

REGULAR MEETING

THE COMMON COUNCIL of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall on Thursday, July 16, 1964, at the hour of seven thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M.) E.S.T. in regular session with Mayor John H. Hooker, Jr. presiding.

Meeting called to order by Mayor John H. Hooker, Jr.

Meeting opened with invocation by Councilman Harry Day.

Members Present: Councilmen - Fee, Johnson, Moulden, C. Day, H. Day, Faris and Derge

Also Present: Mayor - John H. Hooker, Jr.
City Attorney - James Cotner
City Engineer - Raymond Long

A roll call of the Councilmen was taken by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Johnson, that minutes of the July 2, 1964 Meeting be approved as distributed and read individually. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Faris, that proposed Ordinance 64-15 be read by title only. Motion carried unanimously.

Clerk-Treasurer read proposed Ordinance 64-15 by title only.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Derge, that proposed Ordinance 64-15 be amended as follows: Section 1 be struck and Section 2 be renumbered Section 1 and Section 3 be renumbered Section 2. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Fee explained this will leave the present charge for operation of the parking meters in the area on the square and one block away at a charge of 10 cents an hour. This was proposed to be reduced to 5 cents an hour, but the City is not prepared to withstand this change at this time. Section 2 concerns the price for meter violations - we are leaving this at \$1.00, in order to more effectively enforce the ordinance.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Faris, that proposed Ordinance 64-15 be adopted as amended.

Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Moulden asked that proposed Ordinance 64-16 be read by Clerk-Treasurer.

Clerk-Treasurer read proposed Ordinance 64-16.

Mayor Hooker explained this area under discussion is in an area on the extreme eastern portion of Park Ridge East. This land was given and so allowed some time ago by Park Ridge Development Corporation as an R-3 zone, they realized their mistake and they have asked that the City of Bloomington reclassify this as an R-1 zone.

Mayor Hooker referred proposed Ordinance 64-16 to Councilman Fee for study and asked that a report be made at the next regularly scheduled meeting to be held on August 6, 1964.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Harry Day, that proposed Ordinance 64-17 be presented for first reading.

Clerk-Treasurer read proposed Ordinance 64-17.

Mayor Hooker explained that this area is on West Fifth Street, immediately across from Rosehill Cemetery going west to North Adams Street.

Councilman Moulden stated that he felt this would help the neighborhood, and he also stated that he had heard no objections from the people in this neighborhood.

Councilman Faris moved, seconded by Councilman Fee that proposed Ordinance 64-18 be presented for first reading. Motion carried unanimously.

Clerk-Treasurer read proposed Ordinance 64-18.

Mr. George Calvert, a down town merchant, asked why the hours of 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. were chosen.

Mayor Hooker stated that it was the feeling of the Common Council and of the people we have talked to in the community that in order to have this type of enforcement and keep the down town employees from being the violaters, this was the most effective hours. This will give a greater movement of vehicles.

Councilman Faris moved, seconded by Councilman Harry Day, that rules be suspended to allow proposed Ordinance 64-18 to be advanced to second reading.

A roll call vote was taken:

Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Faris moved, seconded by Councilman Moulden, that proposed Ordinance 64-18 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. Motion carried unanimously.

Clerk-Treasurer read proposed Ordinance 64-18 by title only.

Councilman Faris moved, seconded by Councilman Fee, that proposed Ordinance 64-18 be adopted.

Councilman Fee asked if 5th Street was really the name of 5th Street or was it called Kirkwood Avenue.

City Attorney Cotner explained that it is officially designated as 5th Street.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Derge, that proposed Ordinance 64-18 be amended as follows - in all places that 5th Street appears insert the words Kirkwood Avenue in partentthesis.

A roll call vote was taken:

Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Clyde Day reported that the Utilities Committee had requested street lights in the area of Kenwood Avenue in the 300 block and also on East 16th Street in the same block. There is presently new apartments being completed in this area, and it has a lot of trees and is very dark in this area.

Councilman Derge moved, seconded by Councilman Fee, that Dr. Harold M. Manifold be appointed for a three year term beginning August 1, 1964 to the Bloomington Metropolitan School Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Harry Day stated that he had occasion to visit several airports throughout the country and he wanted to say that our own airport is one of the nicest most orderly airports that he had seen anywhere.

Councilman Clyde Day wanted to commend the Bloomington Police Department for the fine job they are doing. He stated that it had been brought to his attention that the sirens were hard to hear above the traffic noise and he suggested they have something done about this.


Councilman Fee stated that this was one of the items in the 1965 Police Budget, for better red lights and sirens for the ambulance units.

Councilman Derge brought to the attention of the Council, information in regard to the City controlling the two mile fringe area by law if the county does not have a master plan. Also, information regarding the hiring of a planning engineer whereby the Federal Government would furnish a grant-in aid in the amount of 2/3 of the engineer's yearly salary.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Moulden that claims presented for payment July 17, 1964 be allowed. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Fee moved meeting be adjourned.
