Service gave the agenda summation.

AGENDA SUMMATION

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 88-24 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance.

LEGISLATION FOR
SECOND READING
ORDINANCE 88-24

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 88-24 be adopted. Gardner gave the committee report of Do-Pass 8-0-1 (Hogan). Councilmember Hogan stated that he disagreed with elected officials just being elected, in the first year of a term and giving themselves a raise.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:1 (Hogan).

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 88-25 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

ORDINANCE 88-25

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 88-25 be adopted.

Gardner gave the committee report of a Do-Pass 9-0.

Jim Williams presented an amendment for Section IIB adding a job classification that was inadvertently omitted from the original ordinance for an Assistant Street Supervisor, Pay Grade 307 with a salary range of \$21,474 to \$24,957.

The amendment received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, Nays:0.

Hogan said that in the future there has to be more review time for salary ordinances. He said he understood the problems with only four Wednesdays in July and the length of time required for union negotiations, but the review time for councilmembers was simply not adequate especially with the new step pay plan and job reclassification. He commended Jim Williams for his hard work and explanation of the complicated process. Hogan had questions about the size of some employee raises not what or how employees were doing their jobs.

Service explained the budget schedule she and the controller put together late this winter, noting the shortage of Wednesdays in July, the fact that the ordinances must be voted on by August 1, the possibility that some councilmembers might be out of town for political conventions.

Fernandez said he was comfortable voting for the ordinances after attending the extra sessions explaining the step pay plan. He said this was a great step forward for pay equity.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:1 (Hogan). As amended.

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 88-26 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

ORDINANCE 88-26

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 88-26 be adopted. Gardner gave the committee report of Do-Pass 9-0 subject to USB approval.

White said he was uncomfortable voting for this ordinance when the USB has not voted on it. The Council has the final responsibility for passage and approval but an essential element in the process has been bypassed.

Kiesling suggested better communications between the persons involved in the budget process and wondered if there was an explanation for the situation.

Jeff Kayden was present and had no explanation for the meeting schedules.

Mayor Allison said the budget preparation was delayed because of the Monsanto trial preparation and the new salary classification.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:6, Nays:3 (Hogan, Gardner, White).

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 88-27 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

ORDINANCE 88-27

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 88-27 be adopted. Gardner gave the committee report with a Do-Pass recommendation of 9-0. There was no further discussion and the ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, Nays:0.

It was moved and seconded that the following ordinance be introduced and read by title only for first reading by the Clerk. Clerk Williams read the ordinance. Appropriation Ordinance 88-4 The Civil City Budget for 1989.


