agreement. Contractor shall diligently provide the Services under this Agreement and shall complete the Services described in this Agreement in a timely manner consistent with the Standard of Care identified in Article 2. Contractor shall complete the Services required under this Agreement on or before December 1, 2019, unless the parties mutually agree to a later completion date. Completion shall mean completion of all work related to the Services.

In the performance of Contractor's work, Contractor agrees to maintain such coordination with the Department as may be requested and desirable, including primary coordination with Paula McDevitt, as the Department's Project Manager. Contractor agrees that any information or documents, including digital GIS information, supplied by the Department pursuant to Article 3, below, shall be used by Contractor for this project only, and shall not be reused or reassigned for any other purpose without the written permission of the Department.

Article 2. Standard of Care

Contractor shall be responsible for completion of the Services in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances ("Standard of Care"). The Department shall be the sole judge of the adequacy of Contractor's work in meeting the Standard of Care; however, the Department shall not unreasonably withhold its approval as to the adequacy of Contractor's performance. Upon notice to Contractor and by mutual agreement between the parties, Contractor will, without additional compensation, correct or replace any and all Services not meeting the Standard of Care.

Article 3. Responsibilities of the Department

The Department shall provide all necessary information regarding requirements for the Services. The Department shall furnish such information as expeditiously as is necessary for the orderly progress of the work, and Contractor shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness of such information. The Department's Project Manager shall act on its behalf with respect to this Agreement.

Article 4. Compensation

The Department shall pay Contractor for all fees and expenses in an amount not to exceed Forty Five Thousand Eight Hundred dollars (\$45, 800.00). Invoices may be sent via first class mail postage prepaid or via email. Payment will be remitted to Contractor within forty-five (45) days of receipt of invoice. Contractor shall submit an invoice to the Department upon the completion of the Services described in Article 1. The invoice shall be sent to:

Additional services not set forth in Article 1, or changes in the Services must be authorized in writing by the Department or its designated project coordinator prior to such work being performed, or expenses incurred. The Department shall not make payment for any unauthorized work or expenses.

Article 5. Appropriation of Funds

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, if funds for the continued fulfillment of this Agreement by the Department are at any time not forthcoming or are insufficient, through failure of any entity, including the Department itself, to appropriate funds or otherwise, then the Department shall have the right to terminate this Agreement without penalty.

Article 6. Schedule

Contractor shall perform the Services according to the schedule set forth in Exhibit B, Project Schedule, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The time limits established by this schedule shall not be exceeded, except for reasonable cause as mutually agreed by the parties.

Article 7. Termination

In the event of a party's substantial failure to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, the other party shall have the right to terminate the Agreement upon written notice. The nonperforming party shall have fourteen (14) calendar days from the receipt of the termination notice to cure or to submit a plan for cure acceptable to the other party.

The Department may terminate or suspend performance of this Agreement at the Department's prerogative at any time upon written notice to Contractor. Contractor shall terminate or suspend performance of the Services on a schedule acceptable to the Department and the Department shall pay the Contractor for all the Services performed up to the date that written notice is received, plus reasonable termination or suspension expenses. Upon restart, an equitable adjustment shall be made to Contractor's compensation and the schedule of services. Upon termination or suspension of this Agreement, all finished or unfinished reports, drawings, collections of data and other documents generated by Contractor in connection with this Agreement shall become the property of the Department, as set forth in Article 10 herein.

Article 8. Identity of the Contractor

Contractor acknowledges that one of the primary reasons for its selection by the Department to perform the Services is the qualifications and experience of Contractor. Contractor thus agrees that the Services to be performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed by Contractor. Contractor shall not subcontract

any part of the Services without the prior written permission of the Department. The Department reserves the right to reject any of the Contractor's personnel or proposed outside professional sub-Contractors, and the Department reserves the right to request that acceptable replacement personnel be assigned to the project.

Article 9. Opinions of Probable Cost

All opinions of probable construction cost to be provided by Contractor shall represent the best judgment of Contractor based upon the information currently available and upon Contractor's background and experience with respect to projects of this nature. It is recognized, however, that neither Contractor nor the Department has control over the cost of labor, materials or equipment, over contractors' method of determining costs for services, or over competitive bidding, market or negotiating conditions. Accordingly, Department cannot and does not warrant or represent that the proposals or construction bids received will not vary from the cost estimates provided pursuant to this Agreement.

Article 10. Reuse of Instruments of Service

All documents, including but not limited to, drawings, specifications and computer software prepared by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement are instruments of service in respect to this project. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by the Department or others on modifications or extensions of this project or on any other project. The Department may elect to reuse such documents; however any reuse or modification without prior written authorization of Contractor will be at the Department's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Contractor. The Department shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Contractor against all judgments, losses, claims, damages, injuries and expenses arising out of or resulting from such unauthorized reuse or modification.

Article 11. Ownership of Documents and Intellectual Property

All documents, drawings and specifications, including digital format files, prepared by Contractor and furnished to the Department as part of the Services shall become the property of the Department. Contractor shall retain its ownership rights in its design, drawing details, specifications, databases, computer software and other proprietary property. Intellectual property developed, utilized or modified in the performance of the Services shall remain the property of Contractor.

Article 12. Independent Contractor Status

During the entire term of this Agreement, Contractor shall be an independent contractor, and in no event shall any of its personnel, agents or sub-contractors be construed to be, or represent themselves to be, employees of the Department. Contractor shall be solely responsible for the payment and reporting of all employee and employer taxes, including social security, unemployment, and any other federal, state, or local taxes required to be withheld from employees or payable on behalf of employees.

Article 13. Indemnification

Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Bloomington, the Department, and the officers, agents and employees of the City and the Department from any and all claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses or other liability arising out of the Agreement or occasioned by the reckless or negligent performance of any provision thereof, including, but not limited to, any reckless or negligent act or failure to act or any misconduct on the part of the Contractor or its agents or employees, or any independent contractors directly responsible to it (collectively "Claims").

Article 14. Insurance

During the performance of any and all Services under this Agreement, Contractor shall maintain the following insurance in full force and effect:

- a. General Liability Insurance, with a minimum combined single limit of \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate.
- b. Automobile Liability Insurance, with a minimum combined single limit of \$1,000,000 for each person and \$1,000,000 for each accident.

- c. Professional Liability Insurance ("Errors and Omissions Insurance") with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 annual aggregate.
- d. Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with the statutory requirements of Title 22 of the Indiana Code.

All insurance policies shall be issued by an insurance company authorized to issue such insurance in the State of Indiana. The City of Bloomington, the Department, and the officers, employees and agents of each shall be named as insureds under the General Liability, Automobile, and Worker's Compensation policies, and such policies shall stipulate that the insurance will operate as primary insurance and that no other insurance of the City's will be called upon to contribute to a loss hereunder.

Contractor shall provide evidence of each insurance policy to the Department prior to the commencement of work under this Agreement. Approval of the insurance by the Department shall not relieve or decrease the extent to which Contractor may be held responsible for payment of damages resulting from Contractor's provision of the Services or its operations under this Agreement. If Contractor fails or refuses to procure or maintain the insurance required by these provisions, or fails or refuses to furnish the Department's required proof that the insurance has been procured and is in force and paid for, the Department shall have the right at its election to terminate the Agreement.

Article 15. Conflict of Interest

Contractor declares that it has no present interest, nor shall it acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict with the performance of Services under this Agreement. Contractor agrees that no person having any such interest shall be employed in the performance of this Agreement.

Article 16. Waiver

No failure of either party to enforce a term of this Agreement against the other shall be construed as a waiver of that term, nor shall it in any way affect the party's right to enforce that term. No waiver by any party of any term of this Agreement shall be considered to be a waiver of any other term or breach thereof.

Article 17. Severability

The invalidity, illegality or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this Agreement void shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of this Agreement. Any void provision shall be deemed severed from this Agreement, and the balance of the Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if it did not contain the particular provision to be held void. The parties further agree to amend this Agreement to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this Article shall not prevent this entire Agreement from being void should a provision which is of the essence of this Agreement be determined void.

Article 18. Assignment

Neither the Department nor the Contractor shall assign any rights or duties under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Unless otherwise stated in the written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any obligation under this Agreement.

Article 19. Third Party Rights

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the Department and Contractor.

Article 20. Governing Law and Venue

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Indiana. Venue of any disputes arising under this Agreement shall be in the Monroe Circuit Court, Monroe County, Indiana.

Article 21. Non-Discrimination

Contractor shall comply with City of Bloomington Ordinance 2.21.020 and all other federal, state and local laws and regulations governing non-discrimination in all regards, including, but not limited to, employment.

Article 22. Compliance with Laws

In performing the Services under this Agreement, Contractor shall comply with any and all applicable federal, state and local statutes, ordinances, plans and regulations, including any and all regulations for protection of the environment. Where such statutes, ordinances, plans or regulations of any public authority having any jurisdiction over the project are in conflict, Contractor shall proceed using its best judgment only after attempting to resolve any such conflict between such governmental agencies, and shall notify the Department in a timely manner of the conflict, attempts of resolution, and planned course of action.

Article 23. E-Verify

Contractor is required to enroll in and verify the work eligibility status of all newly-hired employees through the E-Verify program. (This is not required if the E-Verify program no longer exists). Contractor shall sign an affidavit, attached as Exhibit C, affirming that Contractor does not knowingly employ an unauthorized alien. "Unauthorized alien" is defined at 8 U.S. Code 1324a(h)(3) as a person who is not a U.S. citizen or U.S. national and is not lawfully admitted for permanent residence or authorized to work in the U.S. under 8 U.S. Code chapter 12 or by the U.S. Attorney General.

Contractor and any subcontractors may not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien, or retain an employee or contract with a person that the Contractor or subcontractor subsequently learns is an unauthorized alien. If the City obtains information that the Contractor or subcontractor employs or retains an employee who is an unauthorized alien, the City shall notify the Contractor or subcontractor of the contract violation and require that the violation be remedied within 30 days of the date of notice. If the Contractor or subcontractor verified the work eligibility status of the employee in question through the E-Verify program, there is a rebuttable presumption that the Contractor or subcontractor did not knowingly employ an unauthorized alien. If the Contractor or subcontractor fails to remedy the violation within the 30 day period, the City shall terminate the contract, unless the City Commission or department that entered into the contract determines that terminating the contract would be detrimental to the public interest or public property, in which case the City may allow the contract to remain in effect until the City procures a new Contractor. If the City terminates the contract, the Contractor or subcontractor is liable to the City for actual damages.

Contractor shall require any subcontractors performing work under this contract to certify to the Contractor that, at the time of certification, the subcontractor does not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien and the subcontractor has enrolled in and is participating in the E-Verify program. Contractor shall maintain on file all subcontractors' certifications throughout the term of the contract with the City.

Article 24. Notices

Any notice required by this Agreement shall be made in writing to the individuals/addresses specified below:

Nothing contained in this Article shall be construed to restrict the transmission of routine communications between representatives of the Department and Contractor.

Article 25. Intent to be Bound

The Department and Contractor each binds itself and its successors, executors, administrators, permitted assigns, legal representatives and, in the case of a partnership, its partners to the other party to this Agreement, and to the successors, executors, administrators, permitted assigns, legal representatives and partners of such other party in respect to all provisions of this Agreement.

Article 26. Integration and Modification

This Agreement, including all Exhibits incorporated by reference, represents the entire and integrated agreement between the Department and the Contractor. It supersedes all prior and contemporaneous communications, representations and agreements, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement may be modified only by a written amendment signed by both parties hereto.

Article 27. Non-Collusion

Contractor is required to certify that it has not, nor has any other member, representative, or agent of Contractor, entered into any combination, collusion, or agreement with any person relative to the price to be offered by any person nor prevented any person from making an offer nor induced anyone to refrain from making an offer and that this offer is made without reference to any other offer. Contractor shall sign an affidavit, attached hereto as Exhibit D, affirming that Contractor has not engaged in any collusive conduct. Exhibit D is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as though fully set forth.

"Scope of Work"

The Services shall include the following:

- Project Initiation Meeting: REA will meet with the City to review the project goals and parameters, work
 plan, and schedule. REA will gather and compile information from the City in order to prepare project
 base plans and gain a thorough understanding of current, planned and future projects which may impact
 gateway development.
- 2. Inventory and Analysis: Working from aerial images and GIS files provided by the City, REA will provide an inventory and analysis of the existing conditions at the gateway locations. The following preliminary gateway locations have been identified by the City as locations to be included in the study:
 - Arlington Bridge over State Road 46 Bypass just east on I-69/SR 46 Interchange
 - Bloomfield Road (W. 2nd Street) between Basswood Drive and Weimer Road
 - SR 46/E. 3rd Street and Knightridge Road
 - Traffic island north of Miller Showers Park between College Ave. and Walnut St.

Graphics for this stage of work will be simple plan diagrams to illustrate existing conditions, coupled with a photographs and a bullet point narrative that outlines both opportunities and constraints to gateway development at each location.

During this stage, REA will also conduct an assessment of the existing branding, identity, and cultural assets in an effort to understand the defining characteristics and themes of the Bloomington community and how these might begin to inform the development of design themes and elements for the gateways.

Findings will be summarized in a simple report format suitable for screen viewing or presentation.

- 3. Project Review Meeting: REA will meet with the City to review preliminary findings of the Inventory and Analysis work. Feedback and input from the City will be collected and initial impressions regarding gateway development opportunities and constraints will be discussed. In addition, it will be important to discuss and confirm gateway hierarchy, prototypes, and priorities at this meeting in order to provide direction for the next stage of work involving the preparation of initial gateway concepts.
- 4. Preliminary Conceptual Design: REA will prepare preliminary conceptual designs for each gateway location, consisting of preliminary elevations and sections that illustrate the proposed scale, materials, colors, theme, graphic features of the gateway architectural and landscape elements, and how the gateway elements can be integrated at each proposed site.
- 5. Project Review Meeting: REA will meet with the City to review the preliminary conceptual design materials. The outcomes of this meeting will provide direction of the preferred gateway designs and scope of improvements to be considered at each location. Feedback and input from the City will be collected and used to make refinements to the proposed design and develop preliminary project cost opinions for each gateway location.
- 6. Final Conceptual Design: REA will prepare the final conceptual design materials to include conceptual gateway plans and cost opinions at each location, and the design standards for materials, graphics, colors, themes, etc. Documentation of the above will summarized in a graphic report format suitable for screen viewing or presentation.

GARLICFEST AND COMMUNITY ART FAIR

Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of the permit application to sell beer and wine at the 2019 GarlicFest and Community Art Fair event to be held on August 31st and September 1st at the Waldron, Hill, and Buskirk Park.

Background

The GarlicFest and Community Art Fair have been approved for an event permit for the festival held over the Labor Day weekend in Waldron, Hill, and Buskirk Park. This is the eighth year for the event. In 2013, this event included the sale of beer/wine for the first time. David Cox (event coordinator) remains in good standing with the Bloomington Parks and Recreation Department (BPRD). We feel this event is appropriate to include the sale of beer/wine.

Event organizers are prepared to adhere to all local and state laws along with any rules and regulations from BPRD. MSI Security Services (Marshall Security) will provide the appropriate security for the event and the sale of alcohol. Once approved, organizers will apply for the temporary beer/wine permit from the State of Indiana, Alcohol & Tobacco Commission. Organizers will provide us a copy of the state permit prior to their event. In addition, they will be accessed an alcohol permit fee of \$200 or ten percent of gross, whichever is greater.

2019 Guidelines for Requesting/Approval of Alcohol Sales with Approved Event Permit

In addition to an approved park permit application, rental groups requesting to serve beer and/or wine must submit a proposal including how the following guidelines will be met before qualifying for a temporary alcohol permit. Once submitted, the Board of Park Commissioners and Parks and Recreation Administrator will approve/deny all requests.

Please Note:

- Beer and wine are the only alcoholic beverages permitted for sale or distribution on City of Bloomington Parks and Recreation owned property.
- Alcohol requests will only be considered for public events. Private events with closed invitations like family reunions, weddings, etc. will not be considered for alcohol sales.

Application Process:

- 1. An approved Park Special Event Permit Application must be on file and the rental group in good standing with the City of Bloomington Parks and Recreation Department
- 2. Once obtained, a copy of the approved Temporary Beer/Wine Authority/Type 118 or a copy of an approved Catering Authority/Type 222 Application from the State of Indiana, Alcohol & Tobacco Commission must be on file with Bloomington Parks and Recreation (prior to event).
- 3. Rental group(s) shall employ a licensed security company to be present throughout the event &/or anytime alcohol is present. The number of security needed will be determined by Bloomington Parks and Recreation staff and will be dependent on site set up and size/scope of event.
- 4. Fencing plans must be included as part of the proposal and installation methods approved by Bloomington Parks and Recreation prior to event. Fencing may not be staked without prior approval. Plastic snow fencing will not be allowed.
- 5. Anyone entering the bar area where alcohol is served must be over 21 and wearing either a wrist band or hand stamp indicating that they are of legal age to consume alcohol.
- 6. The detailed floor plan, map or diagram on file with the State of Indiana, Alcohol & Tobacco Commission must also be submitted with the proposal to Bloomington Parks and Recreation. Once approved, floor plan, map or diagram may not be altered.
- 7. Alcohol Permit fee is \$200 or ten percent of gross, whichever is greater (alcohol permits granted on a case by case basis and require additional paperwork and approval by the Board of Park Commissioners).

Indiana State Regulations for Beer/Wine Authority (Permit) include:

- 1. There must be a well-defined premises i.e. building, tent, enclosure, or fenced-in or designated area.
- 2. You **must** submit a floor plan or diagram. If minors are present, you must have a defined separation between the bar area and family area. (Must be on floor plan.)
- 3. There shall be **NO** carry-out privileges, **NO** carry-in privileges, and **NO** spirituous beverages allowed.
- 4. Each applicant must designate an individual to be responsible for the event and such person must sign the authority.
- 5. **ANY** and **ALL** persons dispensing or accepting payment for alcoholic beverages **MUST POSSESS** a valid ATC employee permit.

- 6. The event must meet applicable Indiana State Board of Health requirements, particularly with regard to restroom facilities.
- 7. If the event is held in a town park, you must have approval from the town board.
- 8. Legal hours of dispensing alcoholic beverages (Prevailing time) Monday through Saturday – 7 AM to 3 AM the following day Sunday – 7 AM to 3 AM the following day
- 9. Applicant **must** file with the district ATC office at which the event will be held at least 5 days prior to the event. Failure to comply is grounds for denial.
- 10. The authority (permit) must be posted in the most conspicuous place at the location of the event. An excise officer or commissioner, for good cause, has the authority to revoke a temporary permit during the event.

Indiana State Regulations for Catering Authority (Permit) include:

- 1. The exact address of the proposed catered event must be disclosed upon the application form.
- 2. A floor plan of the designated licensed premises must be submitted along with the application form. There must be a well-defined premises, i.e., a building, a tent, an enclosure, a fenced area, or a roped off area. The exact area from which the alcoholic beverages shall be dispensed must be listed on the floor plan. Areas where minors will be present must be so designated on the plans. No minors shall be allowed within the area where alcoholic beverages are dispensed.
- 3. Consumption of alcoholic beverages shall take place on the licensed premises only. There shall be **NO** carry-out privileges.
- 4. Each applicant must designate an individual to be responsible for the event. Such person shall possess an employee's permit and shall be available to the Excise Police during the event.
- 5. An Excise Officer has the authority to revoke approval of a catered event before or during the event for good cause.
- 6. The event must meet applicable Department of Health sanitation requirements, particularly with regard to restroom facilities.
- 7. All applications should be received a full fifteen (15) days prior to the event.
- 8. If the catered event is open to the public, the applicant shall notify the local law enforcement agency responsible for the area in which the catered function is held. The Excise Police may ask for proof of notification to local police which may be demonstrated by a copy of a letter, a "log" entry by the police department, or other means deemed as an appropriate authentication.
- 9. The wholesaler servicing a supplemental caterer may deliver the alcoholic beverages directly to the location of the catered event if the supplemental caterer has his letter of authority posted at that location.
- 10. A supplemental caters permit is to be used for a specific off premises function of event and not for a permittee to use any adjoining or remote facilities to enlarge or enhance his own business enterprises.



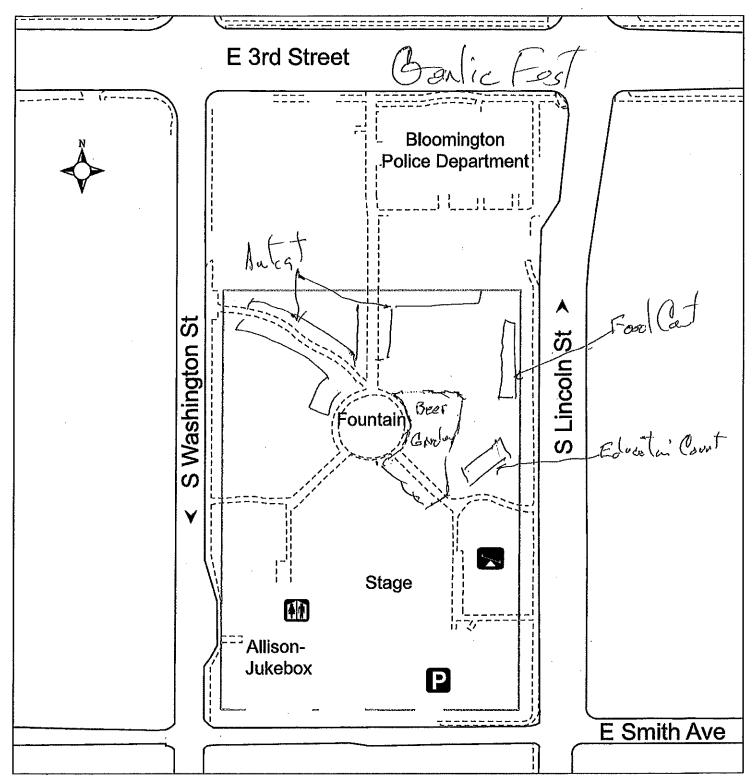

SERVICE AGREEMENT

Recommendation

Staff recommends the review/approval of the Koorsen Environmental Services agreement for the Sports Division. If this service is used, funds not to exceed \$600 would be from 201-18-185006-53630.

Background

Koorsen Environmental Services provides cleaning, inspection, and repair service to exhaust hoods for food and beverage providers. Typically, we use this service once a year or on an "as needed" basis.

The City of Bloomington Financial Policies Manual requires all public work projects to be approved in contract form by the Board of Park Commissioners. "Public Work" means any service done on city property that is paid for out of a public fund. The manual outlines that if the work is involves routine operation, routine repair, or routine maintenance of existing structures, buildings or real property, the Board may award a contract for the public work in the manner provided in IC 5-22 for Public Purchasing. These service contracts are to manage emergency or standard repairs and/or service as the need arises.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF BLOOMINGTON PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT AND KOORSEN ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

This Agreement, entered into on this ____day of _____, 2019, by and between the City of Bloomington Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department"), and Koorsen Environmental Services ("Contractor").

- Article 1. Scope of Services Contractor shall provide inspection and clean exhaust hood components at City park properties ("Services"). Contractor shall diligently provide the Services under this Agreement and shall complete the Services described in this Agreement in a timely manner consistent with the Standard of Care identified in Article 2. Contractor shall complete the Services required under this Agreement on or before December 31, 2019, unless the parties mutually agree to a later completion date. Completion shall mean completion of all work related to the Services. In the performance of Contractor's work, Contractor agrees to maintain such coordination with the Department as may be requested and desirable, including primary coordination with Daren Eads as the Department's Project Manager. Contractor agrees that any information or documents, including digital GIS information, supplied by the Department pursuant to Article 3, below, shall be used by Contractor for this project only, and shall not be reused or reassigned for any other purpose without the written permission of the Department.
- Article 2. <u>Standard of Care</u> Contractor shall be responsible for completion of the Services in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances ("Standard of Care"). The Department shall be the sole judge of the adequacy of Contractor's work in meeting the Standard of Care; however, the Department shall not unreasonably withhold its approval as to the adequacy of Contractor's performance. Upon notice to Contractor and by mutual agreement between the parties, Contractor will, without additional compensation, correct or replace any and all Services not meeting the Standard of Care.
- Article 3. Responsibilities of the Department The Department shall provide all necessary information regarding requirements for the Services. The Department shall furnish such information as necessary for the orderly progress of the work, and Contractor shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness of such information. The Department's Project Manager shall act on its behalf with respect to this Agreement.
- Article 4. Compensation The Department shall pay Contractor for all fees and expenses in an amount not to exceed Six hundred Dollars (\$600.00). Contractor shall submit an invoice to the Department upon the completion of the Services described in Article 1. The invoice shall be sent to: Attn: Daren Eads TLRC, City of Bloomington, 401 N. Morton, Suite 250, Bloomington, Indiana 47404. Invoices may be sent via first class mail postage prepaid or via email. Payment will be remitted to Contractor within forty-five (45) days of receipt of invoice. Additional services not set forth in Article 1, or changes in the Services must be authorized in writing by the Department or its designated project coordinator prior to such work being performed, or expenses incurred. The Department shall not make payment for any unauthorized work or expenses.
- Article 5. Appropriation of Funds Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, if funds for the continued fulfillment of this Agreement by the Department are at any time not forthcoming or are insufficient, through failure of any entity, including the Department itself, to appropriate funds or otherwise, then the Department shall have the right to terminate this Agreement without penalty.
- Article 6. Schedule Contractor shall perform the Services according to the following schedule:
- Consultant shall perform the Services on a mutually agreed upon scheduled date and time. The time limits established by this schedule shall not be exceeded, except for reasonable cause as mutually agreed by the parties.
- The time limits established by this schedule shall not be exceeded, except for reasonable cause as mutually agreed by the parties.
- Article 7. Termination In the event of a party's substantial failure to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, the other party shall have the right to terminate the Agreement upon written notice. The nonperforming party shall have fourteen (14) calendar days from the receipt of the termination notice to cure or to submit a plan for cure acceptable to the other party. Additionally, the Department may terminate or suspend performance of this Agreement at the Department's prerogative at any time upon written notice to Contractor. Contractor shall terminate or suspend performance of the Services on a schedule acceptable to the Department and the Department shall pay the Contractor for all the Services performed up to the date that written notice is received, plus reasonable termination or suspension expenses. Upon restart, an equitable adjustment shall be made to Contractor's compensation and the schedule of services. Upon termination or suspension of this Agreement, all finished or unfinished reports, drawings, collections of data and other documents generated by Contractor in connection with this Agreement shall become the property of the Department, as set forth in Article 9 herein.
- Article 8. <u>Identity of the Contractor</u> Contractor acknowledges that one of the primary reasons for its selection by the Department to perform the Services is the qualifications and experience of Contractor. Contractor thus agrees that the Services to be performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed by Contractor. Contractor shall not subcontract any part of the Services without the prior written permission of the Department. The Department reserves the right to reject any of the Contractor's personnel or proposed outside professional sub-Contractors, and the Department reserves the right to request that acceptable replacement personnel be assigned to the project.
- Article 9. Ownership of Documents and Intellectual Property All documents, drawings and specifications, including digital format files, prepared by Contractor and furnished to the Department as part of the Services shall become the property of the Department. Contractor shall retain its ownership rights in its design, drawing details, specifications, databases, computer software and other proprietary property. Intellectual property developed, utilized or modified in the performance of the Services shall remain the property of Contractor.
- **Article 10.** <u>Independent Contractor Status</u> During the entire term of this Agreement, Contractor shall be an independent contractor, and in no event shall any of its personnel, agents or sub-contractors be construed to be, or represent themselves to be, employees of the Department. Contractor shall be solely responsible for the payment and reporting of all employee and employer taxes, including social security, unemployment, and any other federal, state, or local taxes required to be withheld from employees or payable on behalf of employees.
- Article 11. <u>Indemnification</u> Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Bloomington, the Department, and the officers, agents and employees of the City and the Department from any and all claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses or other liability arising out of the Agreement or occasioned by the reckless or negligent performance of any provision thereof, including, but not limited to, any reckless or negligent act or failure to act or any misconduct on the part of the Contractor or its agents or employees, or any independent contractors directly responsible to it (collectively "Claims").
- Article 12. Insurance During the performance of any and all Services under this Agreement, Contractor shall maintain the following insurance in full force and effect: a) General Liability Insurance, with a minimum combined single limit of \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate; b) Automobile Liability Insurance, with a minimum combined single limit of \$1,000,000 for each person and \$1,000,000 for each accident; c) Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with the statutory requirements of Title 22 of the Indiana Code; and d) Professional Liability Insurance ("Errors and Omissions Insurance") with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 annual aggregate. All insurance policies shall be issued by an insurance company authorized to issue such insurance in the State of Indiana. The City of Bloomington, the Department, and the officers, employees and agents of each shall be named as insureds under the General Liability, Automobile, and Worker's Compensation policies, and such policies shall stipulate that the insurance will operate as primary insurance and that no other insurance of the City's will be called upon to contribute to a loss hereunder. Contractor shall provide evidence of each insurance policy to the Department prior to the commencement of work under this Agreement.

Article 13. <u>Conflict of Interest</u> Contractor declares that it has no present interest, nor shall it acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict with the performance of Services under this Agreement. Contractor agrees that no person having any such interest shall be employed in the performance of this Agreement.

Article 14. Waiver No failure of either party to enforce a term of this Agreement against the other shall be construed as a waiver of that term, nor shall it in any way affect the party's right to enforce that term. No waiver by any party of any term of this Agreement shall be considered to be a waiver of any other term or breach thereof.

Article 15. Severability The invalidity, illegality or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this Agreement void shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of this Agreement. Any void provision shall be deemed severed from this Agreement, and the balance of the Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if it did not contain the particular provision to be held void. The parties further agree to amend this Agreement to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this Article shall not prevent this entire Agreement from being void should a provision which is of the essence of this Agreement be determined void.

Article 16. <u>Assignment</u> Neither the Department nor the Contractor shall assign any rights or duties under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Unless otherwise stated in the written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any obligation under this Agreement.

Article 17. Third Party Rights Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the parties.

Article 18. Governing Law and Venue This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Indiana. Venue of any disputes arising under this Agreement shall be in the Monroe Circuit Court, Monroe County, Indiana.

Article 19. Non-Discrimination Contractor shall comply with City of Bloomington Ordinance 2.21.020 and all other federal, state and local laws and regulations governing non-discrimination in all regards, including, but not limited to, employment.

Article 20. Compliance with Laws In performing the Services under this Agreement, Contractor shall comply with any and all applicable federal, state and local statutes, ordinances, plans and regulations, including any and all regulations for protection of the environment. Where such statutes, ordinances, plans or regulations of any public authority having any jurisdiction over the project are in conflict, Contractor shall proceed using its best judgment only after attempting to resolve any such conflict between such governmental agencies, and shall notify the Department in a timely manner of the conflict, attempts of resolution, and planned course of action.

Article 21. E-Verify Contractor is required to enroll in and verify the work eligibility status of all newly-hired employees through the E-Verify program. (This is not required if the E-Verify program no longer exists). Contractor shall sign an affidavit, attached as Exhibit A, affirming that Contractor does not knowingly employ an unauthorized alien. Contractor shall require any subcontractors performing work under this contract to certify to the Contractor that, at the time of certification, the subcontractor does not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien and the subcontractor has enrolled in and is participating in the E-Verify program. Contractor shall maintain on file all subcontractors' certifications throughout the term of the contract with the City.

Article 22. Notices Any notice required by this Agreement shall be made in writing to the individuals/addresses specified below:

Nothing contained in this Article shall be construed to restrict the transmission of routine communications between representatives of the Department and Contractor.

Article 23. <u>Integration and Modification</u> This Agreement, including all Exhibits incorporated by reference, represents the entire and integrated agreement between the Department and the Contractor. It supersedes all prior and contemporaneous communications, representations and agreements, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement may be modified only by a written amendment signed by both parties hereto

Article 24. Non-Collusion Contractor is required to certify that it has not, nor has any other member, representative, or agent of Contractor, entered into any combination, collusion, or agreement with any person relative to the price to be offered by any person nor prevented any person from making an offer nor induced anyone to refrain from making an offer and that this offer is made without reference to any other offer. Contractor shall sign an affidavit, attached hereto as Exhibit B, affirming that Contractor has not engaged in any collusive conduct. Exhibit B is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as though fully set forth.

Recommendation

The task will involve plumbing, masonry, and electrical work which made finding potential vendors a challenge. Two quotes were submitted:

\$9,998.00 by Commercial Services Heating Cooling Plumbing

Staff recommends approval of the contract with Harrell-Fish Mid Services in the amount not to exceed \$7,390.00. The funding is through the Frank Southern Ice Arena General Fund 200-18-182500-53630

Background

This contract is to make improvements to the Frank Southern Ice Arena "snow pit". The snow pit is where the ice-resurfacer deposits ice after each cut. Because of the design of the snow pit and aging of the drainage system over the years the snow does not melt fast enough causing the snow to overflow from the pit into the garage area. This becomes an operational challenge, increases labor, and present a minor safety hazard for staff working in that area.

All documents, including but not limited to, drawings, specifications and computer software prepared by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement are instruments of service in respect to this project. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by the Department or others on modifications or extensions of this project or on any other project. The Department may elect to reuse such documents; however any reuse or modification without prior written authorization of Contractor will be at the Department's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Contractor. The Department shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Contractor against all judgments, losses, claims, damages, injuries and expenses arising out of or resulting from such unauthorized reuse or modification.

Article 11. Ownership of Documents and Intellectual Property

All documents, drawings and specifications, including digital format files, prepared by Contractor and furnished to the Department as part of the Services shall become the property of the Department. Contractor shall retain its ownership rights in its design, drawing details, specifications, databases, computer software and other proprietary property. If the City obtains information that the Consultant or subcontractor employs or retains an employee who is an unauthorized alien, the City shall notify the Consultant or subcontractor of the contract violation and require that the violation be remedied within 30 days of the date of notice. If the Consultant or subcontractor verified the work eligibility status of the employee in question through the E-Verify program, there is a rebuttable presumption that the Consultant or subcontractor did not knowingly employ an unauthorized alien. If the Consultant or subcontractor fails to remedy the violation within the 30 day period, the City shall terminate the contract, unless the City Commission or department that entered into the contract determines that terminating the contract would be detrimental to the public

interest or public property, in which case the City may allow the contract to remain in effect until the City procures a new Consultant. If the City terminates the contract, the Consultant or subcontractor is liable to the City for actual damages.

Consultant shall require any subcontractors performing work under this contract to certify to the Consultant that, at the time of certification, the subcontractor does not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien and the subcontractor has enrolled in and is participating in the E-Verify program. Consultant shall maintain on file all subcontractors' certifications throughout the term of the contract with the City.

"Scope of Work"

The Services shall include the following:

The project is for the detailed design and construction documents to re-align the entry drive into the parking lot, create a central node serving as a pedestrian road crossing and park entrance identifier, create a wooden deck overlook and fishing pier structure. Design will consider trail or boardwalk connections to the overlook to the north and the south, and boardwalk extension(s) may be considered as alternates in bidding. Design work is anticipated to be based on preliminary design drawings developed in April, 2018. We understand the budget for the project to be \$500,000.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION & OBJECTIVES

Based on our correspondence, we understand that a new fishing pier is planned at Griffy Lake in Bloomington, Indiana. Preliminary plans indicate that the new pier will be constructed into the Griffy Lake reservoir along the west side of North Headley Road. The pier will extend beyond the current shoreline and will consist of a mechanically stabilized earth (MSE) retaining wall needed to vertically elevate the proposed pier fill above the pool elevation of the lake.

The objectives of this preliminary geotechnical engineering investigation will be to generally assess the subsurface conditions within accessible areas of Headley Road on the east side of the project site and to provide recommendations to aid in the design and construction of the proposed project. This proposal is submitted with the understanding that additional geotechnical consulting services beyond the work scope presented herein are recommended during the construction phase of the project once the MSE wall foundation subgrade will be exposed to view.

PROPOSED WORK PLAN

Based on the requested workscope, *Patriot* will drill a total of three (3) borings for this preliminary investigation. Due to site access limitations, borings will be located within Headley Road just east of the proposed pier. Borings will be advanced to a maximum depth of 30 feet or shallower auger refusal materials. It is possible that the fill materials used to construct North Headley Road embankment may contain limestone boulders that will prohibit the proposed soil borings. We estimate that up to 90 linear feet of soil drilling will be conducted at the site. No bedrock coring is proposed for this project.

Patriot will visit the project site prior to drilling to observe and note ground cover, existing structures, pavement, site access and topographic conditions. During this visit, we will locate and mark boring locations. Patriot will be responsible for the "clearing of utilities" within the public domain prior to the start of any subsurface exploration. The "clearing of utilities" outside of the public domain shall be the responsibility of the property owner or manager and coordinated with Patriot.

The typical drilling method will utilize hollow-stem augers to advance the borings to the required depths. Split-spoon samples and Standard Penetration Tests values (commonly referred to as the blow-count or N-value) will be obtained in advance of the augers at intervals of 2.5 feet to a depth of 10 feet, and intervals of 5 feet thereafter per ASTM Method D-1586. Shelby Tube samples may be obtained in cohesive strata of interest. Each boring will be monitored for the presence of ground water during and immediately following the completion of the boring.

After the fieldwork is complete, we will return samples to *Patriot's* laboratory to perform physical analysis and appropriate laboratory testing to define the engineering properties of the site soils. The laboratory testing may include unconfined compressive strengths and natural moisture contents of cohesive soils, and may include Atterberg Limits, consolidation testing, grain size determinations and other tests as requested and applicable. All laboratory testing will be performed in accordance with applicable ASTM methods.

Based on the results of the fieldwork and laboratory testing, we will prepare a Geotechnical Engineering Investigation Report. The report will present all boring and laboratory test data. The report will include recommendations for foundation design/construction and provide a discussion regarding any potential construction difficulties due to soil and groundwater conditions. The report will not include any topographical or bathometric survey data or slope stability analysis. We recommend that a surveyor be retained to determine the underwater topography of the site and this information be shared with *Patriot*. A global stability analysis may be critical for this project depending on encountered soil conditions and slope geometry.

WORK SCHEDULE

The field drilling work should take one (1) day to complete. Typically, completion of laboratory testing and issuance of our report requires 2 to 3 work weeks after completion of the fieldwork.

ESTIMATED PROJECT COST

A cost estimate is provided below for the previously described geotechnical engineering investigation. Work performed outside the scope of work discussed in this proposal will be performed at a unit rate basis for the actual work performed. Such work will be considered a change in scope. The *Client* will be provided with a budget for this work modification for approval and authorization prior to proceeding with this work.

SCOPE OF WORK LIMITATIONS

In preparation of this proposal, we have assumed that the site will allow the use of an ATV-mounted drilling rig for mobility. If "clearing" or "grading" of the site is required, or if additional assistance is needed for rig mobility (excessively soft, muddy), a further charge will be assessed. We request that the client coordinate all required permits and access to the site once we have confirmed a date for drilling.

If the borings reveal inconsistent and/or marginal soil conditions requiring additional borings, perhaps deepening the borings, additional samples, or additional laboratory testing, the Client will be consulted immediately regarding the possibility of modifying the proposed subsurface investigation program. Such a modification may be considered a change in scope of the Proposed Work Plan, thereby requiring a possible adjustment to the budget of this Geotechnical Engineering Investigation. The subsurface investigation outlined in this proposal assumes that there are no hazardous materials in the soil or in the groundwater underlying the site. This investigation is not designed to detect or identify such materials. If it becomes apparent during the field investigation that hazardous materials are present, field operations will temporarily cease. The field investigation could be resumed only after the appropriate health and safety issues are addressed and the scope of our investigation modified to address this change in condition.

It is standard practice in drilling test borings to backfill with the auger cuttings. All available cuttings will be replaced in the borehole and mounded atop the borehole location as applicable. In some instances, mounding the cuttings may not be practical for safety or aesthetics, so the materials will be removed or spread as convenient. Sometimes the backfill will settle after the borings are completed, or the mounded cuttings may not adequately settle, requiring a return trip to backfill again. *Patriot* should be contacted by the client to request this maintenance trip, for which an additional fee will be charged. As an alternative, the holes can be backfilled with bentonite or grout to reduce settlements for an additional fee, or the client may choose to maintain the borehole conditions after our departure.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. SCOPE OF WORK

PATRIOT Engineering and Environmental Inc. (PATRIOT) shall perform the services defined in the attached proposal at the fees stated in the proposal or the attached fee schedule. Any estimate of time and materials shall not be considered as a fixed price, but only an estimate (unless otherwise specifically stated in this contract). *PATRIOT* will provide additional services at the listed standard fees. This offer will be valid for ninety (90) days unless otherwise stated. Upon acceptance, this proposal and associated terms and conditions shall become the contract.

2. RIGHT OF ENTRY

Client grants to *PATRIOT* the right of entry to the project site by its employees, agents, and subcontractors; to perform services, post signage, and represents that it has obtained the needed permits and licenses for the proposed work. If Client does not own the site, Client warrants and represents to *PATRIOT* that it has the authority and permission of the owner and occupant of the site to grant right of entry to *PATRIOT*.

3. PAYMENT TERMS

PATRIOT will submit invoices to the Client throughout the project and a final invoice upon completion of services. There shall be no retainage of fees due and payable to PATRIOT. Payment is due within fourteen (14) days of invoice receipt, regardless of whether the client has been reimbursed by any other party. Client agrees to pay interest of one and one-half percent (1½%) per month, or the maximum rate allowed by law, on past due accounts. Any attorney's fees, collection fees or other costs incurred in collecting any delinquent amount shall be paid by Client.

4. STANDARD OF CARE

The services shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted industry principles and practices, consistent with a level of care and skill ordinarily practiced by reputable members of the profession currently providing similar services under similar circumstances. Except as set forth herein, *PATRIOT* makes no other representation, guarantee, or warranty, express or implied, in fact or by law, whether any merchantability, fitness for any particular purpose or otherwise concerning any of the services which may be furnished by *PATRIOT* to Client. Client agrees to give *PATRIOT* written notice of any breach or default under this section and to give *PATRIOT* a reasonable opportunity to cure such breach or default, without the payment of additional fees to *PATRIOT*, as condition precedent to any claim for damages.

5. INSURANCE AND GENERAL LIABILITY

PATRIOT maintains Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance in compliance with the laws of the state having jurisdiction over the individual employee. PATRIOT has insurance coverage under general liability, property damage, and professional liability, which PATRIOT deems to be adequate. Certificates for such policies of insurance shall be provided to Client upon request. PATRIOT may provide additional insurance coverage beyond stated limits at the Client's request and expense.

6. RISK ALLOCATION

Due to the very limited benefit *PATRIOT* will derive from this project compared to that of other parties involved, including the Client, Client agrees to limit *PATRIOT*'S liability to Client or any other party using or relying on *PATRIOT*'S work with respect to any acts or omissions including, but not limited to, breach of this contract, breach of warranty, negligence, alleged defects in *PATRIOT'S* performance, or other legal theory such that the total aggregate liability of *PATRIOT* to all those named shall not exceed a maximum limit of \$25,000 or *PATRIOT'S* project fee for the services rendered on this project, whichever is less.

7. TERMINATION

Either party may suspend performance immediately upon becoming aware of a breach of the terms of this contract by the other party and provide notice of its intention to terminate. In the event *PATRIOT* determines there may be a significant risk that PATRIOT'S fees may not be paid on a timely basis, PATRIOT may suspend performance and/or retain any reports, work products, or other information until Client provides PATRIOT with adequate assurances of payment. The filing of a voluntary or involuntary bankruptcy petition, appointment of a receiver, assignment for the benefit of creditors or other similar act of insolvency shall constitute a breach. Termination will become effective seven (7) calendar days after receipt of notice by the breaching party unless the event(s) giving rise to the breach are remedied within the timeframe or the party seeking termination revokes its notice. Either party, without cause, may terminate this contract upon providing ten (10) calendar days written notice to the other party.

8. ASSIGNS

This contract may be amended by written instrument, e-mail confirmation, or written confirmation of a verbal agreement, acknowledged or signed by both parties. Client shall not assign this proposal or any reports or information generated as a result of contracted services pursuant to this proposal without written consent of *PATRIOT*.

9. SAFETY

PATRIOT'S responsibility for safety on site shall be limited to its own personnel, subcontractors, and any individuals who are directly involved with PATRIOT'S work on site. This shall not be construed to relieve the Client or any of its contractors from their responsibilities for maintaining a safe jobsite. Neither the professional activities of PATRIOT, nor the presence of PATRIOT'S employees and its subcontractors shall be construed to imply that PATRIOT has any responsibility for any activities on the site, which are performed by personnel other than PATRIOT'S employees or subcontractors.

10. CONFLICTS

Should any element of the Terms and Conditions be deemed in conflict with any element of the proposal/contract, unless the proposal/contract clearly voids the conflicting element in the Terms and Conditions, wording of the Terms and Conditions shall govern. Any element of this agreement later



held to violate a law or regulation shall be deemed void, but all remaining provisions shall continue in force. The Terms and Conditions set forth herein shall survive the termination of this contract. No action, legal or otherwise, may be brought against *PATRIOT* arising from its performance of services under this contract, whether for breach of contract, tort, or otherwise, unless *PATRIOT* shall have received within two (2) years after completion of services under this contract a written notice specifying the alleged defects in *PATRIOT*'S performance or other breach.

11. CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES

In no event shall either party be liable to the other party for any consequential, incidental, or indirect damages including, though not limited to, loss of income, loss of profits, loss or restriction of use of property, or any other business losses regardless as to whether such damages are caused by breach of contract or warranty, negligent acts or omissions, or other wrongful acts.

12. DELAYS IN WORK

PATRIOT will charge the Client at standard fees for stand-by or non-productive time for delays in PATRIOT'S work caused by the Client or Client's contractors unless otherwise specifically provided for in the contract.

13. SAMPLING OR TEST LOCATION(S)

Unless otherwise stated, the fees in this proposal do not include costs associated with surveying of the site for accurate horizontal and vertical locations of tests or samples which, when referenced in PATRIOT'S report, are based on information furnished by others and/or estimates made by PATRIOT'S personnel and are only considered approximations, unless otherwise stated. PATRIOT may deviate a reasonable distance from any test or sampling location as specified by the Client. If, in order to complete a given soil boring to its designated depth, relocating the soil sampling location and associated sampling method is necessitated by encountering impenetrable subsurface objects, all work, including the original work performed, will be charged for at the appropriate rates in the fee schedule. Client recognizes that project site conditions may vary from those encountered at the locations where the borings, surveys, sampling, monitoring, or explorations are made by PATRIOT and its subcontractors, and that the data interpretations and recommendations of PATRIOT'S and its subcontractors are based solely on the information available PATRIOT will only be responsible for data, interpretations, and recommendations based on information obtained from the locations sampled, monitored, and explored by PATRIOT and its subcontractors, but shall not be responsible for the interpretations by others of the information obtained and reported.

14. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Any claim or dispute made against *PATRIOT* for inadequate, negligent, or improper performance of services by *PATRIOT* pursuant to this contract must be resolved by negotiation or mediation. Any party to this contract may demand that any such disputes be resolved by negotiation or mediation, unless the parties mutually agree otherwise. The Client and *PATRIOT* further agree to include similar dispute resolution provisions in all agreements with independent contractors and consultants retained for the project and to require all independent contractors and consultants also to include similar dispute resolution provisions in all agreements with subcontractors, subconsultants, suppliers or fabricators so retained, thereby providing for negotiation or mediation as the

primary method for dispute resolution between the parties to those agreements.

15. FAILURE TO FOLLOW RECOMMENDATIONS

Client will not hold PATRIOT or its subcontractors liable for any consequential, incidental, or indirect damages or business losses that may occur based on, or which may result from PATRIOT'S or its subcontractors' recommendations that are not followed. Client waives any claim against PATRIOT and agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold *PATRIOT* harmless from any claim, liability for injury, or business loss that results from *PATRIOT*'S recommendations that are not followed.

16. FORCE MAJEURE

Neither Client nor *PATRIOT* shall hold the other responsible for damages or delays in performance caused by events beyond the control of the other party and which could not reasonably have been anticipated or prevented, including but not limited to, acts of God, materially different site conditions, wars, riots, rebellions, sabotage, fires, explosions, accidents, floods, strikes or other conceded acts of workers, lockouts, or changes in laws, regulations, or ordinances. The party intending to invoke force majeure shall provide prompt notice to the other party.

17. RIGHT TO STOP OR DIRECT WORK

Since PATRIOT'S duties and services are limited to the scope of work proposed and contracted with the Client to perform, PATRIOT shall not under any circumstances give a stop-work order or direct work, either for quality, safety or any other reason, unless directed solely to PATRIOT personnel or its subcontractors' personnel. Neither shall PATRIOT be responsible for the possible consequences of not issuing a stop-work order. PATRIOT will only report to Client regarding the quality of the work PATRIOT has performed, or been contracted to observe and monitor.

18. FIELD MONITORING AND CONTROL

PATRIOT shall not, except for its own services and for services it subcontracts, specify project site procedures, manage or supervise project work, implement or be responsible for project site health and safety procedures. PATRIOT shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of other parties on the project site and shall not have control or charge of and not be responsible, without limitation, for project means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures. PATRIOT'S project services shall not relieve any other parties from their responsibility for performing work in accordance with applicable plans, specifications, safety requirements, laws, and regulations. PATRIOT'S proposed and contracted monitoring and testing services are limited to its proposed and contracted scope of work and does not imply or warrant that PATRIOT is responsible for observing all activities and personnel at the project site. If PATRIOT is not retained to monitor environmental remediation, mitigation, or abatement activities, Client waives any claim against PATRIOT and agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold PATRIOT harmless for any claim or liability for injury or business loss resulting from remediation, mitigation, or abatement activities

The words "supervision", "inspection", or "control", if used in connection with PATRIOT's work, are only intended to mean periodic observation or monitoring of the project work as outlined in *PATRIOT'S* proposed and contracted scope of work.



19. RETESTING AND RE-MONITORING

PATRIOT is only obligated to monitor and test in accordance with applicable and agreed upon standards and methods. In the event PATRIOT's monitoring and/or testing discloses deficiencies in the project's work, and which consequently will require corrections, PATRIOT will retest or re-monitor the corrected work as required by the plans and specifications or as directed by the Client; however, all such retesting or remonitoring shall be additional work and shall be paid for by Client at the agreed upon fees in this contract.

20. SITE WORK

PATRIOT will take reasonable precautions to avoid any damage to the project site from the activities of its personnel, subcontractors, or equipment. Any damage caused by PATRIOT'S negligence will be restored at PATRIOT'S expense; however, unavoidable damage caused in the execution of the project work such as tire rutting, cutting and splicing of fences, removal of potential asbestos containing materials (ACM), drilling through pavements, cutting of brush and trees, coring through pavements, etc., will not be restored unless otherwise stated in the contract.

21. UTILITIES

In the execution of any subsurface exploration, PATRIOT will take reasonable precautions to avoid damage to subterranean structures or utilities of which PATRIOT has received notification; however, it is the Client's responsibility to mark or furnish the locations of all underground, manmade obstructions or utilities. Client shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless PATRIOT from and against any claims, losses, or damages incurred or asserted against PATRIOT related to Client's failure to mark, protect, inform, or advise PATRIOT of underground structures or utilities, unless stated in our contracted scope of services.

22. SAMPLES

PATRIOT and its subcontractors will retain any soil, rock, water, or material samples obtained in the performance of its contracted scope of work for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days after submitting PATRIOT'S report or findings. Further storage or transfer of samples and materials obtained from the contracted scope of PATRIOT'S work can be made at the Client's expense upon written request.

23. AQUIFER CONTAMINATION

Client waives any claim against PATRIOT, and agrees to hold harmless, defend, and indemnify PATRIOT from any claim, business loss, or liability for injury as a result of cross-contamination caused by subsurface drilling and/or sampling unless due to PATRIOT'S negligence or willful acts.

24. HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

Client agrees to advise PATRIOT, prior to beginning project work, of any hazardous substances on or near the project site known to Client. In the event that test samples obtained during our work contain substances hazardous to health, safety, or the environment, these samples remain the property of Client which also shall pay for all costs connected with decontamination of PATRIOT'S or its subcontractors' equipment. Furthermore, any equipment of PATRIOT'S or its subcontractors' contaminated during PATRIOT's services which cannot be reasonable decontaminated shall become the property and responsibility of Client. Such samples and/or equipment will be delivered to Client. Client agrees to pay transportation costs for samples and equipment, and the fair market value of such contaminated equipment. Client waives

any claim against PATRIOT and its subcontractors and agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless PATRIOT from any claims, business loss, or liability for injury arising from PATRIOT'S failure to detect the presence of hazardous materials, including ACM, through techniques and methods agreed upon in the proposed and contracted scope of work, unless the failure to detect hazardous materials, including ACM, was due to PATRIOT'S failure to properly execute the proposed and contracted scope of work set forth in this contract.

25. ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS

PATRIOT and its subcontractors' duties and responsibilities are limited to the proposed and contracted scope of work. Any sampling, testing, or monitoring of site conditions or materials related to environmental concerns including hazardous waste, soil, ground water, surface water, ACM, or air pollutants are not part of PATRIOT'S responsibilities and duties unless specifically identified in its proposed and contracted scope of work. If it becomes apparent during project site work that undisclosed hazardous materials may be present, project site work will be terminated unless specified in PATRIOT'S proposed and contracted scope of project work. Project site work will resume only after renegotiation of the contracted scope of services and fees to cover appropriate environment, health, and safety precautions. PATRIOT shall have no responsibility for detecting or dealing with environmental concerns, hazardous waste, soil, ground water, surface water, ACM, or air contamination, should they occur at the project site unless specifically outline in PATRIOT'S proposed and contracted scope of work. Client waives any claim against PATRIOT and agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless PATRIOT from any claim, business loss, or liability for injury that results from the discovery of onsite environmental concerns, hazardous materials, soils, ground water, surface water, ACM, or air contamination.

26. ENVIRONMENTAL INDEMNITY

Client agrees to the maximum extent permitted by law to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless PATRIOT and its subcontractors from and against any and all claims and liabilities in connection with toxic or hazardous substances or constituents unless caused by PATRIOT'S negligence or willful acts, resulting from Client's violation of any federal, state or local statute, regulation or ordinance relating to the handling, storage or disposal of toxic or hazardous substances or constituents; Client's undertaking of or arranging for the handing, removal, treatment, storage, transportation or disposal of toxic or hazardous substances or constituents found or identified at the site; toxic or hazardous substances or constituents introduced at the site by Client or third persons before or after completion of services herein; allegations that PATRIOT or its subcontractors are the handlers generators, operators, treaters or storers, transporters, or disposers under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensations and Liability Act, or any other similar federal, state or local regulation or law.

PATRIOT or its subcontractors have no role in generating, treating, storing, or disposing of any hazardous materials which may be present at the project site, and which at no time become the property of PATRIOT or its subcontractors, unless specifically identified in the proposed and contracted scope of work. Client shall evaluate and select proper disposal site for treatment or disposal of its hazardous materials (to include test samples collected to determine the characteristics of the samples), shall select the method of



transportation, and shall be solely responsible therefore. Any arrangements for the treatment, storage, transport, or disposal of any hazardous materials that are made at the direction and expense of Client and to be conducted or completed by PATRIOT shall be construed as being made solely and exclusively on Client's behalf for Client's benefit, and Client shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless PATRIOT from and against any and all claims, damages, business losses, liability of injury, and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, which arise out of any release, threatened release, transportation, or disposal of hazardous materials, unless caused by the negligence or willful acts of PATRIOT during the execution of its proposed and contracted scope of work.

Client agrees to be liable and responsible for the use of unsigned plans, drawings, or other documents not signed by PATRIOT, and waives liability against PATRIOT for their use. Further, client agrees to waive any claim against PATRIOT and to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless PATRIOT from any and all claims arising out of any use, not authorized in writing by PATRIOT, of these documents by third parties not related to this agreement.

28. PUBLIC RESPONSIBILITY

Client shall be responsible for reporting to appropriate governmental and licensing agencies with respect to any legal or regulatory requirements, code violations, or hazardous substances detected on site. If Client disregards PATRIOT'S and its subcontractors' recommendations for reporting or public health and safety, Client waives any claim against PATRIOT and its subcontracts and agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless PATRIOT and its subcontractors from any claim, business loss, liability for injury, or loss arising from disregarding PATRIOT'S or its subcontractors' recommendations of reporting.

29. NON-SOLICITATION

During the term of this Agreement and for (6) six months after any termination of this Agreement, CLIENT will not directly or indirectly solicit, induce, recruit, divert or hire away, encourage, or otherwise endeavor the cause or attempt to cause any employee or consultant of Patriot to terminate their relationship to Patriot.

SUMMER 2019 TREE REMOVALS

This Agreement, entered into on this _____day of July, 2019, by and between the City of Bloomington Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department"), and J.R. Ellington Tree Experts ("Contractor"),

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Department wishes to remove several dead trees in various locations in the City of

Bloomington; and

WHEREAS, the Department requires the services of a professional Contractor in order to perform the tree

removals (the "Services" as further defined below); and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that such Services be undertaken and performed; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is willing and able to provide such Services to the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Article 1. Scope of Services

Contractor shall provide the Services as specified in Exhibit A, "Scope of Work", attached hereto and incorporated into this Agreement. Contractor shall diligently provide the Services under this Agreement and shall complete the Services described in this Agreement in a timely manner consistent with the Standard of Care identified in Article 2. Contractor shall complete the Services required under this Agreement on or before October 1, 2019, unless the parties mutually agree to a later completion date. Completion shall mean completion of all work related to the Services.

In the performance of Contractor's work, Contractor agrees to maintain such coordination with the Department as may be requested and desirable, including primary coordination with Lee Huss as the Department's Project Manager. Contractor agrees that any information or documents, including digital GIS information, supplied by the Department pursuant to Article 3, below, shall be used by Contractor for this project only, and shall not be reused or reassigned for any other purpose without the written permission of the Department.

Article 2. Standard of Care

Contractor shall be responsible for completion of the Services in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances ("Standard of Care"). The Department shall be the sole judge of the adequacy of Contractor's work in meeting the Standard of Care; however, the Department shall not unreasonably withhold its approval as to the adequacy of Contractor's performance. Upon notice to Contractor and by mutual agreement between the parties, Contractor will, without additional compensation, correct or replace any and all Services not meeting the Standard of Care.

Article 3. Responsibilities of the Department

The Department shall provide all necessary information regarding requirements for the Services. The Department shall furnish such information as expeditiously as is necessary for the orderly progress of the work, and Contractor shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness of such information. The Department's Project Manager shall act on its behalf with respect to this Agreement.

Article 4. Compensation

The Department shall pay Contractor for all fees and expenses in an amount not to exceed Eleven Thousand One Hundred Dollars and zero cents (\$11,100.00). Invoices may be sent via first class mail postage prepaid or via email. Payment will be remitted to Contractor within forty-five (45) days of receipt of invoice. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, if funds for the continued fulfillment of this Agreement by the Department are at any time not forthcoming or are insufficient, through failure of any entity, including the Department itself, to appropriate funds or otherwise, then the Department shall have the right to terminate this Agreement without penalty.

Article 6. Schedule

Article 8. Identity of the Contractor

Contractor acknowledges that one of the primary reasons for its selection by the Department to perform the Services is the qualifications and experience of Contractor. It is recognized, however, that neither Contractor nor the Department has control over the cost of labor, materials or equipment, over contractors' method of determining costs for services, or over competitive bidding, market or negotiating conditions. Accordingly, Department cannot and does not warrant or represent that the proposals or construction bids received will not vary from the cost estimates provided pursuant to this Agreement.

Article 10. Reuse of Instruments of Service

All documents, including but not limited to, drawings, specifications and computer software prepared by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement are instruments of service in respect to this project. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by the Department or others on modifications or extensions of this project or on any other project. The Department may elect to reuse such documents; however any reuse or modification without prior written authorization of Contractor will be at the Department's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Contractor. The Department shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Contractor against all judgments, losses, claims, damages, injuries and expenses arising out of or resulting from such unauthorized reuse or modification.

Article 11. Ownership of Documents and Intellectual Property

All documents, drawings and specifications, including digital format files, prepared by Contractor and furnished to the Department as part of the Services shall become the property of the Department. Contractor shall retain its ownership rights in its design, drawing details, specifications, databases, computer software and other proprietary property. Intellectual property developed, utilized or modified in the performance of the Services shall remain the property of Contractor.

Article 12. Independent Contractor Status

During the entire term of this Agreement, Contractor shall be an independent contractor, and in no event shall any of its personnel, agents or sub-contractors be construed to be, or represent themselves to be, employees of the Department. Contractor shall be solely responsible for the payment and reporting of all employee and employer taxes, including social security, unemployment, and any other federal, state, or local taxes required to be withheld from employees or payable on behalf of employees.

Article 13. Indemnification

Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Bloomington, the Department, and the officers, agents and employees of the City and the Department from any and all claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses or other liability arising out of the Agreement or occasioned by the reckless or negligent performance of any provision thereof, including, but not limited to, any reckless or negligent act or failure to act or any misconduct on the part of the Contractor or its agents or employees, or any independent contractors directly responsible to it (collectively "Claims").

Article 14. Insurance

During the performance of any and all Services under this Agreement, Contractor shall maintain the following insurance in full force and effect:

- a. General Liability Insurance, with a minimum combined single limit of \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate.
- b. Automobile Liability Insurance, with a minimum combined single limit of \$1,000,000 for each person and \$1,000,000 for each accident.

- c. Professional Liability Insurance ("Errors and Omissions Insurance") with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 annual aggregate.
- d. Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with the statutory requirements of Title 22 of the Indiana Code.

All insurance policies shall be issued by an insurance company authorized to issue such insurance in the State of Indiana. The City of Bloomington, the Department, and the officers, employees and agents of each shall be named as insureds under the General Liability, Automobile, and Worker's Compensation policies, and such policies shall stipulate that the insurance will operate as primary insurance and that no other insurance of the City's will be called upon to contribute to a loss hereunder.

Contractor shall provide evidence of each insurance policy to the Department prior to the commencement of work under this Agreement. Approval of the insurance by the Department shall not relieve or decrease the extent to which Contractor may be held responsible for payment of damages resulting from Contractor's provision of the Services or its operations under this Agreement. If Contractor fails or refuses to procure or maintain the insurance required by these provisions, or fails or refuses to furnish the Department's required proof that the insurance has been procured and is in force and paid for, the Department shall have the right at its election to terminate the Agreement.

Article 15. Conflict of Interest

Contractor declares that it has no present interest, nor shall it acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict with the performance of Services under this Agreement. Contractor agrees that no person having any such interest shall be employed in the performance of this Agreement.

Article 16. Waiver

No failure of either party to enforce a term of this Agreement against the other shall be construed as a waiver of that term, nor shall it in any way affect the party's right to enforce that term. No waiver by any party of any term of this Agreement shall be considered to be a waiver of any other term or breach thereof.

Article 17. Severability

If the Contractor or subcontractor verified the work eligibility status of the employee in question through the E-Verify program, there is a rebuttable presumption that the Contractor or subcontractor did not knowingly employ an unauthorized alien. If the Contractor or subcontractor fails to remedy the violation within the 30 day period, the City shall terminate the contract, unless the City Commission or department that entered into the contract determines that terminating the contract would be detrimental to the public interest or public property, in which case the City may allow the contract to remain in effect until the City procures a new Contractor. If the City terminates the contract, the Contractor or subcontractor is liable to the City for actual damages.

Contractor shall require any subcontractors performing work under this contract to certify to the Contractor that, at the time of certification, the subcontractor does not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien and the subcontractor has enrolled in and is participating in the E-Verify program. Contractor shall maintain on file all subcontractors' certifications throughout the term of the contract with the City.

Article 24. Notices

WELDING, LLC

Recommendation

Staff recommends the review/approval of a Mid-Service Contract with Miller Welding, LLC. The Contractor will fabricate, weld and install an aluminum arch for the entrance of Rose Hill Cemetery. The arch will be supported by two new 4"x 4" aluminum posts - will measure 21' wide and be fabricated of 3/8" aluminum plate 16" tall with 12" letters cut into the arch and wrapped with aluminum pipe. The center of the arch will be approximately 15' above the road. The cost of the arch is \$10,600 and will be funded through a Redevelopment Commission Neighborhood Improvement Grant. (101-15-151000-53960)

Background

For several years, Barb Dunbar has been working closely with the Prospect Hill Neighborhood Association (PHNA), to assist them with the applications of Neighborhood Grants funded through the City's Redevelopment Commission. A 2018 grant was awarded which funded a bronze historical marker highlighting the Old Spencer Addition and a heavy-duty steel bench installed in the SW portion of the Cemetery. In addition, the PHNA conducted (3) headstone restoration workshops in partnership with the Monroe County History Center as part of their volunteer requirements for the grant.

This year the PHNA and Parks staff went for a larger grant sum to fund a new arch entry sign and replacement of the six concrete caps on the pillars at the entrance which are chipping and

cracking. The PHNA was, once again, successful in receiving grant funding for these two projects which will significantly improve the aesthetics at the entrance of Rose Hill Cemetery.

In addition, the PHNA will again, conduct (2) headstone restoration workshops in partnership with the Monroe County History Center as part of their volunteer requirements for the grant. One workshop took place on Saturday, June 1st. Twelve stones were restored.

The current sign, we believe, was installed in 1983. Parks Department staff will remove the old piping and the bronze sign will be taken to a sign company to have restored in hopes of using the plaque in another location of the cemetery.

The nonperforming party shall have fourteen (14) calendar days from the receipt of the termination notice to cure or to submit a plan for cure acceptable to the other party.

The Department may terminate or suspend performance of this Agreement at the Department's prerogative at any time upon written notice to Contractor. Contractor shall terminate or suspend performance of the Services on a schedule acceptable to the Department and the Department shall pay the Contractor for all the Services performed up to the date that written notice is received, plus reasonable termination or suspension expenses. Recommendation

The Contractor will remove and replace the six (6) existing concrete caps using 4000 p.s.i. reinforced concrete to include proper fall and drip edge and apply commercial grade concrete sealer. The cost of the masonry work is \$8,850 and will be funded through the same Redevelopment Commission Neighborhood Improvement Grant as that of the arch entry sign. (101-15-151000-53960)

Recommendation

This Agreement, entered into on this ____day of ______, 2019, by and between the City of Bloomington Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department"), and Ronnie G. Pursell ("Contractor"), WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Department wishes to perform monument repairs at Rose Hill and White Oak Cemeteries; and

WHEREAS, the Department requires the services of a professional Contractor in order to perform said services (the "Services" as further defined below); and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that such Services be undertaken and performed; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Contractor is willing and able to provide such Services to the Department.

Article 1. Scope of Services

WHEREAS,

Contractor shall provide the Services as specified in Exhibit A, "Scope of Work", attached hereto and incorporated into this Agreement. Contractor shall diligently provide the Services under this Agreement and shall complete the Services described in this Agreement in a timely manner consistent with the Standard of Care identified in Article 2. Contractor shall complete the Services required under this Agreement on or before December 31, 2019, unless the parties mutually agree to a later completion date. Completion shall mean completion of all work related to the Services.

SUBJECT: REVIEW/APPROVAL OF UTILITY EASEMENTS FOR SWITCHYARD PARK

Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of utility easements for City of Bloomington Utilities (water, sanitary sewer), Vectren (natural gas) and Smithville (fiber optic) to serve Switchyard Park.

Background

Limited space was available to route new utility services into Switchyard Park, resulting in the development of a shared use easement for fiber optic cable and City water and sanitary sewer piping having to share a common trench in some locations. Natural gas service by Vectren will have a separate utility easement. Purpose and Scope

The following UAV Policy applies to all City Departments, employees and City contractors participating in the City's UAV program.

The City of Bloomington ("City") is dedicated to embracing technologies that help improve its services while protecting the privacy and safety of its residents. The use of UAVs in the public interest is expected to benefit residents and visitors to the City through the more efficient use of City resources. The term "UAV" means an unoccupied aircraft flown via a ground control system, or autonomously through use of an on-board computer, communication links or any other additional equipment.¹

This UAV Policy ("Policy") is intended to guide users of UAVs owned by the City or operated on behalf of the City. This Policy is subject to a one-year evaluation period. After the evaluation period, representatives from the Mayor's Office, Legal/Risk and Information & Technology Services (ITS) will review the UAV programs of all participating departments and provide recommendations on revisions to this Policy, as necessary.

Policy Statement

This policy must be reviewed and signed by all UAV operators in participating departments and by any individuals with access to UAV data that may contain Personal Identifiable Information. Engaging in the unauthorized use of UAVs or activities that are inconsistent with this Policy may subject an employee to discipline, up to and including termination of employment as well as applicable monetary fines and penalties. A contractor who operates a UAV on behalf of the City in violation of this policy may be found to have materially breached its contract and may also be subject to applicable monetary fines and penalties.

Participating Departments may adopt their own standard operating guidelines and

general orders that reflect the requirements iterated in this document. Operators shall comply with all applicable laws, including not using UAVs to interfere with law enforcement or first responders and not using UAVs for any illegal, harassing or invasive purpose.

Authorized Use Cases

The authorized use of UAVs is limited to the following Departments and uses:

Authorized Departments

Police, Fire, Utilities, Public Works, Parks and Recreation, Planning & Transportation, Mayor's Office, Information & Technology Services, HAND, ESD, Legal/Risk.

Authorized Use Cases

Construction Management

• Inspection of project sites for contract and environmental compliance.

Disaster Response and Recovery

• Inspection of properties, facilities, and assets during and after disasters; Damage assessment & District surveys.

Environmental Monitoring and Documentation

- Vegetation type and health, wildlife, streams/reservoirs.
- Flora and fauna type and health, spills and leaks, erosion.

Emergency Response

Building Fire and Post-Fire Reconnaissance.

Inspections

- Surveys and assessments of City properties, facilities, and assets.
- Surveys and assessments of development sites, road improvements, traffic conditions and erosion control.
- Surveys and assessments for code compliance.
- Risk-related surveys, assessments, and audits.
- Traffic conditions assessment and management.

Mapping

- Aerial photography for feature mapping, land use mapping, geospatial analysis, digital elevation models, contours & 3D Models.
- Accident Reconstruction.

Marketing and Documentation

Capture videos and still photographs.

Search & Rescue

Aerial UAVs.

Training

Preplanning, assessment and evaluation of emergency response operations.

Law Enforcement and Warrants

- Crime scene documentation.
- For any purpose for which a court has issued a warrant.

Requirements

The privacy and safety of Bloomington residents, businesses, and visitors are the top priorities of this Policy.

Every operator of a City UAV must have completed an FAA approved training program and must have a current remote pilot certificate with a sUAV (small Unmanned Aircraft System) rating issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) before operating a City UAV. The operator must file a copy of the certificate with the City's Information and Technology Services Department (ITS), and must have the certificate easily accessible whenever operating a City UAV. The City retains the right to require additional training to make operators aware of changes in policy, legal requirements or equipment.

To review Federal Aviation Authority (FAA) requirements for the registration and use of UAVs by the City, please refer to: https://www.faa.gov/uas/.

Specifications and Testing

Each City UAV must have a global positioning system. The software and/or firmware used to operate the UAV must be up to date and maintained.

Before operating a City UAV, the operator must conduct a thorough check of the UAV in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions, making sure that it is airworthy, including insuring that it has sufficient power, that the links are functioning, that any object connected to the UAV is securely connected, etc. If the operator finds any safety-related issue, the operator shall not fly the UAV and shall report the issue to ITS.

Requirements and Prohibitions

The following provisions are derived from FAA guidelines and reiterated here. While every effort will be made to keep this policy current, it is the operator's responsibility to keep informed of changes to FAA guidelines and to comply fully with them.

 Unless the operator has a Part 107 FAA certificate, the operator may not fly higher than 400 feet when in uncontrolled or Class G airspace, except as permitted below.

- Operators may not fly in controlled airspace without written FAA authorization appropriate to their certification. Controlled airspace currently includes any area within four miles of the Monroe County Airport.
- Operators shall not fly UAVs, or conduct surveillance or photograph people, in areas where there is a reasonable expectation of privacy.
- Operators may not fly UAVs directly over people who are not under a safe cover, except for people involved with the operations of the UAV.
- Operators shall keep UAVs in view.
- Operators shall yield to manned aircraft.
- Operators shall not fly UAVs in any adverse weather conditions, such as high winds or reduced visibility.
- Operators shall not fly UAVs when visibility is less than three miles.
- Operators shall not fly UAVs faster than ground speed of 87 knots.
- Operators shall not fly UAVs higher than 400 feet above ground level, unless the UAV is being flown within a 400-foot radius of a structure, and then not higher than 400 feet above the structure's immediate uppermost limit.
- Operators shall fly UAVs only during daylight hours, beginning no earlier than 30 minutes before sunrise and ending no later than 30 minutes after sunset.
- Operators shall immediately report any problems concerning flights of City UAVs, including damage to the vehicle or to other property or to people, and complaints about UAV usage from members of the public, to the City's Legal Risk Management division.

However, where the City or an eligible Department obtains a waiver from the FAA, it may deviate from the above-listed requirements to the extent permitted by the waiver.

Privacy, Data Security and Retention

Departments must have an authorized purpose to collect information using a UAV or use UAV-collected information.

The City is required to retain the raw, unprocessed UAV data for thirty days pursuant to rules established by the Indiana Archives and Records Administration. Raw, unprocessed data will be discarded after thirty days. The City will restrict access to any raw UAV footage it retains to authorized staff. Departments may not exchange raw, unprocessed UAV-collected data with other departments or disclose such data to the public except for (1) exigent public safety needs, (2) with the approval of ITS, or (3) as required by law. Operators shall download all UAV data at the completion of each flight, along with the date, time and location of the flight and the name of the operator(s). All

such data are the sole property of the City and may not be used by City employees or any other persons for any non-City purpose.

UAV data shall include, but are not limited to, video footage, audio footage, still images, sensor data, geospatial location data, metadata and other digital files. Personal Identified information (PII) shown in UAV data will be obscured before such data is made public.

Definitions

Personal Identifiable Information (PII)

Information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual's identity, either alone or when combined with other personal or identifying information that is linked or linkable to a specific individual.

Raw UAV Data

Information collected by a City UAV that has not been processed. The distribution and use of raw UAV data is tightly restricted.

Questions

Questions regarding this policy should be directed to the employee's supervisor or to ITS. Questions about applicable laws governing the use of UAVs or issues related to privacy should be directed to the Legal Department.

Compliance

A City employee who operates a City UAV in violation of this policy or in violation of applicable laws and regulations governing the operation of UAVs shall be subject to discipline, up to and including termination.

All City UAV operators must submit flight logs and documentation no more than 72 hours after the conclusion of flight activities to the City's Open Data Portal using the Flight Information Log Form: https://goo.gl/forms/R09cSWIYQVVnNqK13

Policy Signature

This policy and any derived department policy must be reviewed and signed by all UAV operators in participating departments and by any individuals with access to UAV data that may contain Personal Identifiable Information.

By signing below, I acknowledge that I have read this policy and that I understand its terms. I acknowledge that if I violate this policy, I will be subject to discipline under the City's Personnel Manual and, if applicable, under a union contract.

So You Wanna Fly a City of Bloomington UAV (drone)?

Follow these steps to fly a City of Bloomington UAV.

Get Certified. Before you can fly a City UAV, you must complete FAA's remote pilot certificate (see
https://www.faa.gov/uas/commercial_operators/become_a_drone_pilot/). NOTE: It can take a few months of studying before you are ready to take the test. Depending on how critical it is that you become a UAV pilot, your department may allow you time to study and contribute to the cost of taking the exam; ask your supervisor for more
information.
Go to the Legal Department's Risk Division. You must visit Risk in person. Sign the policy, show them your City picture ID badge, and give them your certificate. They will verify it and let you know when you are clear to reserve a City UAV.
Reserve a City UAV. Risk will send your approval by email. Once approved, you will have access to see UAVs available for check-out in your Google Calendar. Reserve a UAV just like you would reserve a conference room.
Go get your City UAV. Go to ITS and let them know you reserved a UAV. Show them your City of Bloomington picture ID badge and get your City UAV.
Fly your UAV. Make sure you do your pre-flight checks and notify the Airport Tower (how? AirMap? Phone Call?) before setting off.
Do your post-flight work. Once you have completed your flight, please note anything that went wrong or any damage sustained and submit your flight log (where? How?).
Return the UAV. Go back to ITS and bring your City UAV. Hand the UAV to an ITS staff member. If there is no one available, do not leave the UAV there; please go back at a different time when someone is physically there to check in the UAV with you. Note that if you return a UAV that is damaged three times, your ability to reserve UAVs in the future may be denied.
