

- Annie Eakin from the Purdue Extension office Nutrition Education Program gave a presentation. Her work on healthy communities overlaps with the priorities of the BPSC.








- Add/replace delineator posts closer to gutter to allow vehicle wheel along edge of cushion without bitting delineator (but not full vehicle to bypass cushion)
- Restrict parking adjacent to cushion using yellow paint on curb ~30' on both sides of street.






SPEED CUSHIONS & TRAFFIC COUNTERS NORTH OF TAPP, WEST OF ROCKPORT
