

REGULAR MEETING

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall on Tuesday, July 2, 1963, at the hour of seven thirty o'clock (7:30 O'Clock P. M.) in regular session with Mayor Mary Alice Dunalp presiding.

Members Present: Chitwood, Pearson, Faucett, Peace and Sikes

Members Absent: Hickman and Shertzer

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Rev. Raymond Echols of the Fairview Methodist Church.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that the minutes of the last regular meeting held June 18, 1963, be approved as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance 20 be advanced to second reading and read by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer. Upon a roll call vote, the motion was unanimously carried.

The Clerk-Treasurer read, by title only, Ordinance 20, 1963.

Mr. Marvard Clark, Assistant City Engineer, said that this Ordinance was to re-zone from an R2 to an R3 classification all lots on the East side of Prow Avenue from 9th to 10th Streets. Councilman Peace moved seconded by Councilman Pearson that Ordinance 20 be duly adopted. Mr. Ben Terrell spoke in favor of the Ordinance stating that his Client, Mr. McKaney, could realize some value from these lots if the re-zoning were complete, permitting an apartment house to be constructed.

Upon a roll call vote, Ordinance 20, 1963, was duly adopted by a unanimous vote.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that Ordinance 21 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. Upon a roll call vote, the motion was unanimously carried.

The Clerk-Treasurer read, by title only, Ordinance 21, 1963. Mr. Marvard Clark, Assistant City Engineer, stated that this Ordinance pertained to annexing the Noble King, Chesley Corporation, Chuckney and Lieberman properties east of Bloomington on State Road 46. Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Peace, that Ordinance 21, 1963 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote, the motion was unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance 23, 1963, for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. The Clerk-Treasurer read Ordinance 23, 1963.

Mr. H. T. Colbourn of Ridgemed Hills Addition requested information on fire protection rate increases to Perry Township. The Mayor suggested that Mrs. Colbourn attend a Board of Works meeting and present her questions there.

Clerk-Treasurer T. D. Ellis announced a meeting of the Bloomington Monroe County Road Coordinating Committee to be held Monday, July 8, 1963, at 7:30 P. M. in the Board of Works room.

Police Chief Geroge E. Huntington, Jr., presented the Council with the following recommendations of the Bloomington Traffic Commission:

1. That a request be sent to the State Highway Commission for traffic surveys to be taken at Tenth and Fee Lane (SR 146), Tenth and Stadium Drive (SR 146), and Tenth and Jordan (SR 45).

Councilman Peace moved, Seconded by Councilman Sikes, that the request be sent to the State Highway Commission as soon as possible and that the Police Chief check the letter before it is mailed; motion unanimously carried.

The following letter was read by the Clerk-Treasurer.
