AGENDA SUMMATION

The minutes of August 1, 1990 were approved by a voice vote.

APPROVAL OF MINUTE

Regester said he would see everyone at Hoosierfest. Foley said that on August 25 Chief Sharp, Frank Ragan and Norm Merrifield met at the B.G. Pollard Lodge to sponsor a Prime Time for Youth program complete with a parade and The Dynamics, winner of the Memphis Jazz Festival. He introduced Jim Hartfield and Jim Miller. Mr. Hartfield is the youth director for Youth Need Prime Time. The children run the program themselves and it provides an incentive for kids to take the right direction in their lives.

MESSAGES FROM
COUNCILMEMBERS

Fernandez said the Master Plan first rough draft of policy statements are ready for review and comments. There will be congresses in the community focusing on various aspects of the policy plan and we look forward to public input. He urged people to write to President Erlich and Vice-President Gros Louis about the large I.U sign on the by-pass. If anyone attended any of the public hearings about planning, this sign is out of step. He voiced support for the low income housing project planned for the south side and urged the persons involved to work toward a compromise that would benefit everyone.

White praised the Public Works Department and the superb job done in completing the paving projects before the students returned to campus this year. Service invited everyone to view the art display by Carol Anton, that is currently hanging in the Council Chambers and invited everyone to the Quilt Show that "kicks off" Hoosierfest at the County Museum. Steve Hogan read a letter of resignation from councilmember Nancy Young Hitchcox effective August 31, 1990. A caucus of Republican precinct committee persons in District III will convene on September 18, at 7:30 P.M. to elect a councilmember.

Kiesling welcomed the new Herald Times reporter Jackie Sheckler and Stacey Joyce of the IDS to the meeting.

The Mayor thanked Nancy Hitchcox for her years of cheerful service to the council and to the community. She will be missed. Chief Sharp was introduced.

MAYORAL MESSAGE

Sharp presented awards for exemplary service to Jim Mitchell and Mark Crouch for their assistance to a choking victim after extracting her from her vehicle. Also Richard McMurray for saving the life of a lawn mower accident victim by applying a tourniquet to an amputated limb to stop excessive bleeding. He also cited Dan Harrell for bravery for disarming a subject with a knife.

The Mayor introduced Paula McDevitt who in turn introduced the 4th of July Queen Laura Jones. Laura, a senior at BHS-S and a member of the Teen Advisory Council, won the award for her essay on America. The theme was "America, You're Beautiful." She then read the last paragraph of the essay.

The Mayor introduced Prosecutor Bob Miller and Sue Wheeler and the staff of the Drug Free Indiana program

and invited everyone to the Open House on Thursday.

Service reported that the "sludge committee" met and will meet again and more pertinent information will soon be available.

Olcott reported that we have submitted our plan to Indiana Bell and a final draft should be ready next week for the E911 program.

It was determined that the Council would not meet on September 12, 1990.


There were no petitions or communications from the public.


