MESSAGES FROM THE
MAYOR

Mayor Allison apologized for the inconvenience that the street cleaning caused for many persons who were out of town for the spring break. Several ways in which future cleanings will be conducted are: maps that indicate the designated areas along with the necessary information describing the boundaries shall be published in the local papers well in advance of the cleaning. The city notices will be in the same place in the papers so that persons will become accustomed to referring to that section of the paper. Dick McKaig, an I.U. official, has agreed to the use of campus parking lots for future storage of vehicles during vacation cleaning periods. The Mayor further stated that despite the problems with the timing for the street cleaning there had been many many compliments and pleased citizens commenting on the clean streets.

It was moved and seconded that the Council appoint Sonja Johnson and reappoint Nelda Anderson to the Redevelopment Commission. The voice vote was unanimous.

Olcott moved and Towell seconded a motion to adopt Appropriation Ordinance 83-4. Dilcher read the committee report and synopsis.

Fire Chief Fleener said that the rescue vehicle is about ten years old and has more than outlived its usefulness. He said that the brakes do not hold on the present truck when it is fully loaded with equipment. The new vehicle would be one and a half ton diesel engine. The request does not include equipment for the vehicle.

The appropriation ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 6, Nays: 0.
