City Controller, Howard A. Young, said the appropriation ordinance forms were written by the State Board of Accounts. Councilman Fee withdrew the motion.

A spokesman for C & M Auto told the Council his firm removed junk cars for \$5.00 each upon request. He said the firm averages 50 cars a week and estimated there are 10,000 junk cars in Monroe County.

RESOLUTION NO. 71-22

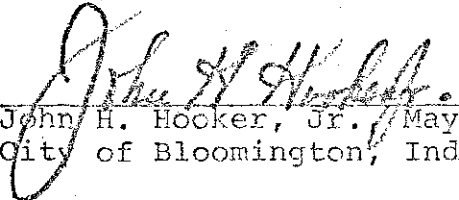
A RESOLUTION RATIFYING AND APPROVING THE ACTION OF THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA IN ENTERING INTO CONTRACT NO. BC-71-152 FOR ORNAMENTAL STREET LIGHTING SERVICE WITH THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF INDIANA, INC., AN INDIANA CORPORATION.

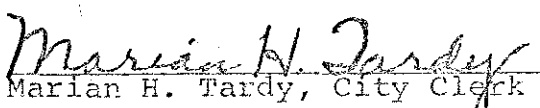
