In the Common Council Chambers of the Municipal Building held on December 1, 1982, with Council President Pat Murphy presiding REGULAR SESSION over a Regular Session of the Common Council.

COMMON COUNCIL DECEMBER 1, 1982

Councilmembers present: Morrison, Towell, Porter, Allison, Murphy, Dilcher, Service, Olcott, Hogan.

ROLL CALL

Council President Murphy gave the agenda summation.

AGENDA SUMMATION

Allison congratulated J.C. Floyd upon his award as State Street Commissioner of the Year. He has done a remarkable job of coordinating services for the community.

MESSAGES FROM COUNCILMEMBERS

Service read an excerpt from a Common Council meeting held in July, 1871. The petition reads as follows:

The undersigned property holders and other citizens of the town of Bloomington respectfully petition your honorable body to pass an ordinance prohibit-ing the running at large of swine in the Streets of said town. We deem it scarcely necessary to state our reasons - they will suggest themselves to you. They root up the ground before our doors: they rub their filthy sides upon our neatly painted fences: they leave their filthy ordure upon our sidewalks: they may be seen at times rolling in their own filth even upon the side walks of our public square. For these and similar reasons we humbly and earnestly solicit your honorable body to shield us from this nuisance and as in duty bound your petitioners will ever pray

Sixty-two persons signed this petition. The 1871 Council also received a remonstrance signed by 142 persons against the proposed ordinance. After consideration and much soul searching the council postponed action on the ordinance.

There was no Mayoral message.

There were no Petitions or Communications.

MESSAGES FROM THE MAYOR PETITIONS AND COMM.

Murphy announced vacancies on the Human Rights and Animal Control Commissions. He also welcomed the journalism students that were attending the meeting.

Olcott moved and Morrison seconded a motion to introduce and read Ordinance 82-72 by title only.

Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Morrison seconded a motion to adopt Ordinance 82-72. Since there was no committee report Dilcher read the legislative synopsis.

Ron Drahos, of the Traffic Dommission presented a brief summary regarding the need for signage in the Arden Place area and said that the real problem is a line of sight concern.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 9, Nays:0.

Olcott moved and Morrison seconded a motion to introduce and read Ordinance 82-73 by title only.

Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Morrison seconded a motion to adopt Ordinance 82-73. Dilcher read the legislative synopsis. INTRODUCTION OF ORD. FOR SECOND READING. TO AMEND TITLE 15 TO INCLUDE STOP AND YIELD INTERSECTIONS IN ARDEN PLACE

Ord. 82-73 TO AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE OF EDC BONDS FOR THE IPCO CORPORATION.

Mr. Harrell, attorney for IPCO explained the manufacturing process that would be used. IPCO purchases rolls of dry paper that is converted into diapers by a process that uses only water. No toxic chemicals are used and the dry waste residue is then baled and sold.

Murphy said that members of the Environmental Commission were concerned about hazardous waste output.

Service asked if the Environmental Commission was regularly informed when such an issue was before the council. Murphy said yes.

Olcott complimented Skip Harrell and Scott Reinenking for their efforts in bringing this company to Bloomington. From the beginning this company was "sold" on Bloomington and he continued by saying that this is the type of light industry that Bloomington is very glad to have.

Murphy said that this was a good example of cooperative efforts of city, council, administration, state and grants from utilites.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 9, Nays: 0.
