Councilman Clegg moved that proposed Ordinance No. 70-39 be advanced to second reading and that it be read by title only. Councilman Clyde Day seconded the motion and it carried.

Proposed Ordinance No. 70-39 Rezoning Hensonburg School Area

Proposed Ordinance No. 70-40, an Ordinance repealing rates for Parking in metered areas and an Ordinance to establish rates, hours and location of Parking Meters within the districts and zones as set out in a Parking Program for the City of Bloomington, Dated May 1970.

Councilman Faris moved that Ordinance No. 70-40 be adopted. Councilman Clyde Day seconded the motion and it carried.

Councilman Johnson asked for an explanation of the Ordinance since he was not present at last meeting. Councilman Fee explained the ordinance briefly.

Several unidentified persons spoke in opposition of the ordinance.

City Attorney James Cotner said the money must be used for operation, and maintenance of meters for both the on and off-street facilities, for the bond interest and principal and for the expansion of parking meters.

Councilman Faris said the City plans to consult with Allan Voorhees firm to see what impact the decals would have. He also said that the ordinance could be amended after Voorhees reports on the feasibility of the decals.

Mayor Hooker said the ordinance would not be in effect until after it is published, the report from Allan Voorhees, and the bonds are advertised.
