Service thanked the Mayor and the Redevelopment Department for the excellent downtown Development Conference held last Thursday. She also thanked the merchants and people involved in the Kirkfest activities that were held last Saturday here in Bloomington. Service also commented on inaccurate headlines in the Herald-Telephone regarding a recent council meeting in which an apartheid committee report was presented. The headlines did not reflect what the committee reported, e.g. what the city can do is pass a resolution usrging businesses and I.U. to divest. The headline in question said there was nothing the City could do.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 85-49 be adopted. Olcott gave the committee report.

Linda Runkle said that the revised ordinance before the Council tonight is the result of the combined efforts of the pawnbrokers, police department and all persons involved. The primary changes are:

- 1) rather than a card record, the police will pick up weekly information from the brokers: a computer print out from ACE and copies of Mr. Schneider's records for the week,
- 2) the license fee will remain \$25,
- 3) the 10 day retention period omitted the possibility of the owner returning to pick up his goods and so that was also amended.

The question of secondhand dealers also was raised and it was decided that the current ordinance would be enforced requiring a \$5 license fee and the availability of records for police inspection. Service asked about the thumbprint problem and Max Gross, representing the Police Department, said that only one print would be required and the pawn shop operators would supply records and thumbprints if requested.

Jack McCrory said the ordinance in its present form is a good one and he can support it. He thanked the Council for their willingness to work the problems through and their willingness to listen.

The ordinance, as revised, received a roll call vote of Ayes: 8, Nays: 0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 85-48 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.
