Council President Faris announced that the members of the Common Council must appoint three members to serve on the interim school board which will govern the new school system for all the townships in Monroe County except for Richland and Bean Blossom townships. The interim board will function from July 1, 1968 to July 1, 1969, at which time the seven members of the board which will govern this unit of the new system will have been elected in November, 1968 to take office on July 1, 1969. Mr. Faris emphasized that these three appointees must meet the following qualifications:

1. person must reside in Bloomington or Perry township, either inside or outside the city limits, and have been such a resident for at least one year
2. Must be at least twenty-five years of age.

He asked that residents of Bloomington and Perry Townships make recommendations for the Council appointees either in writing to the Council or by telephone to council members.
