 - (1) Martin reported that the UPWP has a few final processes needing to be completed before the new Fiscal Year begins in July.

 - (1) Martin reported that he expects the TIP to be approved by INDOT by the beginning of the new (2020) Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2019.
 - c. SR45 Corridor SR45 Bypass to Russell Road Status Update
 - (1) Martin reported that the MPO sent the Monroe County Board of Commissioners' letter to INDOT and further MPO correspondence echoed the concerns expressed in the Commissioners' letter. INDOT responded meticulously to all issues raised in the letter which was sent back to Martin and Thomas and immediately sent to the Policy Committee. Additionally, BMCMPO staff further researched conditions of the corridor with regard to traffic volumes, crash history, turning movements, and overall condition.
 - (a) Thomas expressed disappointment with the response from INDOT with regard to the Monroe County Board of Commissioners' and BMCMPO letter and is wondering

- what a potential time frame might look like for potential projects. Ude mentioned that it is hard to know as of right now based on state funding and project scoring.
- (2) Ude mentioned that the potential for an INDOT project concerning the SR45 Corridor has been submitted to INDOT, and it is possible we could find out by the end of summer if this project has been selected by INDOT's Asset Committee. If it is selected, the project will come to the BMCMPO, along with all budgets, phases, and production schedules to be included within the TIP. Discussion ensued.

VIII. Communications from Committee Members (*non-agenda/non-voting items*)

a. Public comment by Scott Faris about SR 45 corridor. Faris was wondering why past project ideas for this corridor fell through due to local opposition. Wason clarified the reasons why a similar project from seven years ago did not move along further through the transportation planning process by noting that it had a lot to do with the historical nature of properties along this corridor and concern from local opposition groups. Martin confirmed this assessment. *Five minute public comment limit exceeded, but discussion ensued.*

[Faris continues to speak on matters of the SR45 corridor. Ude mentions that there were separate projects along this corridor but none were able to move forward because of numerous issues and public opposition. Ryterband tells Faris that the previous project also did not move forward because the project itself was inadequate and did not contain many aspects of a safe roadway and the project did not consider all users of the thoroughfare. Ryterband eludes to the BMCMPO Complete Streets Policy adopted by the Policy Committee in 2009 as a reason why these potential projects did not have merit to proceed. Faris requests the Policy Committee send a letter back to the INDOT Commissioners asking why a previous project on this corridor was removed due to local opposition. Faris says, "Send out a letter at a very senior level, this group, back up to the INDOT Commissioner making the case, and if in fact, and I'd even make the reference back to this case study because obviously there was something there on

why they stopped, and if they did stop because of inadequate planning, or your assessment of inadequate planning, because there weren't sidewalks, pathways, bicycles, et cetera, then you should take and elaborate on that." Clements *motioned* "to approve and enact Faris' recommendation as stated." "Seconded" by Wiltz. Ridge paraphrases the "motion" to be "A letter to be sent back to Mr. McGuinness, INDOT Commissioner, from the MPO board concerning the case study that's represented in their letter." *Motion* "passes" 4 (Y), 1 (N), 6 (A). Based on the BMCMPO Bylaws, the motion failed to pass because it did not receive a majority vote. This will be discussed at the Policy Committee meeting on 9/13/2019 for further review.

Faris offers his perceptions on ambulance routes to the future IU Health Bloomington facility. Faris goes on to recommend "that you take an action to have IU Health come explain those things." Clements *motioned* to "approve Mr. Faris' recommendation that we have IU Health come and make a presentation to the MPO 'planning committee' about traffic issues involving the hospital development." "Seconded" by Wiltz. Due to Faris' very long recommendation, Ridge is unsure what Clements' "motion" is at this point and paraphrases the "motion" to be: "recommend IU Health representative attend the next MPO Policy Committee meeting to discuss the emergency routes to new hospital." *Motion* "passes" 5 (Y), 0 (N), 6 (A). *Based on the BMCMPO Bylaws, the motion failed to pass because it did not receive a majority vote.* This will be discussed at the Policy Committee meeting on 9/13/2019 for further review.

Faris goes on to discuss how we can address additional safety concerns. Ryterband explains to Faris that SR45 and the other roads going by the hospital are not within the jurisdiction of the BMCMPO and that the role of an MPO is to be a granting organization to local public agencies, not one that creates projects. Ridge confirms that the Policy Committee takes safety very seriously; however, it cannot plan INDOT's projects for them as they plan for projects decades in the future. Ridge says that we cannot require IU Health to come speak to the Policy Committee. Faris goes on to further discuss INDOT roadways that do not lie within the BMCMPO Metropolitan Planning Area or its jurisdiction. Thomas mentions that the Policy Committee has done as much as it can with regard to this issue, and that all we can do is ask, and that we have already asked, and that the concerns about this corridor have been received. Clements thanks Thomas and Martin for their involvement and initiative in contacting INDOT.]

BACKGROUND

Federal legislation requires the establishment of a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) in urban areas where the population exceeds 50,000 people to conduct transportation planning. The basic objective of an MPO is to encourage and to promote the development of transportation systems, embrace multiple modes of transportation, and to minimize transportation related fuel consumption and air pollution.

Indiana Governor Robert D. Orr designated the City of Bloomington Plan Commission as the MPO for the Bloomington urban area on March 4, 1982.

Locally, the Bloomington—Monroe County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPOBMCMPO) fulfills the MPO mission as an intergovernmental transportation policy group that manages transportation project funding for the Bloomington—Monroe County Urbanized Area (which includes the local public agencies (LPAs) of the City of Bloomington, the Town of Ellettsville, and portions of Monroe County)—The Bloomington—Monroe County Transit, Rural Transit, and Indiana University Campus Bus). The MPO is responsible for ensuring that the transportation planning program in the Urbanized Area incorporates consultation, cooperation, and coordination between the MPO, various civic organizations, and the public. All MPO decisions are endorsed by a Policy Committee upon the recommendation of both the Technical Advisory Committee and the Citizens Advisory Committee.

The Policy Committee (PC) consists of municipal and county elected officials, non-elected members, membership from the Bloomington Public Transportation Corporation, Indiana University, Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT), and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). The Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) includes state and local planners, engineers, transit operators and other transportation-related professionals. The Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) represents a broad cross-section of Bloomington-and Monroe County citizen and community interests.

The public is actively encouraged to attend MPO meetings and to be involved in the transportation planning process. Meeting agendas for each of the three MPO committees are published online at www.bloomington.in.gov/mpo.

PREAMBLE

The following constitutes the bylaws, procedures, and responsibilities which shall serve to establish, organize, and guide the proper functioning of the Bloomington—Monroe County Metropolitan Planning Organization.

This organization shall be responsible for fulfilling the requirements of the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1962, as amended, the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, and other subsequent laws setting forth requirements for transportation planning for all modes of travel. This responsibility shall be accomplished within a cooperative framework properly related to comprehensive planning on a continual basis. This organization shall also carry out any other transportation planning and programming functions as set forth in any agreements entered into by this process and the Indiana Department of Transportation, the U.S. Department of Transportation or in such manner as events shall dictate.



CHAPTER 1: GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1 Organization Name

The name for the Metropolitan Planning Organization is the Bloomington—Monroe County Metropolitan Planning Organization. It may also be Previously, it has been referred to as the Bloomington Area Transportation Study.

1.2 Organizational Structure

The Metropolitan Planning Organization structure shall consist of three committees:

- 1. Policy Committee (PC);
- 2. Technical Advisory Committee (TAC+); and the
- 3. Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC).

1.3 MPO Staff Designation

A. Staff: The following staff members of Tthe City of Bloomington Planning and Transportation Department shall be the staff for the Bloomington-Monroe County Metropolitan Planning Organization. These staff include the Planning Services Manager, Senior Transportation Planner, Transportation Planner, Bicycle and Pedestrian Coordinator, Planning Technician, and Administrative Assistant.

B. Executive Secretary: The City of Bloomington Planning and Transportation Department Director, the Senior Transportation Planner, and/or their Director's designee shall serve as the BMCMPO Executive Secretary on behalf of the MPO as designated by the State of Indiana.

1.4 Policies

- A. **Applicability:** All transportation policies shall apply to all committees and participants of the Bloomington—Monroe County Metropolitan Planning Organization.
- B. Committee Review: The Citizens Advisory Committee and the Technical Advisory Committee shall be afforded sufficient time to comment on drafts prior to action by the Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Committee.
- C. Adoption: Reports, programs, and plans become official process documents following adoption by resolution of the Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Committee.
- D. Multimodal Consideration: All MPO committees shall proceed with their respective responsibilities and duties with proper consideration at all times, for all modes of transportation and associated facilities.
- E. Coordination: All studies undertaken by the MPO shall be coordinated with individual modal planning programs and with comprehensive planning efforts in the urban area.

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- F. Efficient Development: Transportation planning activities shall be used to promote efficient urban development. Reasonable forecasts of land use and socioeconomic conditions shall be made to guide these activities.
- G. Open Meetings: All meetings of the Policy Committee, the Technical Advisory Committee, and the Citizens Advisory Committee, shall be open to the public.
- H. Publications: All published data and/or reports shall be made available to the public and stakeholder agencies.

1.5 Procedures

- A. Rules of Order: The rules of order herein contained shall govern deliberations and meetings of all MPO Committees. Any point of order applicable to the deliberations of the Committees and not contained herein shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.
- B. **Voting:** All MPO Committee votes shall be by voice vote; however, upon the request of at least one (1) voting member, a roll call vote shall be taken. Unless specified otherwise in these Bylaws, all motions before MPO Committees shall be decided by a majority vote. In the event of a tie vote, the motion before the Committee shall fail.
- C. Scheduling: All MPO Committee meetings shall be scheduled by the MPO Staff.
- D. Meeting Notice: At least five (5) days notice shall be provided for all MPO Committee meetings.
 - Agenda: A proposed agenda shall be provided to ensure adequate preparation.
 Such agenda shall include the date, time and location of the Committee meeting.
 - 2. <u>Delivery:</u> The notice, agenda, minutes, and other Committee meeting materials may be delivered electronically.
- E. Meeting Cancellation: At the discretion of the City of Bloomington Planning Department Director Executive Secretary and the approval of the Chair of the Committee, a regularly scheduled MPO Committee meeting can be canceled. Notification of the cancellation shall be made at least three (3) days prior to the date of the scheduled meeting.
- F. Committee Chair Participation: During and MPO Committee meeting, the Chair of the Committee may make motions and debate policy items, and shall not be deprived of any rights and privileges of a member by reason of acting as the presiding officer.

1.6 Amendment of Bylaws

- A. Process: Amendments to the MPO Bylaws shall be made according to the following process:
 - Committee Review: Proposed bylaws amendments shall be placed on the agendas of the next available Technical Advisory Committee and Citizens Advisory Committee meetings. The Policy Committee shall not take action on



- proposed amendments before the TAC and CAC have the opportunity to review and comment on such proposals.
- Notice: MPO Staff shall include the proposed bylaws amendment, specifying the exact form of the amendment, in the public notice for any MPO Committee meeting at which the proposal will be reviewed.
- 3. <u>Policy Committee Action:</u> After receiving input from the TAC and CAC, the Policy Committee may vote on the proposed bylaws amendment. Amendments shall become effective upon a positive vote of 2/3 of the voting members of the Policy Committee.
- B. **Staff Role:** The MPO staff shall be responsible for drafting proposed amendments for consideration by the Policy Committee.



CHAPTER 2: POLICY COMMITTEE

2.1 Purpose

The purpose of the <u>Bloomington-Monroe County</u> Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Committee shall be to serve the Bloomington—Monroe County <u>metropolitan areaMetropolitan Planning Area (MPA)</u> as the official decision making body for transportation planning matters.

2.2 Responsibilities

The responsibilities of the Policy Committee shall be as follows:

- A. To give overall guidance for the transportation planning process;
- B. To have overall responsibility for review and approval of all plans and programs which are developed by the transportation planning process;
- C. To organize membership of the Technical Advisory Committee;
- D. To encourage membership and participation in the Citizens Advisory Committee;
- To take official action on committee recommendations and other matters pertaining to furthering the transportation planning process;
- To adopt transportation goals and objectives to guide the transportation planning process;
- G. To adopt the annual Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), the Long-Range Transportation Plan₇ (LRTP), and other plans and reports;
- H. To submit plans and recommendations to participating agencies and obtain resolutions for adoption from governing agencies;
- To establish a transportation study area boundary, also known as the Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA);
- J. To change the designated membership as deemed necessary; and
- K. To ensure that citizen participation is achieved in the transportation planning process.

- 12. Chair, **BMC**MPO Citizens Advisory Committee
- 13. Deputy Commissioner Director, INDOT Seymour District
- Indiana Division Administrator, Federal Highway Administration FHWA, Indiana Division (Non-Voting)
- Regional Administrator Region 5, Federal Transit Administration FTA, Region V-(Non-Voting)
- B. Alternate Representation: If the designated Policy Committee representative for a board, commission, institution, or other organization is unable to serve on the Policy Committee, an alternate representative may be appointed by the same board, commission, institution, or organization to serve the term of the regular designee. In such cases, the regular designee shall not be required to submit a proxy statement for each meeting that the alternate representative attends.
- C. **Terms:** The voting members of the Policy Committee shall serve terms on the Committee that coincide with the terms of their respective offices.
- D. **Proxy:** Each voting member of the Policy Committee may name a proxy in writing for a particular meeting or vote.
 - Representation: The proxy shall be from the same agency, jurisdiction, or organization which the member represents.
 - 2. Powers: The proxy's powers shall be delineated in the written notice.
 - 3. <u>Notification:</u> The member shall be responsible for notifying the proxy of meetings, and once confirmed, notify MPO staff of the proxy representation.
 - 4. <u>Committee Chair Proxy:</u> If the Chair of the Policy Committee is absent, then the Vice-Chair shall conduct the meeting, even if the Chair designates a proxy.
- E. Additional Appointments: Additional appointments to, or changes in the composition of, the Policy Committee shall require an amendment to these Bylaws as outlined in Section 1.6. Any Policy Committee membership changes shall be made in consultation with the Indiana Department of Transportation, the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration.

2.4 Officers

A. Officers: The Policy Committee shall elect the following officers:

- 2. Vice-Chair
- B. **Eligibility:** Officers of the Policy Committee shall be chosen from the voting members of the Policy Committee.
- C. Elections: Election of officers shall occur in Januaryat the first Policy Committee meeting of each calendar year. Elections for all officers shall be by majority vote.
- D. **Duties:** The duties of the elected officers of the Policy Committee shall be as follows:
 - 1. Chair
 - a. Preside over the meetings of the Policy Committee.
 - 2. Vice-Chair
 - a. In the absence of the Policy Committee Chair, to preside over the meetings of the Policy Committee.

2.5 Meeting Procedure

 - <u>Rescheduling:</u> If a quorum is not present, those present may tentatively reschedule the meeting to another day when a quorum can be obtained.
- B. Schedule: Meetings of the Policy Committee shall be open to the public and be held on a bimonthly basis or monthly on the second Friday of each month except for theduring the months of month of the summer recess and winter recessJuly and December. Our as needed for special business.
- C. **Special Votes:** The Chair of the Policy Committee may request a mail, fax, or e-mail vote on issues already presented at previous meetings.
 - <u>Limitations:</u> This practice will be used only if Federal and/or State imposed deadlines are an issue or if the vote is necessitated due to the urgency of a local, State, or Federal project.
 - Committee Report: A mail, fax, or e-mail vote will be presented at the next scheduled Policy Committee meeting as part of the previous meeting minutes.

CHAPTER 3: TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

 - Committee Chair Proxy: If the Chair of the Technical Advisory Committee is absent and designates a proxy, then the Vice-Chair shall conduct the meeting even if the Chair designates a proxy.
- E. Additional Appointments: Additional appointments to, or changes in the composition of, the Technical Advisory Committee shall require an amendment to



these Bylaws as outlined in Section 1.6. Any Technical Advisory Committee membership changes shall be made in consultation with the Indiana Department of Transportation, the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration.

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CHAPTER 4: CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

4.1 Purpose

The purpose of the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) is to serve as the formal means through which active citizen participation provides the Policy Committee with public input on official decision making for transportation planning matters.

4.2 Responsibilities

The responsibilities of the Citizens Advisory Committee shall be:

- A. To foster and develop citizen awareness and understanding regarding transportation policy and planning;
- B. To promote necessary interaction between citizens and the Policy Committee, the Technical Advisory Committee, and the Metropolitan Planning Organization staff; and
- C. To keep the Policy Committee, the Technical Advisory Committee, and the Metropolitan Planning Organization staff apprised of current and emerging citizen concerns in relation to transportation issues within the urban area.

4.3 Membership

A. Members: The membership of the Citizens Advisory Committee shall be comprised of citizens of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County and the Town of Ellettsville. Key stakeholder groups, agencies and organizations from each community should also be represented. The following groups, as well as others that may not be listed, are strongly encouraged to send a representative to participate in the Citizens Advisory Committee.

Such registration shall include contact information (mailing address, phone number, email address, etc.) as well as indicate whether the member has been designated as an official representative of a community organization or agency.
- D. Voting Privileges: Citizens Advisory Committee members shall attend three (3) consecutive Committee meetings before they are eligible to vote on Committee business. Members may vote on Committee business as of the third consecutive meeting they attend.
- E. **Revocation of Voting Privileges:** Citizens Advisory Committee members who miss three consecutive meetings may have their voting privileges revoked with concurrence from the Chair and Vice-Chair. Exceptions may be made if the Committee member can demonstrate extenuating circumstances. A Committee member whose voting privileges have been revoked shall be required to follow the process outlined in 4.3(D) to regain voting status.



4.4 Officers

 - Set the Agenda for Citizens Advisory Committee meetings, in consultation with the Vice-Chair and the MPO Staff.
 - c. Attend meetings of the Policy Committee as a voting member.
 - 2. Vice-Chair
 - In the absence of the Committee Chair, to preside over the meetings of the Citizens Advisory Committee.
 - b. Set the Agenda for Citizens Advisory Committee meetings, in consultation with the Chair and the MPO Staff.
 - c. Attend meetings of the Technical Advisory Committee as a voting member.

4.5 Meeting Procedure

 reschedule the meeting to another day when a quorum can be obtained. The
 members present may also conduct the meeting as an informational session, but
 shall not take any official action on business items.
- B. **Schedule:** Meetings of the Citizens Advisory Committee shall be open to the public and be held on a monthly basis, except for during the month of the summer recess and winter recess, or as needed for special business.
- C. **Special Votes:** The Chair of the Citizens Advisory Committee may request a mail, fax, or e-mail vote on issues already presented at previous meetings.



- Limitations: This practice will be used only if Federal and/or State imposed deadlines are an issue or if the vote is necessitated due to the urgency of a local, State, or Federal project.
- Committee Report: A mail, fax, or e-mail vote will be presented at the next scheduled Citizens Advisory Committee meeting as part of the previous meeting minutes.

Dear Members of the Bloomington/Monroe County MPO:

The Monroe County Ambulance Advisory Board was created by agreement nearly 30 years ago of local government officials and Bloomington Hospital. Members of the Board have continued to serve those interests, despite the expiration of that agreement. The Board is writing to support your recommendation that SR 45 be widened to four lanes between the SR 45/46 Bypass to Pete Ellis Drive/Range Road, and we are asking all members of the MPO to work together to prioritize well-planned ambulance access to the new IU Health Bloomington Hospital.

We further believe that SR 45 should also be widened to four lanes and reconstructed between Pete Ellis Drive and Russell Road, and we recommend that dedicated turning lanes be added for each leg of the SR 45 and Pete Ellis/Range Road intersection.

As you are no doubt aware, traffic on the SR 45 has been increasing over the past several years. Traffic often backs up in all directions at the intersection of SR 45 and Pete Ellis Drive/Range Road (INDOT Des No.: 1800199 CMT Project No.: 18070904-10) and at the intersection of SR 45 and SR 45/46 bypass. This is especially true at the drop-off and pick-up times for the nearby University Elementary School, the arrival and departure of U.S. Postal Employees at the Woodbridge Post Office (which is located at the SE corner of SR 45 and Pete Ellis Drive), and it will probably also be true during hospital shift-change times.

We are making these recommendations because ambulance service to the new IU Health Bloomington Hospital, set to open in 2021, will be primarily routed through a signalized intersection at the SR 45/46 Bypass. However, a secondary access route to the hospital is needed from 10th Street via Range Road for times of vehicular backups due to heavy traffic, accidents, and trains. Additionally, some of the ambulances will be heading west on SR 45 from the eastern portion of Monroe County, and some will be driving north on Pete Ellis Drive. If the intersections are backed up, and drivers have nowhere to move their cars while waiting for a light to change, ambulances making their way to the new hospital will be delayed, endangering patients' health.

It is our understanding that the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) is scheduled to update SR 45 (east of the SR 45/46 bypass) along 10th Street in 2023 and 2024. We appeal to INDOT to conduct the update prior to when the new hospital is scheduled to open. Reconstructing the road with the hospital open will lead to unnecessary back-ups and dangerous conditions, especially for ambulances making their way to this regional health center. Highest priority for SR 45's/10th Street's reconstruction should be given to the very short segment – two-tenths (2/10) of a mile – between the existing, improved intersection at the Bypass and the planned intersection improvements at Pete Ellis/Range Road. (INDOT Des No.: 1800199, CMT Project No.: 18070904-10).

Monroe County requested in the FY2020-2024 Transportation Improvement Program the funding for a portion of the Karst Trail with 2024 Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) funds. The request was approved in the TIP and the funding that has been programmed is \$155,801 for Construction.

Monroe County has since received the Next Level DNR Grant funding for the construction of the trail, including this portion.

Monroe County is requesting to change the route for a different connection to the Karst Trail. The amount of the funding would not change.

Monroe County would like to change the route to connect the Karst Trail to the Bloomington multi-use path on the west side of Bloomington. The route would be from the Bloomington Road multi-use path to Liberty Drive, to Constitution, to Curry Pike, to Sierra Drive and finally to the Karst Trail. Property owners along Sierra Drive have been approached and are willing to work the County on this connection.

Monroe County is asking for support from the MPO Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC), the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and the MPO Policy Committee for this route modification. Again, no additional funding is being requested at this time for this modification.
