Councilman Fee reported that the I. U., Yellow and Campus Cab Companies had applied for city licenses and moved that the applications be approved with the exception of one document. The motion was seconded by Councilman Moulden.

Councilman Richard Fee reported that the Citizens Salary Study Committee for the year 1968 had met under the chairmanship of Mr. Bruce Temple. Councilman Fee cited the major points of the committee's report and the matter was referred to the finance committee for further study.

Councilman Fee reported that a survey is being made of the parking meter situation. The following changes were suggested:

5¢ for 2 hours meters, especially on Kirkwood which is primarily business and professional meters representing 15 minutes for 1¢ meters representing 1 hour for 7½¢ 2 hour meters on Grant, Lincoln and Washington Streets with 15 minute meters interspersed as needed

installation of meters in the one-half block in front of the Monroe County Library, in front of the Post Office and on 7th Street by Indiana Bell Telephone Company.

meters in the City lot at 4th and Washington Streets need to be changed different colors for charges on meters.

Councilman Fee asked for ideas from anyone who wishes to present them for study in the survey.

Dr. Harry Day commented that Reverend Crafton promises to be a good investment and expressed the hope that he would be active in community activities as well as at the Christian Center.

The water program date of July, 1967 is still holding and the program is on schedule

Three storage areas will be physically standing by April 15, 1967

Water main extension will be completed by mid-April. It will take a normal three day water supply to fill the lines. It will be the middle of May before the lines can be used.

Mr. Hooker and Mr. Long spent a day in Indianapolis with the Advisory Council of the Department of Natural Resources reviewing the proposed sewer program. The Council voted seven to two in favor of the program. We can now move ahead and hope to have a package program ready in ninety days.

The Department of Parks and Recreation will be advertising for bids soon.

As of Monday, January 30th, the city is now operating the transit service. All departments are helping and we hope to maintain and improve the service.

Delivery of the Snorkel to the Fire Department has been delayed. It should be in within a week and operational by the middle of February.

Remonstrators have filed an appeal in the annexation suit now in litigation.

Councilman Harry Day asked if any of these areas can be annexed on a voluntary basis. He was informed that it can be done by addressing a letter of request to the City Attorney or to the Mayor. It was pointed out that all of the Highland Village property described in the proposed annexation ordinance introduced at this meeting belongs to one person.

Mayor Hooker stated, however, that we do not want to encourage single annexations because we cannot offer spot services.
