Council President Faris turned the meeting over to Councilman Fee, Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Common Council.

Councilman Fee read the budget totals for all departments.

Councilman Fee asked that proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 66-3 be constituted as follows: Appropriation Ordinance No. 66-3 (1967 Budget)

General Fund Budget

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the General Fund Budget be approved as stated. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the MVH/Street Department budget for the calendar year 1967 be in the amount of \$353,431.00. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried. MVH/Street Department Budget

Mayor Hooker stated this amount is Bloomington's share of Motor Vehicle Highway Funds from the State. This is not a levy on local taxes.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the Corporate Bond budget for the calendar year 1967 be in the amount of \$45,624.00. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Mayor Hooker stated this is a legal obligation on the City's bonds and coupons which must be paid.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the Rose Hill Cemetery budget for the calendar year 1967 be in the amount of \$37,481.00. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the Parks and Recreation Department's budget for the calendar year 1967 be in the amount of \$266,472.00. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the Police Pension Fund budget for the calendar year 1967 be in the amount of \$73,860.00. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the Fire Pension Fund budget for the calendar year 1967 be in the amount of \$68,084.00. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the Cumulative Capital Improvement Fund budget for the calendar year 1967 be in the amount of \$106,956.00. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the Parking Meter budgets for the calendar year 1967 be as follows:

Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Clegg, that the Parking Meter Facility budget for the calendar year 1967 be in the amount of \$30,395.00. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Parking Meter Facility budget

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Derge, that the budget for the calendar year 1967 by departments and totaling \$2,292,447.00 constitute a first reading. The motion carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Johnson, that rules be suspended and proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 66-3 be advanced to second reading. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Derge, that proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 66-3 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. The motion carried unanimously.

The Clerk read proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 66-3 by title only.


Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Derge, that proposed Appropriation Ordinance No. 66-3 be adopted. Roll call vote: 9 ayes; nays - none. Carried.

Dr. Day said he regreted that the Parks and Recreation Department's budget had to be cut but he felt the Council had gone as far as they could on the present tax rate.

Mayor Hooker concurred in Dr. Day's opinion of the Parks and Recreation Department's budget. He said the Council deserves a vote of thanks because each has shown his personal interest in the problem.


