House said the Gentry Circus was a wonderful community event and hoped that it would become a yearly event. Kiesling said that on July 17 the Indiana Department of Transportation will sponsor a forum to discuss policy and plans and there will be an opportunity for the public to participate.

Service also thought the circus was wonderful and even admitted to liking the elephants best. The Parks Dept. is sponsoring a Shakespeare performance on Friday evening at Bryan Park.

White expressed appreciation for the 4th of July Parade committee and all the hard work they do. He also thanked everyone for the Little Fire Engine Book, an appropriate present for his 31 years young birthday. Hogan was very happy that Service liked the elephants.

Tom Klein presented examples of new recycled letterheads and talked about the different types of recycled/recycable paper materials we will be using. The Goodwill pilot collection project went well. We collected about 598 bags and large furniture pieces from about 15% of city homes. We anticipated expanding the program this month, but Goodwill did not have sufficient bags, so we will probably do it in August. Recycling figures show about a 60% participation rate, collecting about 95 tons and the highest participation rate was in June with The Stands and Spicewood leading the way.


