Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 86-26 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the resolution. Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 86-27 be adopted. There was no committee report.

RESOLUTION 86-26

Gene Stokes said council approval is required for each application of housing in the self-sufficiency program. Units are leased from private land lords anywhere in the County.

The resolution received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, Nays:0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 86-33 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance. Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 86-33 be adopted. There was no committee report.

ORDINANCE 86-33

Pat Patterson said the property has been advertised on two occasions and the first time only two bids were submitted. The Board of Public Works has recommended the CFC bid and it is anticipated that the property will be used for housing. Housing would require future rezoning but no prior commitment has been made regarding the rezoning needs. One condition of sale is that the site be used or cleared within a two year period of time. Porter asked how the City came to acquire the property

and Patterson said it was because of the 3rd St. underpass project. When the underpass was built we eliminated access to the building. Olcott asked where the monies from the sale would go and Patterson replied the Local Road and Street Fund and would be used for any capital street project.




