Regester gave the agenda summation.

AGENDA SUMMATION

The minutes of August 20, 1986 were approved by a APPROVAL OF MINUTES voice vote.

Service said that at last weeks meeting she meglected to mention that Gross had visited the Chicago COUNCILMEMBERS incinerator site. She called attention to a recent press conference about additional sites and urged people to come forward with information about PCBs in areas not already covered by the consent decree jurisdiction. Mayer, Gross and Young welcomed Olcott back and Gross said we were truly at a loss the last few weeks trying to get legislation introduced without our parlementarian. Olcott said he was glad to be back and thanked everyone for the cards, flowers and wishes for a speedy recovery.

Clerk Williams reported that an insufficient number MESSAGES FROM CLERK of signatures were obtained on the recently circulated petitions to abolish the USB. 1237 signatures were submitted but upon verification, only 972 were registered voters in the city jurisdiction. In order for the referendum to be placed in the ballot 5% of the city registered voters signatures were necessary. 1151 was the number needed based on voter registration numbers as of August 8, 1986.

It was moved and seconded that Dr. Thomas Middleton BOARD * COMMISSION be appointed to the USB filing the unexpired term APPOINTMENT of Andrew Tynan. (1/89) USB

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that LEGISLATION FOR Ordinance 86-47 be introduced and read by title only SECOND READING AND Clerk Williams read the ordinance.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 86-47 be adopted. Service gave the committee report.

Gross said that she was distressed to learn that a department that is understaffed is still delaying the hiring of new officers.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 86-32 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the resolution.

RESOLUTION 86-32

Gross thanked the workable program committee for working out the distribution of CDBG monies. The Council shares the feeling that the committee has gone over the requests, made the necessay decisions and presented it to the Council with necessary background information. Olcott agreed with Gross.

Melba Leach commended the Council for their budget hearing decisions and requested the Council to appoint members to a committee to evaluate the expenses incured by the consent decree as well a as expenses not covered by the decree. She said the county is willing to appoint 3 members and hoped the city could also do so.
