On behalf of the Ralph Rogers Guardianship, Rogers Building Supply Company as owners, and Gremor Industries, Inc., or their successors as optionees, the writer states that he has been authorized to issue this letter which is to be considered as their joint commitment to dedicate to the City of Bloomington a 60 foot right-of-way running from Kinser Pike at the point of the intersection with Gourley Pike, thence east to a point on the southwest corner of the owner's land and Cascades Road.

" Prior to the time of such dedication the parties to this commitment jointly or severally, or their successors, will construct or cause to be constructed thereon an extension of Gourley Pike in accordance with the attached plan which is made a part of this commitment.
