ROLL CALL

Council President Gross gave the Agenda Summation.

AGENDA SUMMATION

The minutes of November 6, 1985 were approved by a voice vote.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Service congratulated Bloomington Hospital on their 80th Birthday and she also welcomed the Boy Scout troop that was present in the Council Chambers for the meeting.

MESSAGES FROM  
COUNCILMEMBERS

Olcott reported that he represented the City at a recent hospital reception and at that time he was presented a key to one of the hospital's original ten rooms. He then presented the award to John Goss, Deputy Mayor, and John said that it would be prominently displayed in the Mayor's Office.

Murphy quipped that he thought it might be a key to an ambulance and reminded that public that the Environ Corp. will participate in the Environmental Commission's presentation on Thursday evening, November 21, 1985 and urged people to attend.

Gross said that an event occurred in Bloomington this past week that has troubled her more than anything she has ever experienced in her 25 years in Bloomington and that was the seizure of a film that was being shown on the I.U. campus. "No one has a right to tell another person what he or she can watch or read. These events do not occur as isolated incidents - what is next? The seizure of books, T.V. programs, styles of dress?" Gross continued by saying that we have seen in our community the denial of basic rights by right-wing mobs and that this is particularly disturbing when governmental officials join in the same behaviour.

Gross also welcomed Boy Scout Troop #140 from the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints. They are working on their citizenship badge.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded that motion that Ordinance 85-56 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

LEGISLATION FOR  
SECOND READING:

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 85-56 be adopted. There was no committee report.

James Thompson, attorney for the Parking Garage Holding Corporation, said that this vacation was necessary for the construction of the 4th St. Garage.

Mayer asked if the N/S alley would be affected by this vacation or the parking garage. Thompson said the N/S alley would remain an alley.

Gross asked for public input, as this is an advertised public hearing.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 85-40 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the resolution by title only.

RESOLUTION 85-40

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 85-40 be adopted. There was no committee report.

Murphy moved that the resolution be tabled until the December 4, 1985 meeting. All necessary documentation is in order but the architect's renderings are not quite ready for public viewing and Murphy felt that the public should have an opportunity to see the drawings before the Council votes.

Murphy's motion received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, Nays:0. The resolution will be tabled until December 4, 1985.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 85-41 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the resolution by title only.

RESOLUTION 85-41

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 85-41 be adopted. There was no committee report.

Harriet Lipkin, Corporation Counsel, said that this ordinance amends the 1985 interlocal agreement with the PTC. The only change is that Engineering and Street Department services were not included in the original agreement and with several projects that the Transit Department has undertaken this past year, those particular services were necessary. This amended agreement provides for those changes.

The resolution received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, Nays:0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 85-42 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the resolution by title only.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Resolution 85-42 be adopted. There was no committee report.

Lipkin said that this is the interlocal agreement with the PTC for 1986 and does not include the services of the Street Department or Engineering. There was no further discussion.

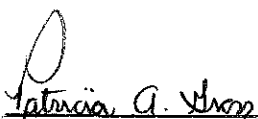
