APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Gardner introduced Lois Gibbs, visiting the community and the university to take part in an environmental forum. Gibbs is the director of a Citizens Clearing House. She expressed concern about the enormity of the problem here in Monroe County and urged the Council to be cautious. "Westinghouse is trying to sell an incinerator, that clearly won't work," she said. She urged the Council to explore other technologies, notably plasma arc and infrared technology. She said that Westinghouse urged the use of both these technologies in the N.Y. state area.




