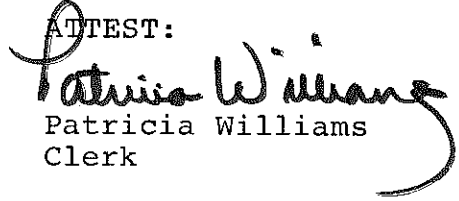

Before the actual vote, Pete Tescione urged the Council to consider carefully their USB appointment. He stated that he felt that the administration and the USB had not been responsive to citizen concerns and urged the Council to appoint someone who would recognize legitimate concerns on all sides..

Service stated that the committee conducting interviews to fill the USB vacancy consisted of four councilmembers. She said that all candidates were reviewed carefully, strengths and weaknesses considered. Kissel provides the chemical and technical background urgently needed with the resignation of David Liebl. "There wasn't another applicant that met that criteria", Service said. The Council has another vacancy in the near future.

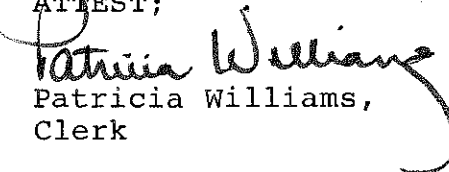

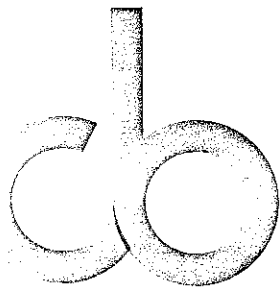

STATEMENT FOR COUNCIL MEETING
ON DIOXIN AND FURAN TESTING

I am here to announce that tomorrow the City is taking a significant step towards resolving long standing questions about potential dioxin and furan problems at the Lemon Lane Landfill.

John Langley, our PCB coordinator, and a representative from Environ will take between twenty and thirty soil samples from the Lemon Lane Landfill. These samples will be flown to New Jersey for analysis at a certified dioxin and furan laboratory. The results of this analysis will be made public as soon as it is reported by the lab and should answer the questions raised by both members of the public and our consultants about the effects of uncontrolled burning at the Landfill.

The City is taking the lead on the dioxin and furan issue in order to expedite the commencement of interim cleanup measures. The USB intends to condition any approval of the site safety plan upon payment by Westinghouse of the costs incurred for the testing.

We will press the laboratory and Environ to complete the analysis of the soil samples and review of the data by January 26, so that the USB can impose its final conditions on approval of the site safety plan. By taking the lead on this issue, we are moving closer to a safe and effective interim clean up and capping of the landfill beginning early this spring. The start of the interim clean up is an important step in protecting the citizens living in the area of the affected sites.
