Councilman Harry Day moved that the minutes be accepted as corrected. Seconded by Robert Clegg. Motion carried unanimously.

REMONSTRANCES AND
OBJECTIONS

Councilman Richard Fee moved that proposed Ordinance No. 66-23 be advanced to second reading and read by the Clerk by title only. Seconded by Councilman Clegg. Motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCES ON SECOND
READING

Ordinance No. 66-23

The Clerk read proposed Ordinance No. 66-23 by title only.

Councilman Fee moved for the adoption of proposed Ordinance No. 66-23. Seconded by Ralph Johnson. Roll Call vote: 8 ayes; nays - none. Motion carried.

Councilman Harry Day commented that the enforcement of this ordinance would be an indication that the administration is concerned and anxious to see something done about the unsightly conditions which do occur in connection with our garbage and trash pick-up. Mayor Hooker stated that ordinances of this type are used primarily to generate an attitude of pride and concern among the citizens in regard to the cleanliness and beautification of their city. Councilman Day and the Mayor agreed that if a continuous disregard of this ordinance on the part of any citizen was noted, action would be taken.

Councilman Guy Moulden moved that proposed Ordinance No. 66-24 be advanced to second reading and read by the Clerk by title only. Seconded by Ralph Johnson. Motion carried unanimously.

City Clerk Marian Tardy read proposed Ordinance No. 66-24 by title only.

Assistant City Engineer Marvard Clark described the real estate referred to in this proposed ordinance as follows: Church property on the southwest corner of the Bypass and Dunn Streets. An "L" shaped parcel of land with 300' frontage on Dunn Street.

Councilman Ralph Johnson moved that proposed Ordinance No. 66-24 be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Clyde Day. Roll call vote: 8 ayes; nays - none. Motion carried.

Councilman Robert Clegg moved that proposed Ordinance No. 66-26 be introduced, advanced to first reading and read by the Clerk. Seconded by Councilman Richard Fee. Motion carried unanimously.

Ordinance No. 66-26

City Clerk Marian Tardy read proposed Ordinance No. 66-26.

Councilman Ralph Johnson reported on the June 1, 1966, trip to Chicago which was made by Mayor Jack Hooker, City Clerk Marian Tardy, City Controller Howard A. Young, Police Chief Jim East and Mr. Johnson for the purpose of signing the bonds and investing the money for the City of Bloomington's 1965-67 Water Expansion and Improvement Program.

REPORTS FROM OFFICIAL BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Councilman Clyde Day read the following report and recommendations from the Street Lighting Committee in regard to street lighting additions and up-grading:

REPORTS FROM STANDING COMMITTEES

- "1. Southwest corner of intersection of Eleventh and Adams Street.
Install 1-8000 Lumen Mercury Vapor Lamp
Cost to city per year \$ 48.00

2. Southwest corner of intersection of Eleventh and Fairview Streets.
Remove 1-2500 Lumen Incandescent Lamp present cost to city \$20.52 per year.

Install 1-8000 Lumen Mercury Vapor Lamp. Proposed cost to City - \$48.00 per year.

3. Southeast corner of intersection of Eleventh and Fairview Streets.
Remove 1-2500 Lumen Incandescent Lamp present cost to City \$20.52 per year.
Install 1-8000 Lumen Mercury Vapor Lamp. Proposed cost to city \$48.00 per year.

4. Southeast corner of intersection of Seventh and Jackson.
Remove 1-2500 Lumen Incandescent Lamp present cost to City \$20.52 per year.
Install 1-22,000 Lumen Mercury Vapor Lamp proposed cost to City \$75.00 per year."

Councilman Clyde Day moved that the recommendations be approved and that the City Clerk notify Public Service Company of these changes. Seconded by Guy Moulden. Motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Robert Clegg reported that the request for the vacation of an east-west alley behind the Pentecostal Church between Dunn and Grant Streets, which will be used as a parking lot, has been checked with the Engineering Department, the Police Department and the Fire Department. No objections to the vacation of this alley have been offered by these departments.

Councilman Clegg moved that the City Attorney be instructed not to oppose the vacation of this alley, subject to the utility rights. Seconded by Richard Fee. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Clegg reported regarding the study of a petition to vacate Davis Street from a point west of its intersection with Fairview and for a distance of 144'. R.C.A., through its spokesman, Lowell Whaley, offered no objection to the vacation of this street. Neither the Police Department nor the Fire Department found any objection to this vacation. Some of the council members had inspected this street and formed their opinion.

Councilman Clegg moved that the City Attorney be instructed not to oppose this vacation of a portion of Davis Street, subject to utility rights. Seconded by Guy Moulden.

REPORTS FROM SPECIAL COMMITTEES

Vacation of east-west alley between Dunn and Grant Streets.

Vacation of a portion of Davis Street from a point west of its intersection with Fairview.

During discussion, Mr. Homer Lentz voiced opposition to the vacation because it was his opinion that the land he owned in this area would decrease in value as a result of the vacation. Councilmen Ralph Johnson and Harry Day stated that they would have to decline from voting until they had opportunity to look at the area in question.

Vacation of a portion of Davis Street, Continued

Councilman Richard Fee moved that the motion be tabled. Seconded by Ralph Johnson. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORTS FROM CITY OFFICIALS AND DEPARTMENT HEADS

Councilman Harry Day announced the completion of the Mass Transportation Study by Mr. Robert W. Burdick and Mr. Conrad Burton from the I. U. Graduate School of Business and informed the council that Dr. Waters would try to be present at the June 16th Council meeting and, at that time, the study would be discussed in depth. Copies of the study were distributed to council members.

MESSAGES FROM COUNCILMEN

Bloomington Mass Transportation Study

Councilman Charles Faris announced that the chair would entertain a motion for the appointment of a member of the council to serve on the Board of Directors of the Animal Control Commission.

Appointment to Animal Control Commission

Councilman Harry Day moved that Robert Clegg be appointed to serve as a member of this commission. Seconded by Richard Fee. Roll call vote: 8 ayes; nays - none. Motion carried.

Mr. Hooker remarked that for all intents and purposes, the work of the Council and the administration was finished as of June 1, 1966, in regard to the Water Expansion and Improvement Program of 1965-67. From now on, it will be a matter of seeing that the contractors carry out the plans and specifications and meet their schedules.

MESSAGES FROM THE MAYOR

The Mayor commended the Council for executing a water program which is greater than the present system. He thanked every member of the Council and members of each of the departments for their support and participation in programming a system which will not only meet our present requirements, but will meet the future requirements and which will keep pace with our rapidly expanding growth. He stressed, however, that this program is not the final answer: it will not solve the problem for the city. Mr. Hooker stated that, in his opinion, in a short period of time - 10 years or even 5 years - there would have to be another expansion and improvement program.

Other firms and agencies cited by the Mayor as rendering invaluable aid in this program were: Black & Veatch, Consulting Engineers of Kansas City, Missouri, Ice, Miller, Donadio & Ryan, Attorneys, Indianapolis, Indiana, Peat, Marwick, Mitchell & Co., CPA,

Indianapolis, Indiana, the State Board of Health and the Indiana Department of Natural Resources.

Mr. Hooker stated that the water program was the number one objective, but there are other objectives for which we are striving, namely: we are moving actively on a sewer program; we are moving actively on a highway and thoroughfare improvement program; we are moving actively on a beautification program.

Harry Day moved that the Council commend Mayor Hooker for his unexcelled efforts and vision in the development of our water system to the degree that has been attained, and express their deep gratitude to him for this great service to the community. Motion seconded by entire Council.

MOTION OF COMMENDATION

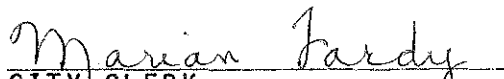
