

## SPECIAL MEETING

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the office of the Clerk-Treasurer in City Hall at the hour of seven thirty (7:30) P.M. on Monday, March 25, 1963, in Special Session with Mayor Mary Alice Dunlap presiding.

Members Present: Sikes, Chitwood, Peace, Pearson, Faucett, Hickman, and Shertzler.

Members Absent: None

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Dunlap. Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that Ordinance Number Nine, 1963, be advanced to second reading and read by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

The Clerk-Treasurer read, by title only, Ordinance Number Nine, 1963, which pertained to the setting of the salaries for all elected officials for the term of office starting January 1, 1964.

Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Peace, that Ordinance Number Nine, 1963, be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Peace, that action taken by the Board of Public Works and Safety on March 25, 1963, in regard to acceptance of a contract with Indiana University to build a fire station at 11th. and Woodburn on land that will be deeded to the City by the University, be ratified; motion unanimously carried.

The following report was presented by Norbert Peace, Chairman of the Public Safety Committee of the Council.

Report to Council March 25, 1963  
From Public Safety Committee.

After careful study and consideration of a petition by Mr. Harold D. Kittrell, Senior, of Walnut Grove Trailer Courts and other interested persons, regarding parking restrictions on Walnut Grove and other streets abutting the trailer court, this committee wishes to note the following facts and recommendations.

The original decision to prohibit parking along certain portions of Walnut Grove and other streets in the area was determined only after careful studies by the Traffic Commission and the Public Safety Committee.

At the present time traffic has increased on these streets due to University construction work and the hazards would be multiplied were parking allowed temporarily as requested.

However this committee realizes that a hardship does exist and have discussed the situation with Mr. Tim Rose of the Traffic Commission. Mr. Rose has conferred with I.U. officials and contractors in an effort to ease the situation. We believe that arrangements will be made to share those parking lots that have been taken over by the contractors and their employees. This is a situation that requires considerable cooperation from all but we do concur with the action of the Police Department in the enforcement of the no Parking regulations in the interest and safety of all the public.
