COMMON COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Service called attention to the art display in the MESSAGES FROM Council Chambers and commended the responsible COUNCILMEMBERS citizens who voted in last Tuesday's primary election.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 86-16 be introduced and read by title Clerk Williams read the resolution. only.

LEGISLATION FOR SECOND READING: RESOLUTION 86-16

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 86-16 be adopted. There was no discussion and the ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 8, Nays: 0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that APPROPRIATION ORD. Appropriation Ordinance 86-4 be introduced and read 86-4 by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that App. Ord. 86-4 be adopted. Larry Fleener said that a compromise has been worked out between the City and the firefighters and that a portion of the day quarters will be remodeled, that the sleeping quarters will remain as they are and his administrative offices will also remain as they are. The City will have all three levels of the old City Hall. Fleener said that he may ask, in the future, for additional funds to modify the upstairs and if the building is sold and the new owner does not want a fire station as a tenant, then another location will have to be found.

Ray Brown, representing the firefighters, said the association has a verbal agreement with John Goss and the Chief, that if at the end of summer the building isn't sold then some remodeling will be done in order to upgrade living space for the men.

Olcott asked if the building was on the market and Goss said yes and appraisals were being solicited, one with the fire station and one without the firestation.

Gross moved that the ordinance be amended to request \$25,000 instead of the \$250,000 as originally asked for by the administration. (The administration submitted the amendment).

The amendment received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:0 and the ordinance, as amended received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:0.
