Mayor Hooker said the Monroe County Library is in the process of constructing a new building near the intersection of Lincoln Street and Kirkwood Avenue. This would necessitate the closing of the West half of the East-West alley between Sixth Street and Kirkwood Avenue and Lincoln Street and Grant Street. This has been reviewed, the utility companies have been contacted and each of the Indiana Bell Telephone Company, Public Service Indiana, Indiana Gas Company, Inc. and the City of Bloomington Utilities Department have presented letters waiving future use of the real estate in question.

Mr. Hooker respectfully requested that the Common Council instruct the City Attorney not to oppose this case in court.

Councilman Fee moved that Mayor Hooker's request be granted and that the City Attorney be instructed not to oppose this case when it comes to court. Councilman Clegg seconded the motion and it carried.

Council President Faris called attention to the group of Girl Scouts in the audience and asked their leader to introduce them.

Mrs. Kenneth Baldridge, leader of Troop No. 181, introduced each of the girls and explained that they were present as a part of the requirement for earning a government badge.

The girls were asked to return to any of the Council meetings they were able to attend.

Mayor Hooker announced that the City of Bloomington received, on March 19, 1969, acknowledgment of its application for \$1,396,250.00 in Federal Water Pollution Control funds through the Ohio Basin office. In addition to the Federal funds granted, the State of Indiana is making a contribution in the amount of \$693,130.00, making a total of over \$2 million to be applied toward the Contract "C" five mile North Intercepter Sewer and Contract "D-2" North Water Pollution Control Facilities. This has been approved by the Indiana State Board of Health, the Indiana Water Pollution Control Commission and the Federal Water Pollution Control Administration. These projects will be completed and in operation no later than this time next year.
