In the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building held on Wednesday, October 5, 1983, with Council President Dilcher presiding over a Regular Session of the Common Council.

Councilmembers present: Porter, Murphy, Dilcher, Service, Olcott, Gross, Hogan.

Council President Dilcher gave the agenda summation.

Councilmember Murphy said that on Monday of this week, he called U.S. District Attorney Sara Evans Barker and the nature of the call was the FBI investigation of the Denver Smith shooting. Richard Darst (Assistant District Attorney) said that the Justice Department and the FBI were winding up a report that would be forwarded to the civil rights department of the Justice Department. Murphy emphasized that it is important that the Justice Department release any information it might have to dispel any doubts that still exist. Murphy continued by stating his own concerns and the concerns expressed to him by his constituents that the FBI and the Justice Department conduct a more formal investigation in order to lay this incident to rest.

Service dalled attention to the exhibit presently hanging in the Council Chambers. The paintings are the work of Rosemary Miller, a member of the Historical Commission. The Bloomington Arts Commission is responsible for the current policy of hanging art in the Council Chambers. Service also announced that the Historical Museum has mounted an exhibit related to past local elections, SOME from the 1920's and the current municipal elections soon to take place. Baby pictures, toys, and treasures of the candidates of both major parties will be on display. Service invited everyone to stop by and view the display.

Mayor Allison announced the Oktubafest event taking place on Sunday, October 9 on the top level of the downtown parking garage. Cities all over the country are planning celebrations depicting the Tri Centennial Anniversary of the first German immigrants to this country. Harvey Phillips, of the I.U. School of Music, Kathy Weigle and the I.U. Institute of German Studies have all been very much involved in the preparation and planning. This day will be very similar to the Taste of Bloomington, but this time with a German flavor. There will be music, puppet shows, ethnic dances and a polka contest. Nine Bloomington restaurants are participating and the Mayor thanked everyone involved in the event.
