COMMON COUNCIL REGULAR  
SESSION MARCH 17, 1982

Councilmembers present: Morrison, Towell, Porter, Allison, Murphy, Dilcher, Olcott, Service. Absent: Hogan (Illness).

ROLL CALL

Council President Murphy read the agenda summation.

AGENDA SUMMATION

Service reported she was pleased with the All-America City Award, and congratulated Sylvia McNair, winner in the Met semi-finals. She said she was happy about the many theatrical endeavors in town in the last three weeks. She reported that the Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee have been meeting for months trying to identify well-traveled routes by putting together a 'path map'. The committee requests anyone to pencil in any paths that they know about.

MESSAGES FROM COUNCIL-  
MEMBERS

Dilcher praised 'Acting Up', a children's theatre group, and 'Puck Players', a puppet group.

Allison clarified the Channel 3 misinformation that they would not be covering Council meetings. She also encouraged neighborhood associations to get involved in a clean-up project.

In keeping with St. Patrick's Day, Murphy quoted Irish patriot James Conley.

There was no mayoral message.




