Mayor Hooker gave a brief report on the water program. All construction is progressing smoothly. However, we still have been unable to place in service any scheduled improvements. It is the small items that keep holding up operations. All of the water mains have been put in place, flushed, filled, and tested. The storage tanks have been painted except the South Booster station.

The presedimentation basin is in the final stages and should be in operation this weekend.

The south plant will be ready to make water at the end of July.

The sewer program is in the final stages and will meet the deadline of July 14.

The pool on the northwest side will open August 1. The ice rink will be ready by the first of September.

Will begin Monday paving in curb and paving Miller Drive and Winslow Road.

The County Commissioners did enact a county ordinance authorizing two-mile jurisdiction control outside of corporation line this past Friday. They are to be commended for their cooperation in meeting the urban needs. We now have the responsibility of preparing a final map for this area. There will be a special meeting of the City Plan Commission a week from tonight. Included with it will be a public hearing and it has been advertised.
