Murphy commented on a recent Plan Commission meeting that lasted until 12:15 A.M. Service announced the CFC, INC Open House for the Sourth Side of the Square on Sunday

MESSAGES FROM COUNCIL MEMBERS

Gary Clendenning, Chief of Police presented a brief report to the Council in response to some questions that were asked at budget hearings. He discussed the various programs, CrimeStoppers, the Neighborhood Watch program and meetings with various neighborhood groups. He said that 5800 manhours were devoted to training within the police department last year and gave the following breakdown:

Olcott asked what the success stories were in the CrimeStopper program. Clendenning said that the cooperative effort of 11 counties working together is the best part of the program, enabling it to grow and develop.
