MESSAGES FROM MAYOR

Mayor Hooker expressed his appreciation to the Council for passing the City-County Building Authority, the Data Processing Agency and the Coordinating Council of Government resolutions and said that not one of these three resolutions would obligate or encumber any of the citizens of Bloomington or the citizens of Monroe County for one penny.

Mr. Hooker announced three reappointments to the Fair Housing Commission, each for two year terms: Dr. Howard E. Anderson, William H. Andrews and Allen E. Conley.

Mayor Hooker said the City of Bloomington would soon enter into a landfill agreement with the Monroe County Commissioners for disposal of trash and garbage.

Mr. Hooker said the Board of Public Works would open bids on the College Mall Fire Station and the Service Control Center.

He said the City is much appreciative of the fact that we have additional news media in WTIU, Channel 5. This will add a lot in keeping our youth active in Monroe County and at Indiana University.

Councilman Johnson moved that claims presented for payment on February 20th, March 3rd and March 5th, 1969 be allowed. Councilman Clegg seconded the motion and it carried.
