3. On Southwest corner of intersection of S. Fess and Grimes Lane
4. On East side of South Fess Avenue, 300 feet north of Brenda Lane
5. On South side of Brenda Lane at center line of intersection with Fess Avenue
6. On Northwest corner of West Dixie Street and Fairview Street.

Councilman Guy Moulden seconded the motion and it carried.

Councilman Harry Day moved that we stand solidly behind Mayor Hooker in all he has tried to do for the citizens of Bloomington and commend him for his actions in this particular situation.

Councilman Barge moved, seconded by Councilman Moulden, to amend the motion by adding "We abhor the arbitrary, capricious, nasty and brutish actions of this giant international corporation... against the interests of our citizens."


OTHER NEW BUSINESS
