ROLL CALL

Gross gave the agenda summation.

AGENDA SUMMATION

Service announced that there were two weeks left for the Farmers' Market and the upcoming Guess the Pumpkin Weight Contest.

MESSAGES FROM COUNCILMEMBERS

Gross commented on a recent H-T article that implied that the Council was interested in the Old City Hall and the County Jail. Gross reminded the public that the Council has not taken a position on the issue and that there are two official branches of government, the administrative branch that proposes and the legislative branch that, in this case, determines how the dollars are spent.

Michael White, the new Channel 3 director introduced himself. It was noted that he is the producer and director of the Haunted Indiana production.

MESSAGES FROM COMMITTEES

It was moved and seconded that Susan T. Eastman be appointed to the Telecommunications Council, replacing Herb Terry who resigned early this fall.

APPOINTMENT TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS COUNCIL

It was approved by a voice vote of the entire Council.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that LEGISLATION FOR Resolution 85-38 be introduced and read by title SECOND READING: only. Clerk Williams read the resolution by title RES. 85-38 only.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 85-38 be adopted. There was no committee report.

Service said that a number of communities across the country are making similar statements and that this is really more of an economic issue rather than a historic question and is just one of the various economic incentives that a city can offer. This historical tax incentive could be used for commercial or rental property. Doris Sims said that the redevelopment staff supports this resolution.

Gross said that if we have received correct reports from Washington this is just one of many tax credit programs that will go. We should be urging Congress to allow our citizens to deduct the taxes already paid (state and property taxes). This resolution is less important than the entire change proposed in our tax structure.

Service said that she could support a resolution that Gross suggested. Murphy also agreed with Gross.

The resolution received a roll call vote of Ayes:7, Nays: 2 (Gross, Murphy).

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that ORD. 85-51 Ordinance 85-51 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 85-51 be adopted.

There was no discussion and the ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 9, Nays: 0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 85-52 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.
