REGULAR MEETING

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, March 5, 1963, at the hour of seventhirty o'clock (7:30 P. M.) in regular session with Mayor Mary Alice Dunlap presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Chitwood, Peace, Pearson, Hickman and Shertzer.

Members absent: Faucett.

The meeting was opened with a moment of silent prayer by the Mayor.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that the minutes of the Finance Board meeting of February 18, 1963, the Special meeting of February 19, 1963, and the Regular meeting of February 19, 1963 be approved as submitted to each individual councilman: motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Peace that Ordinance No. 4, 1963 be advanced to second reading and read by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

The Clerk-Treasurer read, by title only, Ordinance No. 4, 1963, pertaining to the sale of personal property.

Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Peace, that Ordinance No.4, 1963 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote, Ordinance No. 4, 1963 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Peace, the Ordinance No. 5, 1963 be advanced to second reading and read by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

Clerk-Treasurer read, by title only, Ordinance No. 5, 1963, pertaining to the exchange fo certain real estate owned by the city.

Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that Ordinance No. 5, 1963 be fully adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 5, 1963 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 6, 1963 for second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

The Clerk-Treasurer read Ordinance No. 6, 1963, pertaining to amending the city animals and foul ordinance.
