Councilman Clegg moved, seconded by Councilman Johnson that the MVH/Street Department budget for the calendar year 1968 be in the amount of \$401,033.00. Roll call vote: 7 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

MVH/Street Department Budget Councilman Clegg moved, seconded by Councilman Byers, that the Corporate Bond budget for the calendar year 1968 be in the amount of \$48,895.00. Roll call vote: 7 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Clegg moved, seconded by Councilman Byers that the Rose Hill Cemetery budget for the calendar year 1968 be in tha amount of \$35,150.00. Roll call vote: ayes 7; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Clegg moved, seconded by Councilman Johnson, that the Parking Meter Facility budget for the calendar year 1968 be in the amount of 29,607.00. Roll call vote: 7 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Clegg moved, seconded by Councilman Johnson, that the budget for the calendar year 1968 by departments and totaling \$2,700,147.50 constitute a first reading. The motion carried.

Councilman Clegg moved, seconded by Councilman Johnson, that rules be suspended and proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 67-2 be advanced to second reading. Roll call vote: 7 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Clegg moved, seconded by Councilman Johnson, that proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 67-2 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. The motion carried unanimously.

The Clerk read proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 67-2 by title only.

Robert H. Distelhorst, Manager of the Bloomington Chamber of Commerce, challenged the proposed ordinance on the basis that the salary increases were unjustifiably high, especially in the Fire Department. Mayor Hooker responded that Bloomington is the fastest growing city of its size in the State and that services must be provided. The sincerity of the Council in adopting the budget, even in an election year, is certainly strong evidence that it is needed. Also, owing to delays in getting urbanized areas of Bloomington annexed, the tax base of the city has not increased in proportion to the growth of the service area.

Councilman Clegg moved, seconded by Councilman Clyde Day, that proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 67-2 be adopted. Roll call vote: 7 ayes; nays - none.

Councilman Johnson moved that proposed Ordinance No. 67-44 be introduced and read by the Clerk. Councilman Harry Day seconded the motion and it carried. The Deputy City Clerk read proposed Ordinance No. 67-44.

Councilman Clegg moved that the rules be suspended to allow proposed Ordinance No. 67-44 to be advanced to second reading and read by title only.

Councilman Johnson seconded the motion. Roll call vote: 7 ayes; nays - none. Motion carried. Mayor Hooker explained that this is the result of over a year's study to upgrade the lighting in Bloomington. Three of the contracts will increase the lighting and the last contract will renew the present contract which has expired, with no increase in the rate. The city does not own its street lights and we rent them from Public Service. The present lighting costs about \$5,200 per year and the new lighting will cost about \$19,000...making \$14,000 increase. The present lighting is around twenty years old and the downtown area needs improved lighting facilities. The Deputy City Clerk read proposed Ordinance No. 67-44 by title only. Councilman Johnson moved that proposed Ordinance No. 67-44 be adopted. Councilman Harry Day seconded the motion. Roll call vote: 7 ayes; nays - none. Motion carried.

Councilman Clyde Day reported that there has been a request for additional lighting on South Walnut Street from the railroad crossing south to the sale barn. Also, on East Third Street, from the Bypass east to Kingston Place. Councilman Clyde Day moved that Public Service be in structed to continue with the program. Councilman Moulden seconded the motion and it carried.

The Councilmen moved for adjournment at the hour of 8:55 p.m., E.S.T.
