#### MAYOR'S SPEECH

Councilman de St. Croix announced two RE new appointments to the Manpower Task CO Force: James Baker of Westinghouse; Robert McHenry, Chamber of Commerce appointee, of RCA Corporation and Meridith Adler, of the Research and Development Center at the School of Education at Indiana University. He announced the next scheduled meeting of the Task Force would be Tuesday, June 6, 1971, at 7:30 p.m., at the Service Center. At that time a panel which is being set up now by members of the Task Force in cooperation with the Chamber ofCommerce containing representatives from the retail, commercial, industrial and business community will meet with the entire Task Force to act as a resource group for the Manpower Employment Task Force.

Councilman Davis reported the Committee investigating the property at Kirkwood and Dunn met Wednesday night, and they charged the Committee with three things, which they hoped they would do before they receive bids in July for the property; one, to investigate and try to find the precise financial position of the city with respect to the property, that is as to the historical background, second, to explore alternatives of use of the property by the city or anyone else, one of the alternatives has been from the Downtown Churches who would like to resurrect their proposal for High Rise Housing for the elderly. He further stated that he and three of the Council members and the Mayor went to Indianapolis before they took office with the Downtown Churches to meet with FHA, and one thing that was very clear was that there was no way through FHA funding to rent, lease or in any way make a contribution to the City for the use of the property that would be any ways near in line with the value of the property. If the City wants to give them the property, and the use of the building, then at the end of forty years the city would acquire the building. The third thing the Committe would do is to make recommendations to the Council.

Councilman de St. Croix asked if any effort had been made to utilize the property for some sort of park facility.

Mr. Wilson, Director of Parks and Recreation said there had been park benches placed on the property for use of the public.

Councilman Mizell said they were continuing to Plan Commission work on the land use map and have reviewed the progress todate and have turned over portions of the map to be redrawn by the drafting technician so that they can then be photographed and prepared for public hearing. At the same time they are working on the remaining portions of the city which have not been reviewed by the whole Plan Commission. The ordinance is also being revised as they go along.

Councilman Behen said he would have a resolution to present at the next council meeting with reference to Fire inspections.
