Gross gave the Agenda Summation.

AGENDA SUMMATION

The minutes of March 20 and March 27, 1985 were approved APPROVAL OF MINUTES by a voice vote. Olcott noted that his name was not included in those members present for the March 27 meeting. It was noted and corrected.

Murphy said that given the fact that a number of concerned MESSAGES FROM citizens have not been able to meet regarding the zoning COUNCILMEMBERS code amendment the council committee meeting should be postponed until that group can meet with the Plan Commission and a modified plan or at least a plan bearing some consensus of opinion be developed. He suggested that the Council table the ordinance for first reading and give it first reading on the 17th of April.

Gross said that she too has received a number of calls in response to this ordinance, that she is not happy with it and was sure that we could come up with something better.

Mayer remarked that only RS and not MF would be affected and very limited sections of the city would actually be in that category. Mayer also thanked the city crews for the excellent pot hole filling spring season and reminded the public that they can still call the City and report their favorite pothole.

Service hoped that we would publicize the meeting change for the zoning code amendment; she also called attention to the art exhibit in the Council Chambers noting that Councilmembers were getting a view of her from both sides of the Council Chamber. She apologized.

Gross congratulated Karen Cotten recently chosen the Volunteer of the Year.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Ordinance SECOND READINGS: 85-14 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams ORD. 85-14 read the ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Ordinance 85-14 be adopted. Service gave the committee report.

There was no discussion and the ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes; 9, Nays: 0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Appropriation APP. ORD 85-2 Ordinance 85-2 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Appropriation Ordinance 85-2 be adopted. Service gave the committee report.

There was no discussion and the ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 9, Nays: 0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Appropriation Ordinance 85-3 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only. APP. ORD. 85-3

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Appropriation Ordinance 85-3 be adopted. Service gave the committee report.

Service said that she was not sure that the waterslide would really pay for itself. "It's fun but I'd rather see another pothole fixed", she said.

Mayer asked about the use of the waterslide by kids with reduced fee passes. Norm Merrifield said that the Parks Board is supportive of initiating some type of program for the low income pass holders. One possibility is to issue a waterslide pass (one pass) with each low income pass. He said that he would pass the concerns of the Council to the Parks Board and was confident that some compromise would be reached.

The ordinance received a Do-Pass recommendation of 8-1 (Service).

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Ordinance ORD. 85-12 85-12 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Ordinance 85-12 be adopted. Service gave the committee report.

Service said that at one time she was the only person to vote NO on downtown parking issues and the constraints put upon downtown residents. This ordinance is an excellent idea and the downtown restrictions should have never been issued in the first place.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 9, Nays: 0.

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 85-15 be tabled. The motion was approved by a voice vote.
