Councilman Day asked Mr. Femal to comment on the programs of the Ice rink and Bryan Park Pool. Mr. Femal said Bryan Park Pool and the ice rink are being used more and more.

He said \$5,000.00 would light a field which would double the number of boys who could participate in the activities. Mr. Femal agreed that more land is needed for this purpose but said that so far cost had been prohibitive.

Councilman Day asked Chief East to comment on the inspection of the taxies. Chief East said the inspections had been made and instructions given to make the necessary corrections. He added that the average taxi driver is no better or no worse than the average citizen driver. He further added that there is one exceptionally good driver in Bloomington, Gus Owens who drives for Campus Cab Company.

Councilman Day suggested that Mr. Owens be brought before the Council for commendation. Chief East was asked to make the necessary arrangements.
