Councilman Clyde Day, Chairman of the Lighting Committee, reported that his committee has investigated and does recommend:

the installation of a new 175 watt mercury vapor lamp on a wood pole at 812 South Stull Avenue, near the walk;

the replacement of the lamp in the alley north of Fourth Street and west of Rogers Street, at the City parking lot, with a 400 watt mercury vapor lamp using a twelve foot mast arm;

the replacement of the lamp at the southeast corner of Fourth and Rogers Streets with a 400 watt mercury vapor lamp.

Councilman Harry Day announced that Dr. Charles Gish, Director of Dental Health with the Indiana State Board of Health, will be present at the December 15, 1966 meeting of the Common Council to speak on fluoridation of water. Dr. Gish is one of Dr. Day's former students.

MESSAGES FROM COUNCILMEN

Dr. Day commented that Bloomington and Terre Haute are the only two cities of major size in Indiana that do not have fluoridation.

Mr. Hooker announced that the remonstrators in the annexation suit had filed a motion for a new trial. Mr. Cotner, City Attorney, explained the procedure following such a motion. He said that indications pointed to far less than 51% of the original backers of the remonstrance; thus, a few are preventing many citizens from enjoying city services. Councilman Harry Day said he hoped this situation would enable people to see the disadvantages of signing any type of remonstrance petition and show them what the consequences can be.

MESSAGES FROM MAYOR

It is expected that all components of the 1965-67 Water Improvement Program will be ready and available to the city by June, 1967.

Plans for the North Water Pollution Control Program have been received and sent to the Indiana State Board of Health. There should be a report from the State in about thirty days.

The Street Department has thirteen snow and ice control units in use. Mr. Sargent reports a full stock of de-icing materials. The weather will delay the leaf collection program but we hope to have one and possibly two additional pieces of equipment soon.

Flight services to Bloomington have been increased by Lake Central Airlines and we can look forward to early completion of the Municipal Airport. Councilman Harry Day was a member of the group that flew the maiden flights of the new services and he said the added flights would afford the citizens of Bloomington many opportunities that have not been available until now.

Mayor Hooker remarked that the Allison jet engines used to power the DC3 planes are made and modified at the Allison plant in Indianapolis.


