REGULAR SESSION

Roll Call: Service, Porter, Regester, Olcott, Gross, Foley, Murphy, Young. Absent: Mayer (vacation).

ROLL CALL

Service thanked all of the members of the community that worked together to put on the Fourth of July parade on such short notice.

MESSAGES FROM COUNCILMEMBERS

Regester wished Howard Young a happy birthday.

Olcott also wished Young a happy birthday by a voice vote of 4-3.

Foley thanked Kathy Weigle for all her efforts in organizing the Fourth of July Parade.

Murphy also wished Young a birthday salutation. He hoped that the city could honor a great American, Dr. Martin Luther King by designating a holiday here in our city next year. (Gov. Orr recently proclaimed a holiday in January 1985 and the Federal Government declared a holiday for the year 1986.)

Young wondered why the vote was only 4-3 and how Olcott voted. Young noted that this was the first week of the City Tax deduction and that .32 had been deducted from his pay check. The range, he said, seems to be anywhere from .05 to \$6. The tax should be an amount worth taking out or it should not even be bothered with - as an employer, he said, he thought it was a nuisance.

Mayor Allison thanked Kathy Weigle for her efforts in organizing the parade committee, "Her organizational skills are many and she was the key person in the entire operation." Allison also acknowledged that Dan and Lois Clay were the very interested citizens that first came forward to suggest the parade, despite the short period of time for arrangements. Allison thanked everyone involved in the parade and hoped that a committee would be formed to provide plenty of lead time for next years parade.

Foley presented an encomium for Hank Robbins, the American Legion member responsible for 30 years of fireworks in the Bloomington area. Resolution 84-14 honoring Robbins was introduced by Foley, seconded by Murphy and approved by a voice vote.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion to introduce Ordinance 84-31 by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion to adopt Ordinance 84-31. Regester gave the committee report.

Jim Williams, Personnel Director, said that this ordinance simply creates the title of operator in the Controllers Office and the Police Department.

The ordiance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 8, Nays:0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion to introduce Ordinance 84-32 by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion to adopt Ordiance 84-32. Regester gave the committee report.

RESOLUTION 84-14 ENCOMIUM FOR HANK ROBBINS

LEGISLATION FOR SECOND READING: ORD. 84-31 TO AMEND THE 1984 SALARY ORD. PROGRAMMER I AND II

ORD. 84-32 TO AMEND THE 1984 SALARY ORD. (HISTORIC PRESERVATION) Jim Williams noted that this ordinance was a request for a reclassification for an individual who has already assumed the additional duties of the position.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 8, Nays: 0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Ordinance 84-33 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance.

ORD. 84-33 TO AMEND THE CODE (CLEAN COMMUNITY)

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Ordinance 84-33 be adopted. Regester gave committee report.

Service moved and Olcott seconded a motion that the following amendment be introduced:

> SECTION I. (a) 14.28.030 Leaving Old Advertising matter on street or sidewalks shall be amended to read as follows:

> 14.28.030 Removal of advertising material from public property. Any advertising matter properly posted on public property shall be removed no later than seventy-two hours after the event being advertised. It is unlawful for any person when removing old poster, card, or other advertising device to leave or deposit the same upon any public or private sidewalk, street, alley, lot or ground within the corporate limits of the city.

This amendment clarifies the public vs. private question and with this amendment, the ord would pertain only to public properties; also eliminated is the requirement that advertising matter posted on private property must be removed within 72 hours.

The amendment received a roll call vote of Ayes: 8 Nays: 0.

Mayor Allison presented the second amendment for consideration:

> SECTION III (a) Section 6.06.090 Vehicles hauling refuse shall be amended to delete proposed subsection (c) regarding tracking of foreign materials on street surfaces.

This amendment would delete the proposed new subsection (c) regarding the tracking of foreign materials on street surfaces, since the Engineering Dept. intends to include a similar provision in Title 17. (revised)

Allison said the real concern is vehicles hauling refuse, not vehicles entering and leaving construction sites. Rather than confuse the issue, the Mayor asked that the subsection be deleted.

The amendment received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:0 The ordinance, as amended, received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:0.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that the following ordinances be introduced and read by Clerk Williams read the ordinances by title only. title only.
