Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Ordinance 84-47 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

There was no discussion and the ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 8, Nays: 1 (Olcott)

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Appropriation Ordinance 84-10 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

UTILITIES BUDGET

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Appropriation Ordinance 84-10 be adopted. The committee report was given.

Service asked for an update regarding the \$10,000 appropriation for PCB studies. (Protocol) Mike Phillips said the USB approved to contribute the \$ 10,000 for outside services.

Young asked about sewer charges being two times as high as the water charges. Phillips said the water utility is beginning to climb.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 8, Nays: 1 (Service). Service voted against the ordinance because of the Utilities Department's rebate policy.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Appropriation Ordinance 84-9 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion that Appropriation Ordinance 84-9 be adopted. The committee report was given.

Murphy moved and Regester seconded a motion that the following amendment be proposed:

App. Ord. 84-9 shall be amended to delete from line 442 (Purchase of equipment) of the parking meter special fund, the amount of \$ 22,000 for purchase of a street sweeper.

This amendment received a roll call vote of Ayes: 9, Nays:0

Murphy moved that line item # 339 be amended to add \$ 10,000 to the Civil City Budget for the development of a PCB protocol plan.

The amendment received a roll call vote of Ayes: 9, Nays: 0.

The ordinance, as amended, received a roll call vote of Ayes: 9, Nays: 0.

Gross thanked her fellow councilmembers for the many hours of surprisingly enjoyable budget meetings.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 P.M.
