Councilman Day said he had read in an Indianapolis newspaper that motorists who received parking violation tickets in Indianapolis would be given much more severe penalties if their fines were not paid within a given period. Dr. Day asked Police Chief East whether he thought there would be merit in studying the manner in which traffic fines are handled in Indianapolis. Chief East said he thought there would and added that he would like to see violators brought to court on a regular basis.

MESSAGES FROM COUNCILMEN

Council President Faris asked that Chief East and Councilman Clendening discuss the situation and, if possible, report their conclusions at the next Council meeting.

Attorney Len Bunger, acting for and in behalf of the Bloomington National Bank, asked that the Council and the City Administration join with the Bank in Monroe Circuit Court in asking that the land, on which the Bank will build its new main building, be made to conform with the rest of Washington Street.

OTHER NEW BUSINESS

Attorney Bunger asked also that the Council and the City Administration not oppose the vacation of the east half of the east-west alley between Walnut and Washington Streets and Third and Fourth Streets. This vacation concerns only the portion of the alley from the east side of the intersection of the two alleys to Washington Street.

Council President Faris appointed a committee with Councilman Clegg as chairman to study this matter and report at the next Council meeting.


MESSAGES FROM MAYOR
