Councilman Faris asked the Clerk to read a petition, signed by forty-five persons who either live, work or have children in school in Bloomington, requesting the Council to delay final action on the proposed fluoridation ordinance to give opponents of fluoridation further opportunity to present opposition to such action.

Mr. William Dellenback, Dr. Hugh S. Ramsey and Mr. Duncan Charters spoke against fluoridation.

At 9:15 p.m., Council President Faris recessed the meeting.

The meeting was declared back in order at 9:30 p.m.

Mr. Alton Windsor, Jr., Mr. Sherman Pitluck, Mrs. A. H. Stallknecht, Mrs. Faye Greckel and Mr. Wilbert C. Greckel spoke against fluoridation.

Dr. George Pefley and Dr. James McGuire, both Doctors of Dental Surgery, spoke factually in favor of fluoridation.

Miss Maude Bryan expressed her complete confidence in the ability and integrity of the members of the Council and the City Administration.

Councilman Johnson said he had made twenty-two telephone calls, to persons selected at random from the telephone book. He asked the opinion of the householder and his wife as to the fluoridation of the city water supply. In the twenty-two households, thirty-seven persons responded to the question and all voiced approval of fluoridation.

Councilman Johnson moved that proposed Ordinance No. 66-55 be adopted. Councilman Moulden seconded the motion. Roll call vote: ayes - 9, nays - none. Motion carried.

Councilman Fee moved that proposed Ordinance No. 66-56 be advanced to second reading and read by the Clerk by title only. Councilman Moulden seconded the motion and it carried.
