The water expansion program, weather permitting, should be in operation by June, 1967. All contractors are on schedule.

MESSAGES FROM MAYOR

Sanitation Improvement Expansion plans have been delivered by Black and Veatch. Preliminary plans for sewage control are being reviewed by the Engineer's Department.

New street construction is rapidly coming to a close, basically because of winter weather. South Henderson Street Extension is open but will not be hard surfaced until after the new water line is installed.

The Indiana State Highway Commission will hold a public hearing at Harrodsburg, on November 10, concerning making Indiana 37 a four lane highway. Mr. Hooker urged the members of the Council to attend this meeting and suggested a resolution be drafted concerning this proposed state highway improvement and presented at the meeting so it would become a part of the minutes of the public hearing.

Bids were opened on the Department of Parks and Recreation's Westside Park. All bids were below estimate.

Public Service Indiana is actively engaged in carrying out the lighting program acted on last year. They hope to have all lights in operation by Thanksgiving.

A favorable decision was rendered the City in the recent annexation court case; however, the remonstrators may seek further recourse.

There were a few anxious moments during the wildcat unauthorized demonstration by employees of RCA. Any type of strike presents potential danger with the possibility of personal injury. Any community is limited in its capabilities but Mr. Hooker commended Chief of Police East and his organization for far exceeding their capabilities. Mr. Hooker did ask Governor Branigan for supporting personnel from the Indiana State Police Department and expressed his thanks to Governor Branigan, the officials at RCA, the business agent for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local No. 1424, personnel from Civil Defense and Indiana University Safety Division and the Bloomington Fire and Street Departments for making possible the rapid closing of this situation. The Police, Fire and Street Departments kept the streets passable with no damage to city owned vehicles or injury to city personnel.

Mr. Hooker suggested that the Council set up, by ordinance, a Greater Bloomington Sesquicentennial Commission.

Council President Faris introduced Carl Myers, Chairman of the Monroe County Republican Central Committee, who in turn introduced John T. Myers, Republican Candidate for State Representative.

Councilman Fee moved that the City Attorney be asked to prepare a resolution, concerning making Indiana 37 a four lane highway, to present to the Indiana State Highway Commission. Councilman Clegg seconded the motion and it carried.

OTHER NEW BUSINESS

Councilman Harry Day moved that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare an ordinance to create a Greater Bloomington Sesquicentennial Commission. Councilman Fee seconded the motion and it carried.

Councilman Moulden moved that claims presented for payment on October 25 and November 4, 1966 be allowed. The motion was seconded by Councilman Clyde Day and carried unanimously.


