In the Council Chambers at a meeting held on Monday, January 4, 1988, at 7:30 P.M., following the Swearing-In Ceremony by Judges Baker and Dixon a Special Session of the Common Council.

Roll Call: Gardner, White, Young, Hogan, Regester, Service, Fernandez, Kiesling, Olcott.

Clerk Williams presided over the election of Council President noting the statutory requirement that a Council President, President Pro-Tem and Parlimentarian would be elected this evening. Nominations were opened for the office of president. Regester nominated Service and Fernandez seconded that nomination. Hogan nominated Olcott and that nomination was seconded by Young. By prearranged agreement the voting was conducted by paper ballot with councilmembers White and Kiesling acting as counters. The ballot vote of 5-4 elected Service president of the Bloomington Common Council for 1988.

Service then opened the nominations for the office of President Pro-Tem. Gardner nominated Regester and that nomination was seconded by Kiesling. Regester was elected by a unanimous voice vote.

Service then opened nominations for the office of Parlementarian. Regester nominated Olcott and that motion was seconded by Gardner. Olcott was elected by a unaminous voice vote.

Service then gave the agenda summation.

The minutes of December 16, 1987 were approved by a voice vote.

Gardner thanked everyone for their support and invited the residents of the 1st district to become involved in the governmental process White noted that the prime responsibility of a councilmember is to serve all of the citizens of Bloomington

Young also thanked the voters of the 3rd District for their support, urged councilmembers to put aside party differences and wished a Happy New Year to some special council members, John, Pat, Pat, Ron, and Tim. Hogan thanked the voters of District 4 for their support and pledged to work for their concerns and issues.

Regester thanked everyone for their support, noting that this was a strong council and looked forward to working with everyone. Kiesling thanked supporters and said she was already at work.

Olcott congratulated Pam Service, expressed condolences upon the death of her mother and said that he looked forward to working with all of the ocuncilmembers.

Service had made a brief statement after her election, thanking everyone for their support, noted that the death of her mother last week had posed very difficult conflicts as to stay in California to be with her family and to be here tonight for this council meeting. She hoped that everyone could put partisan differences aside and work together for the good of Bloomington.
