Topic: Domestic Violence Awareness: MCCSC Supports and Services

- Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)
 - Domestic violence is traumatic for children
 - Creating a trauma-informed care environment within the district
 - Staff training and information on ACEs
- Impact of Childhood Trauma
 - Responses to childhood trauma differ (e.g. temper tantrums, concentration issues, social withdrawal)
 - Outwards behaviors (more detectable, outbursts)

- Internal behaviors (withdrawal behaviors)
- Components of Trauma-Informed Care
 - Creating a safe environment
 - Building relationships and connectedness
- Systematic approach to the delivery of behavioral health supports
 - Tier 1: Universal supports
 - Support for all kids
 - Tier 2: Targeted supports
 - Support for kids who have experienced trauma
 - Tier 3: Intensive supports
 - Intensive intervention and referrals
- School personnel
 - School Counselors
 - Middle and High School counselors (Focused on career development and emotional support)
 - Social works (more focused on emotional and mental health counselor)
 - School psychologist (focused on testing and assessments)
 - Behavior Specialist (focused on behavior plans to support children who have experienced trauma)
- MCCSC Lily Endowment
 - Million dollar 4 year grant to coordinate universal support for Social and Emotional Learning competencies (SEL)
 - For children who have experienced trauma
 - Also for students who could use the extra support
 - SEL Curriculum
 - Pre-k \rightarrow Second Step
 - High School → School-Connect
 - Professional learning
 - Focused research-based cogitative behavior studies
 - on SEL competencies and ACEs
- Small Group Counseling
 - School social workers provide small group counseling opportunities focused on peer relationships and coping skills
 - Referrals made by parents, teachers, and staff
- Bridges to Success Classes
 - Self-contained classes, elementary through high school to provide support for students who have experienced trauma, disabilities, or display behavioral issues
- Community Mental Health Partnerships and specialist housed at MCCSC
 - The Adult & Child Health school based programs in 6 elementary schools including Binford, Clear Creek, Grandview, Highland park, Summit, and Templeton
 - Catholic Charities provides counseling services on site at Fairview Elementary
 - Centerstone provides one full time mentor on site at each middle school
