Steve Grimes, Democrat Precinct Committeeman of Precinct No. 11, spoke in regard to House Bill 1552, which is aimed at keeping persons from voting in the county in which they are living for temporary employment, or educational and other purposes without the intention of making such county his permanent home. He asked that the Council submit something in writing to the General Assembly stating their opposition to this bill.

Mayor Hooker, stated this is a proper concern to the community. That the students of Indiana University who make their home in Bloomington while obtaining an aducation should be eligible to vote, just as the 18 year olds should be allowed to vote. He stated he had no fear of people who happen to be students, professors or construction workers voting here. Administratively, we are opposed to the bill.

Councilman Clegg proposed that the City Attorney or Mayor submit a letter to the Chairman of the Legislature stating the Council is opposed to this bill and that the councilmen sign the letter.
