ORDINANCE 86-36

Mueller said this ordinance has been placed on the agenda before the Plan Commission actually has voted on it in an attempt to accomodate the petitioner. An offer to purchase is pending. The ravine at the rear of the tract is the area for vacation and all adjacent property owners and utility departments are in support.




